## O'Donnell couple loses everything in house fire

A fire that started in the kitchen of Cecil and Janie Honesto's home at 712 2nd Street in O'Donnell, quickly spread and consumed their home and all their belongings last Thursday. O'Donnell and Tahoka volunteer fire departments responded to the scene, but the blazing inferno quickly consumed the house and everything in-

Mrs. Honesto was the only one home when the fire occurred, and she was able to escape the house unharmed

Family members have started a donation account through an online donation site called "Go Fund Me," and posted the following information on the Go Fund Me website (https:// www.gofundme.com/rebuilding-forthe-future):

"Today my in-laws have lost their home! Dennis, Thomas, and Mingo are heading up the responsibility of making sure their mom and dad are able to get back into a home soon. A fire that started in the kitchen spread very quickly and consumed the home. The house is a total loss and all of their belongings are gone as well.

"Thankfully, Janie was able to escape the home with two of their four puppies. Two of their sweet puppies were lost in the fire. They became scared and couldn't be coaxed out from under the bed.

"The Red Cross came out to supply a few toiletries and blankets and help for a few meals so we are thankful. Also the church provided a place to stay for a few days while we await

"We are so thankful for everyone who has already begun to ask how they can help. Janie and Cecil are now without a home and only have the clothes on their backs with only a few weeks until Christmas and during the coldest time of the year. We as the family are trying to create a central place for those who have asked where they can donate and help out. We appreciate any amount to help our parents get back into a warm home."

An update followed: "We've heard from the insurance

adjuster and the home was declared a total loss. It will take 7-10 business days for the insurance help to kick in so the heat is on to find a home or have one built on the current property. This means that Janie and Cecil are still without a home. The monetary donations are so much help to provide shelter, food, toiletries, and clothing. Thank you all so much for thinking of us and keeping us in your prayers!"

Lynn-Garza CFB members crafted and passed a resolution asking the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Risk Management Agency to





Part of the water line replacement project is the installation of new "smart meters". These new water meters will be the most accurate meters we have ever had, and will read every drop of water that goes through it. Many residents will experience higher water bills

because of the difference in the accuracy.

Please be aware of the change that is coming with these new meters, and adjust your water usage accordingly. Once the new meters are installed we will be able to show you on a graph each and every time water goes through your meter. We will

also be able to detect a leak in your system in a timely manner.

In other cities after the new "smart" meters were installed some residents were very surprised by the amount of water they were actually using. We would like to avoid that by letting everyone know what you might experience and that you can take steps to control your usage from the start.

If you are wanting to upsize your new meter please let the City know as soon as possible as the order will be going in soon. Residential meters are 14" meters. However, if you want a larger meter you can get a I" or a 2". Be aware there may be an additional cost for increasing the size of your meter.

City Hall is currently compiling a list of meter changes so please let us know.

### DRIVEWAY REPAIRS

The contractor has informed us that driveway repairs will begin next week. Rusty Cook will be in charge of setting forms and pouring concrete. Be aware that it will take three (3) days for the concrete to set up, so your vehicles will have to be parked in the street until the concrete

### **Commissioners** approve reinvestment zone designation

Lynn County Commissioners unanimously approved designating a reinvestment zone in Lynn County, to allow for discussions and decisions regarding a potential new wind energy farm that is in the planning stages for Lynn and Garza counties. The decisions followed a public hearing on the subject that no citizens attended.

Staked Plains is a multiphase wind project in Lynn and Garza counties being developed by Lincoln Clean Energy. The first phase, Tahoka Wind, is expected to be approximately 300MW, and is anticipated to be online by the end of 2018.

Eric Barnett, Director of Development with Lincoln Clean Energy, was present to visit with the court to discuss the reinvestment zones in Lynn County for the new wind energy project. The Ideal Protein diet has been around for 25 years, and was developed and endorsed by medical doctors. The IP protocol was designed to induce rapid weight loss and spare lean muscle mass. It is different from the normal low calorie diet because it is designed to keep the sugar stores at a minimum and keeping the body in a fat burning mode round the clock. This diet is low fat, low carb and normal protein; very different from high protein diets.

"The IP diet differs from other diets in its four-phased approach. You lose the weight and phase back into eating "normal" foods. You get one-on-one counseling by trained counselors, daily videos sent to your email and food choices you can enjoy. To make things even better, it doesn't require exercise." explained an LCHD proponent of the program.


