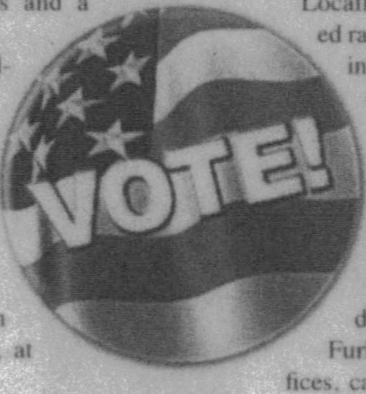
Early Voting starts Monday for Nov. 8 General Election

Early Voting for the Nov. 8 General Election begins Monday, Oct. 24 and continues through Nov. 4 at the Lynn County Courthouse. Voters may mark their choices on the ballot regarding several offices, including U.S. President and Vice President. Any registered voter may choose to vote during the early voting period.

Early voting is conducted during regular business hours (8 a.m.-12 noon, 1-5 p.m.) in the election room on the first floor of the courthouse. Bring

voter registration cards and a photo ID.

For those who qualify to vote by mail, applications must be received no later than Oct. 28, to Susan Tipton, P.O. Box 937, Tahoka, TX 79373. For more information, call Tipton at the Lynn County Clerk's Office, at 806-561-4750.



Locally, there are no contested races, as all were decided in the March Primary elections, but there will be several local unopposed candidates listed from Lynn County on the ballot, as well as the 106th District Attorney candidate Philip Mack Furlow. In the county offices, candidates on the ballot

include Rebekah Filley for County Attorney, Abraham Vega for Sheriff, and Donna Willis for Tax Assessor/Collector. In the Pct. 2/8 and 6 voting boxes, Matt Woodley is on the ballot for Pct. 1 Commissioner, and in the Pct. 3/10 and 12 voting boxes, Don Blair is on the ballot for Pct. 3 Commissioner.

All 10 voting boxes in Lynn County will be open on Election Day, Nov. 8, for voters. A list of polling locations will be printed in *The News* the week before the election.

