Two accidents reported; man threatens coworkers

Two accidents were reported to law enforcement officials this week, one involving a deer, and another caller reported an intoxicated employee threatening co-workers at a rural work site.

At 3:30 last Tuesday afternoon, PB Materials reported an intoxicated employee had threatened to return with a gun after he was reportedly let go from his job, at a worksite near FM 1328 and US 380. The man left the scene before officers arrived.

At 7:28 Wednesday morning, Dusty Young was the driver of a 2015 Dodge Ram pickup that reportedly struck a deer on FM 1328, about 3 miles north of US 380. EMS was not dispatched, but the vehicle was towed from the scene.

Another traffic accident occurred inside the Tahoka city limits on Saturday, Jan. 28, but the report was not yet available from the police department. More information on this accident will be printed next week.

A 37-year-old Tahoka man was charged with terroristic threat of family/household and unlawful restraint on Jan. 21, after a domestic disturbance at a home on N. 5th Street. According

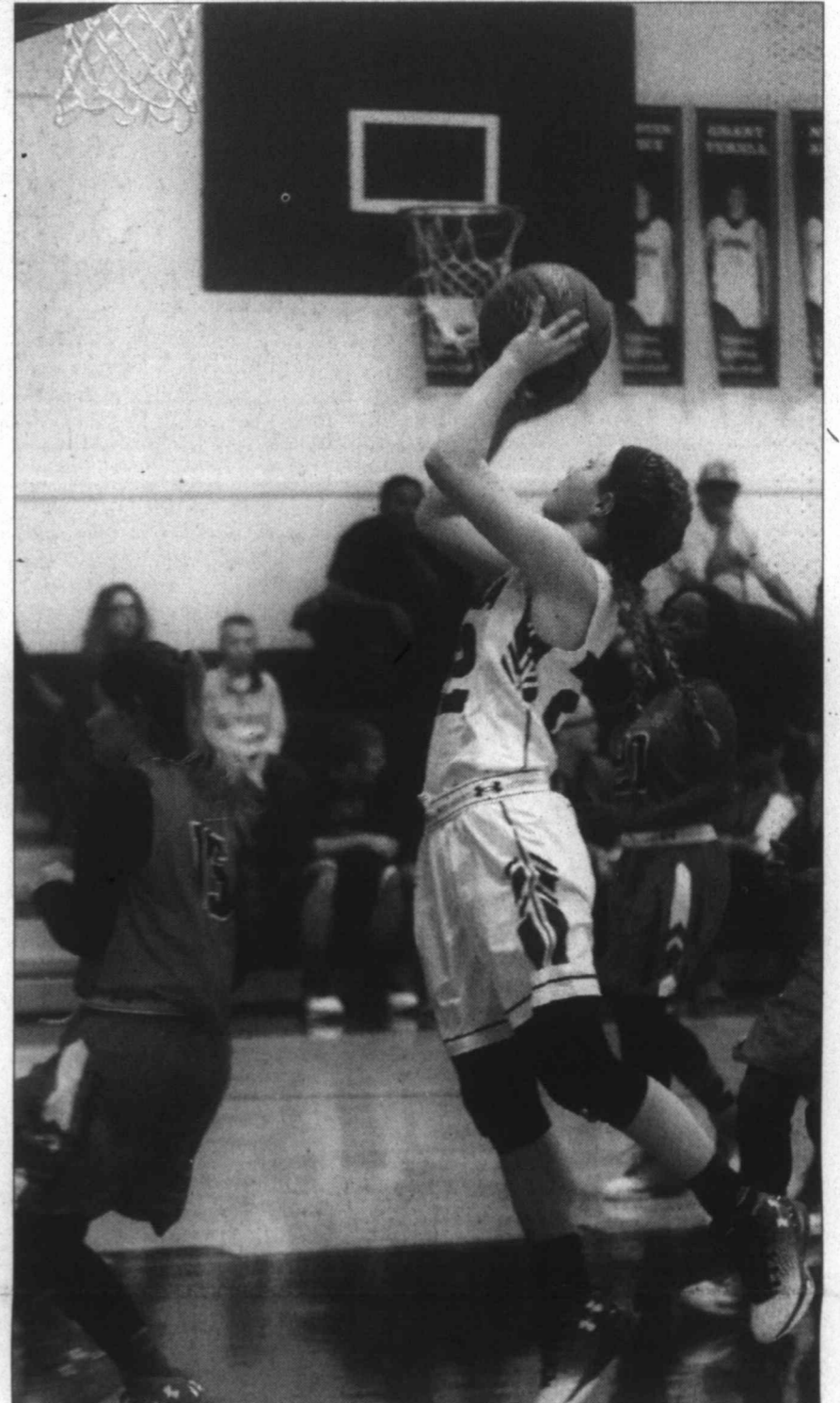
to the police report, the man had an argument with his girlfriend, threatening to harm her, any family member who came to get her, or the responding officer if she called the police. She was able to escape the home and call for help. Charges in this case will be forwarded to the County Attorney for processing.

