






Furlow ousts Munk for DA seat in Tuesday's runoff election

County's next District Attorney, ousting Michael Munk, the current DA, from the 106th District seat, in a Republican Primary runoff election held Tuesday. Lynn, Garza, Gaines and Dawson counties comprise the 106th judicial district.

Furlow won by a margin of 380 with 2,216 votes to 1,836 for Munk in the four-county region. Furlow carried Lynn County 283-224, and Munk carried Dawson county 789-719. Both were tied at an even 291 votes each in Garza County. Gaines County was the big decision-maker, with 923 votes for Furlow over 532 for Munk.

Because there is no Democratic candidate to face in the November general election, Furlow effectively wins the DA seat and will take office on January 1, 2017. It is a four-year term of office.

"My family and I are very grateful to the voters of the 106th Judicial

Philip Mack Furlow will be Lynn District. We have been very blessed during the course of the campaign, Furlow told The News after the results were in. "I look forward to bringing my West Texas values and work ethic to prosecute criminals for the citizens of the 106th Judicial District," he

Five races were on the runoff ballot, including the races for the District 19 Congressional seat and the 106th District Attorney. Also on the ballot were runoffs for Railroad Commissioner, and for Judge, Court of Criminal Appeals, Place 2, and Place 5.

In the District 19 Congressional race, Jodey Arrington and Glen Robertson faced off to replace current U.S. Representative Randy Neugebauer, who is retiring. Final results from this race were not available before The News went to press, but locally Robertson carried Lynn County with 275 votes compared to 225 for Arrington.

Commencement ceremonies set for county students

ne of life's important milestones is marked by graduation ceremonies. Three high schools in Lynn County will hold commencement exercises this week, and one school, O'Donnell ISD, already held their commencement services on Friday, May 20. In all, 80 seniors from four high schools are receiving their diplomas in the county.

Tahoka High School has 39 seniors in the Class of 2016, with this year's commencement ceremonies slated for Saturday morning, May 28, at 10:30 a.m. in the high school gymnasium. New Home High School has 20 seniors graduating in ceremonies to be held at 7 p.m. Friday, May 27 in their high school gymnasium, and 6 seniors are graduating from Wilson High School in ceremonies also set for 7 p.m. Friday, in the school auditorium. At O'Donnell High School, 15



seniors graduated in commencement ceremonies held at 7 p.m. Friday, May 20 at the First Baptist Church of O'Donnell, due to school facilities still under construction.

The Tahoka High School 2016 Valedictorian is Luke Fleenor, son of Jeff and Susanne Fleenor, graduating with a grade point average (GPA) of 4.4863. Luke plans to attend Texas Tech University and major in Mechanical Engineering. M'Lin

Hill is THS Salutatorian with a GPA of 4.2947. She is the daughter of Rusty and Mandy Cook, and Jeff and Norma Hill. M'Lin plans to attend Texas Tech University to pursue a business degree.

Ian Cobb is the New Home High School 2016 Valedictorian with a GPA of 102.8. He is the son of James and Lori Cobb. Ian plans to attend Texas A&M University to pursue a double major in Agricultural Economics and Nuclear Engineering. NHHS Salutatorian is Lea Gustafson with a 102.5 GPA, and she is the daughter of Randy and Tori Gustafson. She plans to attend Texas Tech Honors College to study Mechanical Engineering.

Commissioners approve preliminary plans for another new subdivision near New Home

Lynn County Commissioners met in regular session Monday morning, approving preliminary plans for another new subdivision in the New Home area. Attorney Hunter Harris presented the preliminary plans for Kent and Mitzi Bruton, explaining that the new subdivision would be located about a mile south of New Home, at the corner of FM 1730 and County Road 11. The subdivision would be called "Cotton Creek." Commissioners approved the preliminary plans as presented.

In other business, commissioners approved naming County Road P officially as "Airport Road" for 9-1-1 address purposes, as the stretch of road adjacent to T-Bar Airport is commonly referred to as Airport Road.

J.E. Nance addressed commissioners regarding county roads, asking that commissioners consider whether some roads needed deep ditches, commenting that "some roads have ditches

too deep and too steep. Two Lynn County 4-H youth addressed commissioners, with Brook Tyson presenting information about 4-H Roundup and 4-H clothing and textiles projects, and Connor Cook presenting information about the 4-H archery program and photography con-

Commissioners approved a

resolution opposing rules proposed by the Texas Dept. of Motor Vehicles that decrease county revenues, increase county cost, and reduce local control.

Budget amendments and monthly bills were approved, and commissioners moved to accept bids for a motor grader for Precinct 2 through the Local Government Purchasing Cooperative.

Lynn County Judge Mike Braddock led the session with all four commissioners present, including Keith Wied, John Hawthorne, Don Blair and Larry Durham, as well as other county officials and guests.

New trustees installed at Tahoka ISD meeting

Newly-elected trustees were installed last Thursday night at the Tahoka Independent School District Board of Trustees meeting, including two new members of the board, Doug Green and Jon Luna, as well as Scott Dimak, who was re-elected for another term on the board. The Board elected Dr. Cathy Box to continue serving as Board President, and Jim Bingham for another term as Vice-President, and elected Clay Taylor as Board Secretary.