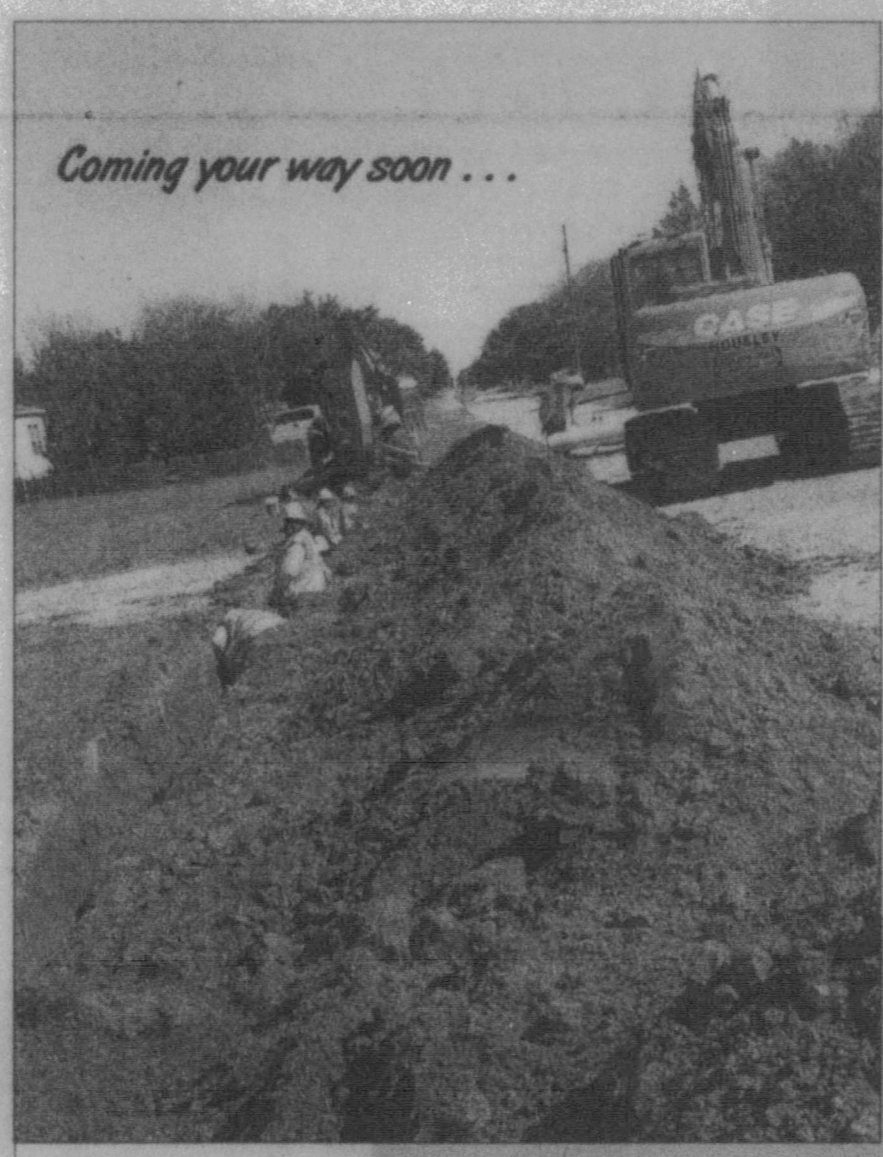

Two plead cases in 106th District court proceedings

Two cases were pled in 106th District Court proceedings on Oct. 11 at the Lynn County Courthouse. According to information from District Clerk Sandra Laws, the following cases were heard in court:

- Thomas Gonzales Madrid, 38, of Midland, revocation of probation on original DWI charges, assessed 5 years in Texas Dept. of Criminal Justice system.
- Kristopher Adam Brown, 33, of Waynoka, OK, charged with burglary of a building owned by Sotero Rangel Jr. on Sept. 15, 2015, pled on a lesser included offense of criminal trespass of a building (Class B Misdemeanor), assessed 120 days in county jail, but received jail credit of 122 days already served.

Lynn County Jail held 41 inmates this week, including 15 for Lynn

County and 26 for Ector County. Charges included two for driving while intoxicated, one for assault, and one for application to revoke probation for theft of property.

Dean Bartley

Dean Bartley of Lubbock passed away on Friday, October 14, 2016 at the age of 89. She was born September 16, 1927 in Roaring Springs, Texas, to the late L.H. and Esther (Collett) Clifton. She graduated from Roaring Spring High School and attended Texas Tech. Later, Dean married William Edward Bartley in Motley County, Texas, on October 27, 1949.

Dean chaired for the American Red Cross and the Salvation Army; she was a Past President of the Historical Society of Tahoka. She was the manager and treasurer for the Lynn County Federal Credit

Union, the co-founder of the Lynn County livestock sale, served as the sale-chairperson of the Lynn County Livestock Association for a decade. For over forty years, she taught Sunday School at First Baptist Church in Tahoka. Five years ago, Dean moved into the Raider Ranch community of Lubbock, where she began teaching a bible study class and became a member of Indiana Avenue Baptist Church.

Dean has been awarded Woman of the Year by the Chamber of Tahoka; Mother of the Year, by First Baptist Church of Tahoka; and a proud member of the First Baptist Church of Tahoka.

She is preceded in death by her beloved husband, William Edward Bartley; son, Max Bartley and her six siblings.

She is survived by her daughter, Myrna (Barry) Weaver of Lubbock; son, Math (Linda) Bartley, of Lubbock; brother, Pete (Beatrice) Clifton, of Plainview; sister, Mary Rainbolt, of Nocona, Texas; five grandchildren; and eight great-grandchildren.

Services were held at 1:00 p.m. Monday, October 17, 2016 at First Baptist Church in Tahoka with interment to follow at the Tahoka Cemetery.