A trash truck had to dump trash into a ditch on FM 212 last Thursday morning about 8 a.m., after trash in the back end caught on fire. Wilson Volunteer Fire Dept. responded to the scene.

In Wilson, a resident called 9-1-1 at 8:49 p.m. Saturday to report a man was trying to break into his home on Gouger Street and trying to stab him with a knife. The suspect was gone when officers arrived, and no arrests were made.

And on Monday morning, a caller at 10:46 a.m. reported the theft of \$600 from a woman's home on Ave. D, just outside the Tahoka city limits. The woman's caregiver was named as a suspect in the case.

Lynn County Jail held 35 inmates last week, including 28 for Ector County and 7 for Lynn County.

Tahoka ISD to host community-wide My School Color Run on April 8th

Tahoka ISD will host its inaugural community-wide My School Color Run on Saturday, April 8, starting at 9:00 a.m., to raise money for the TISD W.I.N. Scholarship Fund, which is awarded to graduating seniors who exemplify the characteristics associated with the TISD Vision titled W.I.N. 2025.

Partnering with My School Color Run, the event will consist of a manually timed 3.11-mile (5k) and an untimed 1-mile fun run for all ages and fitness abilities. Along the route, participants pass through vibrant color zones, making it a "colorful experience." Participants can walk, run, or jog the course of their choice. Families are encouraged to participate and to bring their children; strollers will be welcome on the courses. Additionally, each pre-registered participant is provided with a single powder color packet that will be thrown in the air at the final color celebration at the finish line.

"Rather than sell goods, we want-

ed to engage the entire community in a fitness initiative that aims to encourage a life-long healthy way of living," says Dr. George McFarland, TISD superintendent. "More than just seeking donations for this scholarship fund, we wanted to organize an event that the Tahoka community could actually participate in to help foster a sense of community pride, while also benefiting one common cause - the promotion of helping TISD graduates to succeed."

Participants who register by 3/17/17 will receive a t-shirt, race bib, and individual color packet.

Tahoka's Lady Bulldogs have clinched a playoff spot for the second consecutive year and have a 3-game lead for second place with three games remaining. This week, the Lady Bulldogs can create a tie for first place in district if they defeat Sundown at home Tuesday (the LCN goes to press by 5 pm, so no score available).

With last Friday's 54-38 win over Morton, Tahoka's overall record stood at 12-12 and 6-1 in District. Natalie Stice led scoring with 28

points for Tahoka, with Olivia Hammonds adding 8, Yuli Villegas 6, Kalyh Green 5, Tanya Stroope 3, Aly Dotson and Alyssa Rodriguez with 2 each.

IT'S SUPER BOWL TIME!

Sunday, February 5, 2017 - The New England Patriots will face the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI (51) at NRG Stadium in Houston.

Halftime Show - Lady Gaga is expected to perform during the Super Bowl halftime show. Luke Bryan will sing the national anthem.

Super Bowl Commercials:
1967 - A 30-second commercial costs about \$40,000 during the first Super Bowl.

2016 - A 30-second spot sells for a record cost of \$5 million, according to Les Moonves, CEO of CBS. The prior record of \$4.5 million for a 30-second spot was set in 2015 by NBC.

First Super Bowl - January 15, 1967 - The first Super Bowl championship game was between the NFL (Green Bay Packers) and AFL (Kansas City Chiefs) champions at Memorial Coli-

seum in Los Angeles. The score was Green Bay, 35 and Kansas City, 10. Attendance was 61,946. Bart Starr, the quarterback for Green Bay, was named the MVP.

Lowest Winning Score - January 14, 1973 - Lowest scoring winner - Miami Dolphins 14, Washington Redskins 7 - Super Bowl VII, at the Memorial Coliseum in Los Angeles.

Highest Winning Score - January 28, 1990 - Highest scoring winner - San Francisco 49ers, 55, Denver Broncos, 10 - Super Bowl XXIV, at the Louisiana Superdome in New Orleans. This was also the largest margin of victory to date.

Most Played - Dallas Cowboys, Pitts-

burgh Steelers and the New England Patriots are tied for appearances in the most Super Bowl games - 8. (as of January 2017)

Most Wins - Pittsburgh Steelers, 6.

Most Losses - Denver Broncos, 5.

Super Bowl Rings - The NFL pays for up to 150 rings at \$5,000 per ring (plus adjustments for increases in gold and diamonds). The NFL also pays for 150 pieces of jewelry for the losing team, which may not cost more than half the price set for the Super Bowl ring.

