gear and come ride the Tahoka Polar Express this Saturday, Dec. 10, as the train winds a trail around the northwest residential portions of Tahoka. The Blue Weed Special train, provided by Wildcat Manufacturing, Leighton and Joan Knox, Starr Bray and Todd Holland, will take guests around town to see the Christmas lights. ## Cotton module reported stolen; accidents cause no injuries here