Bryan Kent McClintock

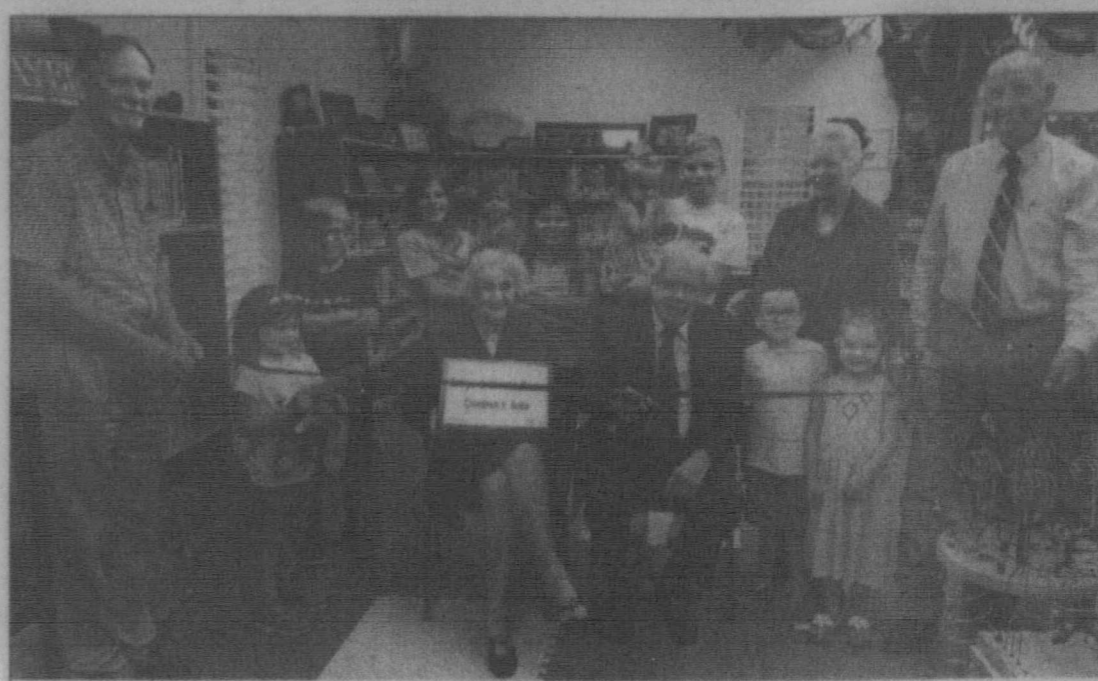

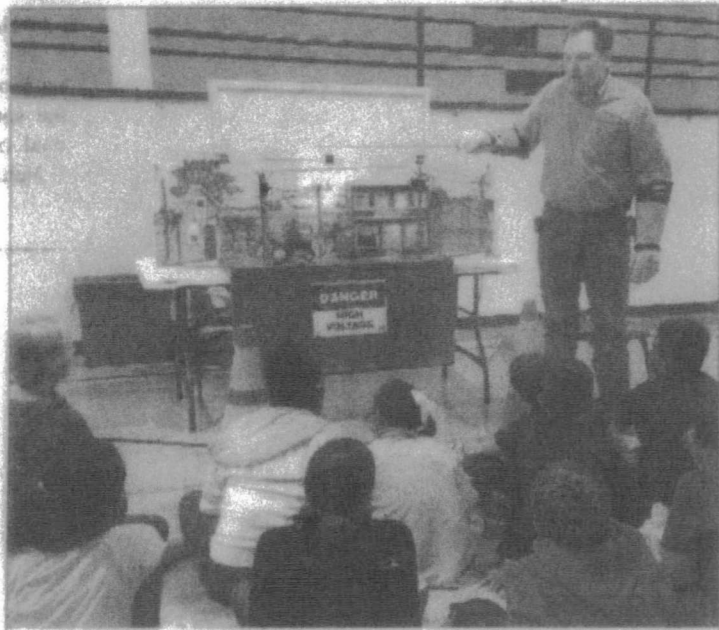

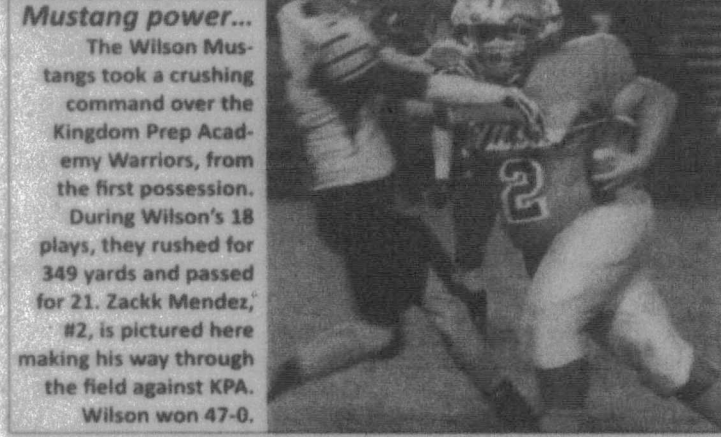
"I am very honored and humbled to represent Street Volkswagen at the Volkswagen RQC finals in November," Paschal said.