One new staff member was hired, with trustees approving a probationary contract for Jynna-Bass for the 2016-17 school year. The Board also approved \$40,000 of technology purchases for laptops that will be used to update student laptops at the high school campus, from funds in the technology budget. A one-year contract was approved with Southwest Foodservice Excellence to continue to provide the district's cafeteria services.

Several presentations were made before the business agenda. Dr. Box recognized three local businesses for their partnerships with the district, and Dr. George McFarland, Superintendent, presented certificates to Jeff Barnhart representing Lynn County Hospital District, Juanell Jones representing Lynn County News, and Greg Henley representing Lyntegar Electric Cooperative.

Kory Saenz, district technology coordinator, presented the state qualifying Tahoka High School robotics team of Luke Fleenor, Patrick Herrera, and Grant Garvin to the school board. The students gave a brief synopsis of their project.

Whitney Wilson and Amy Izzard, Family Consumer Science teachers who sponsor the FC-

CLA, recognized Patrick Herrera who was elected as the Region I Vice President of Parliamentary Law. They also spoke to the board about students who had advanced to state level competitions in FC-CLA, including Andrea Garcez, Kelsi Hilger, Lacy Goodell, Emit Quintero, Mercedes Perez, Nick Garcia, Clarissa Lopez, Taylor Morin, Leticia Olvera, and Brandon Farrell.

Athletic Director Brandon Hopper recognized Miranda De-Leon as a regional track qualifier. adding that other athletes were unable to attend the board meet-

Dr. McFarland presented the first annual W.I.N. 2025 Student Scholarships to Miranda DeLeon. and Luke Fleenor. These \$500 scholarships are presented to one male and one female student who embodies the qualities consistent with the district's visioning document title W.I.N. 2025.

Elementary principal Christa Ritchey recognized their "Master Builder" of the month Emilia Garcia. Mrs. Garcia recognized 4th grade student Malaysia Washington. Middle School principal Jeff Fleenor recognized his employees of the month, Belen Saldana and Bam Bam Tomlinson. They in turn recognized 8th grade student Ryan Olivan. THS principal Jeff Perez recognized the HS "Difference Maker" of the month teacher Klyssa Woodley Mrs. Woodley recognized 9th grade student Dalton Chapman.

During the meeting, trustees met in closed session for one hour to discuss personnel matters.

The next regular board meeting will be Monday, June 13 at 6:30 pm. Prior to that meeting, the board will have a budget workshop at 5:30 pm.







An attempted home invasion during the early morning hours last Thursday resulted in the arrest of a 17-year-old Tahoka male. Lynn County Sheriff's Dept. received a call at 5:31 a.m. on May 19, from the owner of a home located on US 87 just south of FM 211, reporting that he could hear someone attempting to enter the home. When officers arrived, the homeowner had the 17-year-old suspect held at gunpoint awaiting the officers. The suspect, who was unarmed, was taken into custody.

Two felony cases were pled before visiting judge Cecil Puryear in 106th District Court in Tahoka Monday, and those called for jury duty for these cases were dismissed by Judge Carter Schildknecht before the trials were scheduled to begin. Martin Aguirre, 40, of Tahoka. pled guilty to third degree felony charges of deadly conduct from an incident occurring on April 9, 2015. He was assessed Deferred Adjudication of Guilt and probation of four years.

court costs and a fine of \$1500. Deferred Adjudication is a type of probation, in which if the probation is successfully completed, the case is "dismissed." A defendant will enter a guilty plea, but the judge does not find the defendant guilty and instead "defers" the finding of guilt. Pleading guilty for Deferred Adjudication is not considered a conviction under Texas law.

Box 22, Wilson, Texas 79381, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for a renewal of TCEQ Permit No. WQ0010624001, which authorizes the disposal of treated domestic wastewater at a daily average flow not to exceed 60,000 gallons per day via surface irrigation of 40 acres of non-public access agricultural land. This permit will not authorize a discharge of pollutants into water in the state. TCBQ received this application on October 9, 2015.

The wastewater treatment facility and disposal site are located approximately 0.6 mile west of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Road 400 and Farm-to-Market Road 211, and approximately 900 feet south of Farm-to-Market Road 211, in Lynn County, Texas 79381. The wastewater treatment facility and disposal site are located in the drainage basin of Double Mountain Fork Brazos River in Segment No. 1241 of the Brazos River Basin.

The TCEO Executive Director has completed the technical review of the application and prepared a draft permit. The draft permit, if approved, would establish the conditions under which the facility must operate. The Executive Director has made a preliminary decision that this permit, if issued, meets all statutory and regulatory requirements. The permit application, Executive Director's preliminary decision, and draft permit are available for viewing and copying at Wilson City Hall, 1601 10th Street, Wilson, Texas. If the request for contested case hearing is filed on behalf of a group or association, the request must designate the group's representative for receiving future correspondence; identify by name and physical address an individual member of the group who would be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activity; provide the information discussed above regarding the affected member's location and distance from the facility or activity; explain how and why the member would be affected; and explain how the interests the group seeks to protect are relevant to the group's purpose.


