

# All aboard! Ride the Tahoka Polar Express Saturday night

**P**ut on your cold weather gear and come ride the Tahoka Polar Express this Saturday, Dec. 10, as the train winds a trail around the northwest residential portions of Tahoka. The Blue Weed Special train, provided by Wildcat Manufacturing, Leighton and Joan Knox, Starr Bray and Todd Holland, will take guests around town to see the Christmas lights. Sponsored by the Tahoka Area Chamber of Commerce, it's all free and open to the public, and will be held from 6:00-9:00 p.m. this Saturday. It is an open air train, so come prepared for a chilly ride.

This year, the "train depot" will be at a different location - at the fellowship hall of the Tahoka Church of Christ, at 2320 Lockwood, where guests will board the train. Boarding will be conducted by numbered tickets, which each guest will receive for free at the "ticket station" inside. Each ride should take approximately 15 minutes, with the train taking the same route for each

ride. Homeowners on the route have been invited to decorate their properties in a Christmas decorating contest that will be judged by Chamber members.

Santa and Mrs. Claus will be at the train depot to visit with children, and for photo opportunities (parents must bring their own cameras). Live musical entertainment will be ongoing throughout the event, and there will be a corner

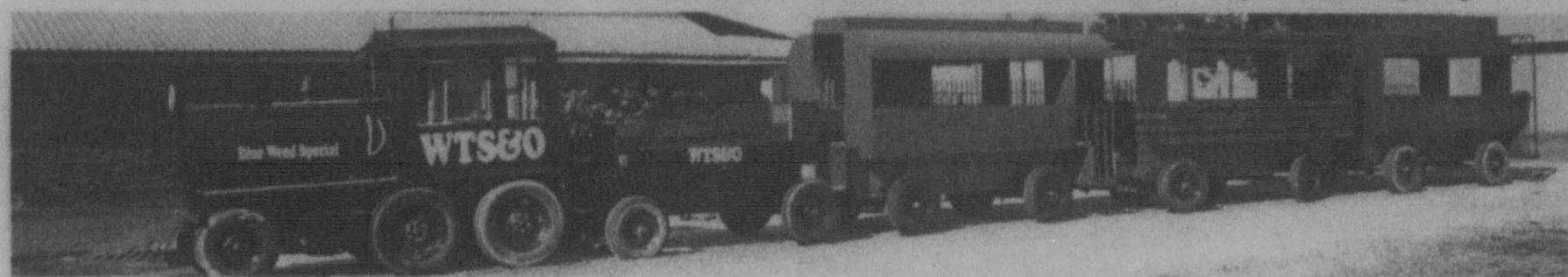
for children to sit and hear readings of the Christmas story.

This event is free, but donations will be accepted for the Lynn County Pioneers Senior Citizens Building Fund.

Cookies, hot chocolate and hot apple cider will be provided to all guests, courtesy of Tahoka Donuts and the Chamber of Commerce. Chamber members and several volunteer Tahoka

High School students will assist with the event, and Church of Christ members will serve the refreshments.

Guests may park their vehicles in the church parking lot (please enter and exit from Lockwood, as the Ave. R access will be used for the train), but watch for the traffic cones that designate the train route. The vacant lot east of the church may also be used for parking.

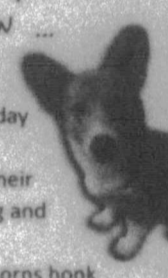

## Cotton module reported stolen; accidents cause no injuries here

Traffic accidents, a stolen cotton module, and livestock on the road were among reports from law enforcement officials this week.

On Saturday, Dec. 3, Trevor Munn called the Sheriff's Office for assistance, reporting he had fallen asleep while driving and rear-ended a trailer on US 87. He was in the northbound lane, just south of County Road 13. The vehicle pulling the trailer reportedly left the scene. EMS responded to the scene, but the man reported no injuries.

On Monday, Dec. 5, a semi truck driven by Pedro Torres of Lubbock struck a Chrysler minivan driven by Aganatha Klassen of Lamesa on US 87, just north of the FM 400 overpass, at 9:30 a.m. No injuries were reported in this incident.

Mario Jimenez of Lubbock was the driver of a 2006 Chevy Cobalt that struck a deer 4 miles south of Tahoka on US 87, at about 6:30 p.m. Monday. The collision caused major front end damage to the vehicle, which had to be towed from the scene, but the driver re-

ported no injuries.

Lynn Maeker called authorities on Dec. 2 to report that a cotton module had been stolen from the east side of US 87 near CR 13. Investigation continues to determine if one of the gins mistakenly picked up the wrong module.

On Dec. 3, an O'Donnell resident called to complain that her son was being threatened by seven men, reportedly because "he stole a gun." No arrests were made in the case.

Last Wednesday, Nov. 30, a driver reported livestock on County Road 36 and FM 179.

Tahoka Police arrested a 44-year-old Tahoka woman on Thursday, Dec. 1 on an active warrant out of Lubbock County for forgery.

During the month of November, Lynn County Sheriff's Dept. communications staff answered 337 calls for assistance, including 127 for Lynn County, 123 for City of Tahoka, 44 for Animal Control, 32 for Lynn County EMS, 9 for City O'Donnell, and 2 for Fire Depts.