NOTICE OF ELECTION
In accordance with the provisions of the Texas Agriculture Code, Chapter 74, Subchapter D, and 4 Tex. Admin. Code, Chapter 3, Subchapter A, the Texas Department of Agriculture (the Department) will conduct a board election in the Southern High Plains Caprock Boll Weevil Eradication Zone, in order to select a representative of the above-referenced zone to serve on the Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation Board of Directors. The board is charged with administering the boll weevil eradication program in Texas.
The Southern High Plains/Caprock Eradication Zone consists of all of Cochran, Hockley, and Lubbock counties; that part of Terry County that is north of a line 1.25 miles south of the Hockley County line from FM 303 east to Highway 385 and all land north and east of a line with boundaries of County Road 230, County Road 525 also known as Cemetery Road, and County Road 280 to the Lynn County line; that part of Lynn County north and east of a line 5 miles north of Hwy 380 following County Road 18 that extends from the Terry County line east for 10 miles, then turns south to Hwy 380, and runs east to the intersection of FM 212 before turning south to the Borden County line; that part of Crosby County that is above the Caprock Escarpment, that part of Garza County that is above the Caprock Escarpment; and that part of Dickens County that is above the Caprock Escarpment
Any cotton grower having planted cotton in the year 2016 within the zone defined above is eligible to vote, and, if he or she resides in the Southern High Plains Caprock Zone and has at least seven years experience as a cotton grower, can have his or her name placed on the ballot as a candidate in the board member election. A cotton grower is defined as a person who grows cotton intended to be commercial cotton. The term includes an individual who, as owner, landlord, tenant or sharecropper, is entitled to share in the cotton grown and available for marketing from the farm, or share in the proceeds from the sale of the cotton from the farm or from an indemnity or other payment received from or related to the planting, growing, or failure of the cotton. Any person eligible to vote in the board member election that resides in the Southern High Plains Caprock Zone and meets the seven-year experience requirement may place their name in nomination for election to the Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation Board by written application to the Department at the address provided below. Nomination forms are provided by the Department and must be signed by the nominee and at least ten other eligible voters. The nomination form must be received by the Department at its office located in Austin by November 6, 2016, and must provide the legal residence of the applicant. A nomination form may be obtained by contacting the Department office or any county agent located in the voting area.
The board election will be held by mail balloting. Ballots will be mailed to cotton growers by November 18, 2016. All ballots cast by mail must be postmarked no later than December 6, 2016, in order to be valid.

Bulldogs take control. On Roby's first possession, Andrew Alvarez scooped a fumbled up and took it 47 yards to the end zone. The two-point try was unsuccessful and the lead was 19-8. After another Bulldog defensive stand, Nick Arce hit Colbe Perez again for a 24-yard touchdown. Tahoka led 25-8. The third quarter ended with Arce hitting John Stone over the middle for a 32-yard score making it 31-8. Andrew Alvarez broke a scoreless 4th quarter with five minutes remaining when he took the ball over the right side of the line for a three-yard score. John Quinonez converted the PAT making the final 38-8.

"It was a tale of two halves for us Friday night. Our offense struggled to sustain drives in the first half while our defense rose up and continually stopped Roby. Both sides of the ball clicked in the second half," said Coach Brandon Hopper.

"I was really proud of our defense! They had six take-aways. When your defense creates that many opportunities,

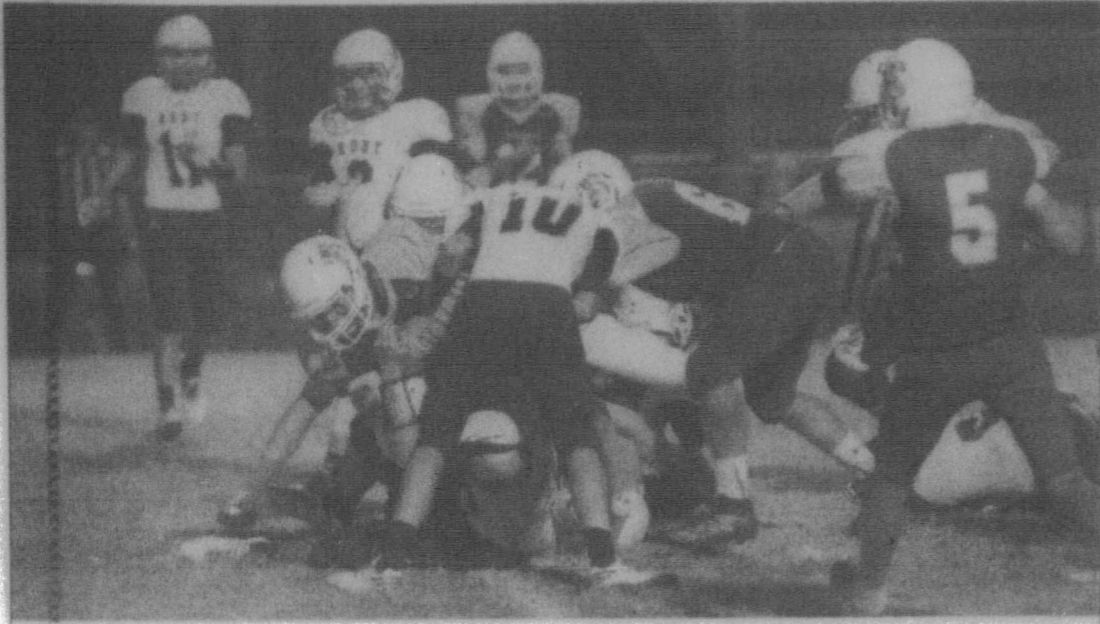

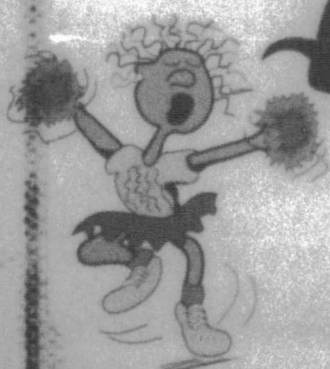

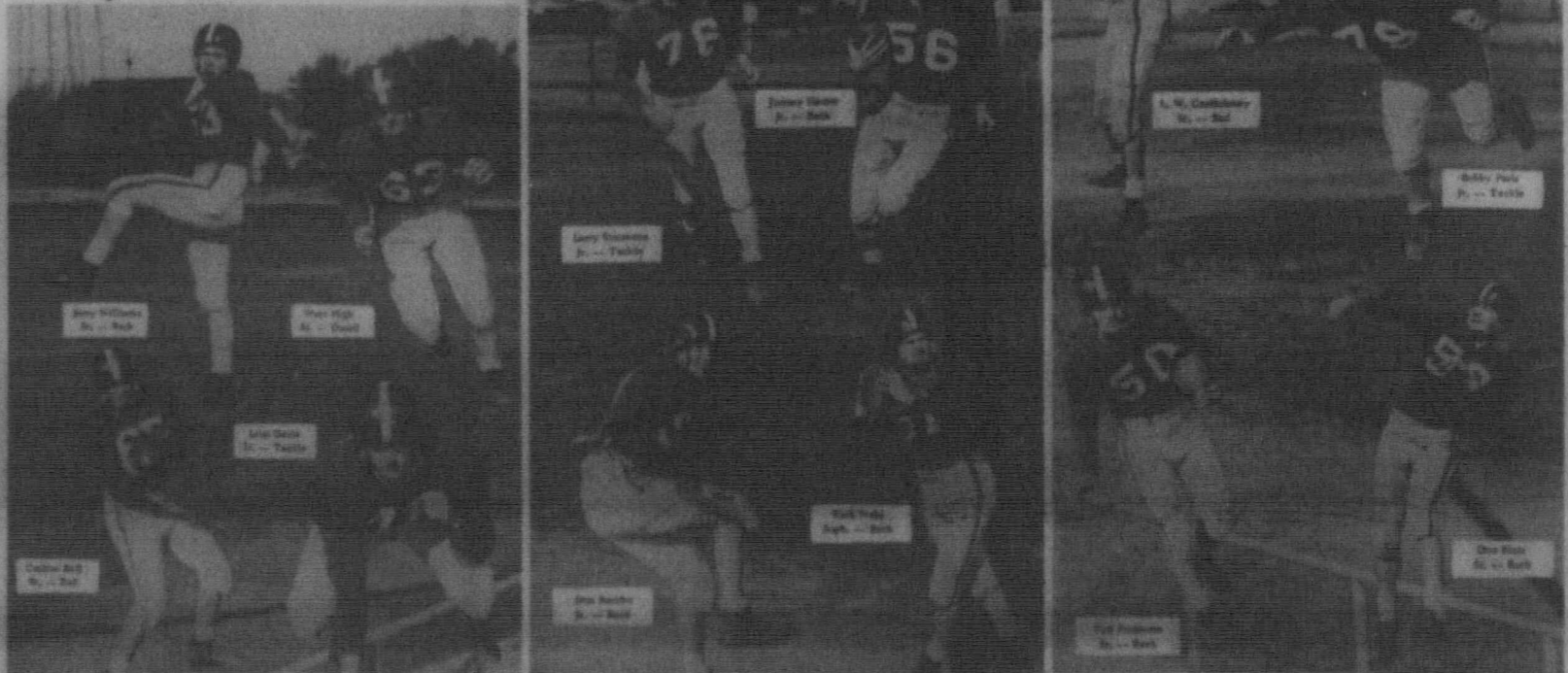