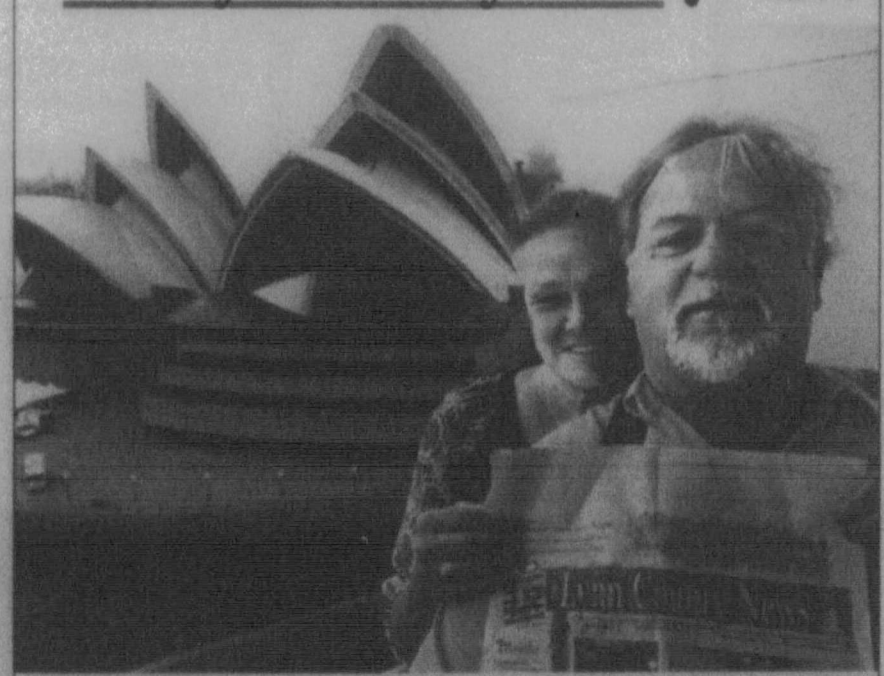

## Chamber sponsors Christmas decorating contest

This year, the train will depart from the Tahoka Church of Christ parking lot at 2320 Lockwood and travel through the northwest residential section, with the "Train Depot" inside the church fellowship hall. The train will travel from the church parking lot onto Ave. R, north to N. 4th, turn left, and turn left again on Ave. S to travel south, turning left on N. 1st to go back to the Church of Christ.

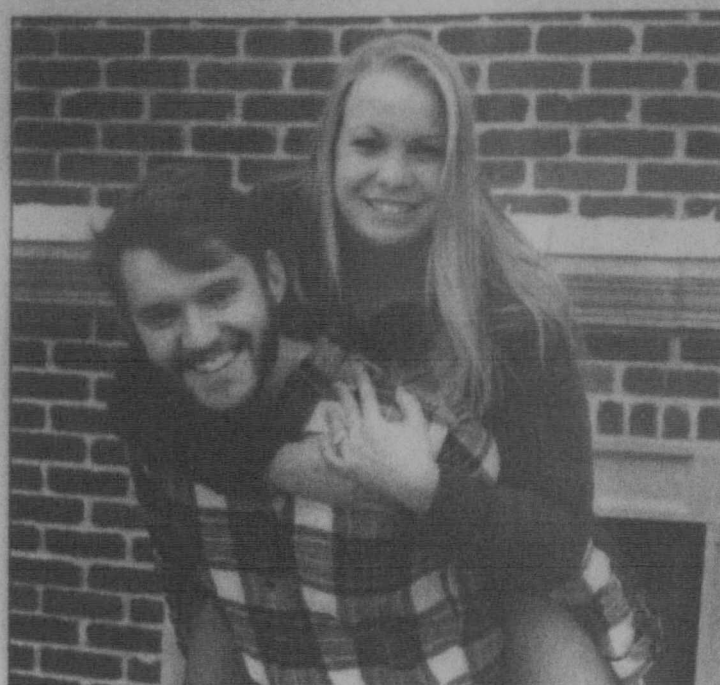

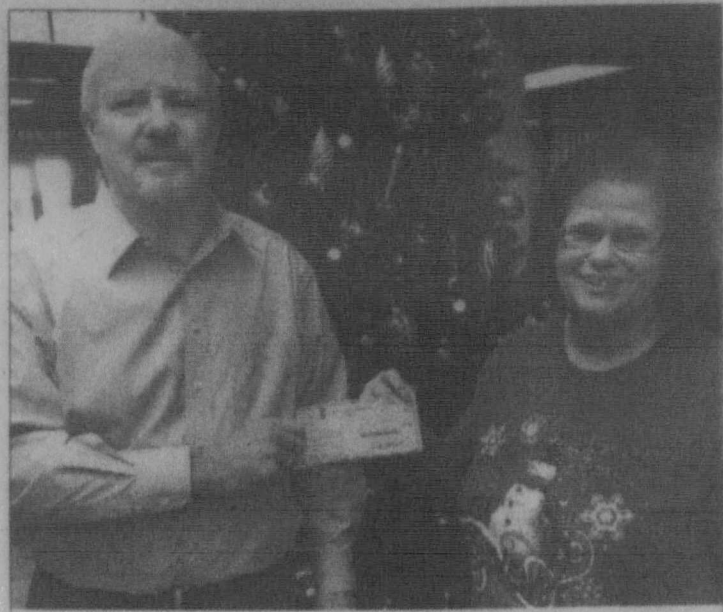