February 6, 2011 - Cowboy Stadium seating problems, "incomplete installation of temporary seats in a limited

number of sections made the seats unusable," leaves 1,250 ticket holders without seats. 850 were distributed around the stadium to other seats, 400 were left with no options. NFL promises triple refunds for the \$800.00 ticket for all 1250 people.

February 3, 2013 - Super Bowl XLVII (47) is played in New Orleans at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome. The Baltimore Ravens defeat the San Francisco 49ers 34-31. Beyonce is the halftime performer. A power failure at the Super Dome halts the game, and leaves half of the stadium in the dark for 34 minutes.

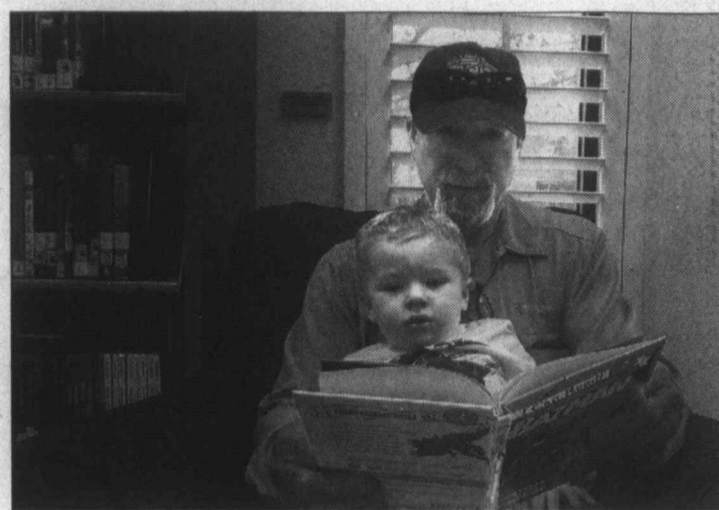

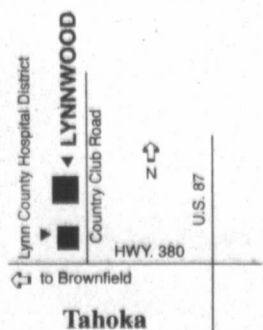

No new candidates file in past week for elections

Three candidates filed during the first week for places on city ballots in the May 6 elections, but no others have added their names to the list during the past week. The filing period for city, school and hospital board elections in Lynn County opened on Jan. 18 and continues through Feb. 17.

Lynn County Hospital District will have an election for two directors, both of whom will have three-year terms. City elections in Lynn County are for two-year terms, and school board trustees serve three-year terms.

Wilson, Tahoka and O'Donnell ISD each have two trustee seats up for election.

City elections in the county include two council seats in O'Donnell and New Home, two council seats and a mayoral term in Tahoka, and three council seats in Wilson.

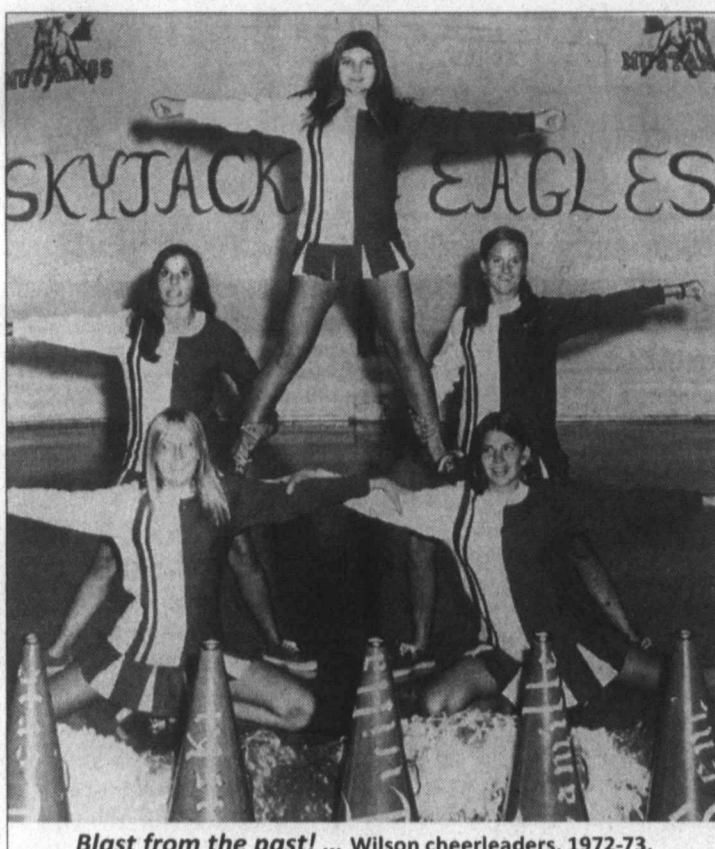

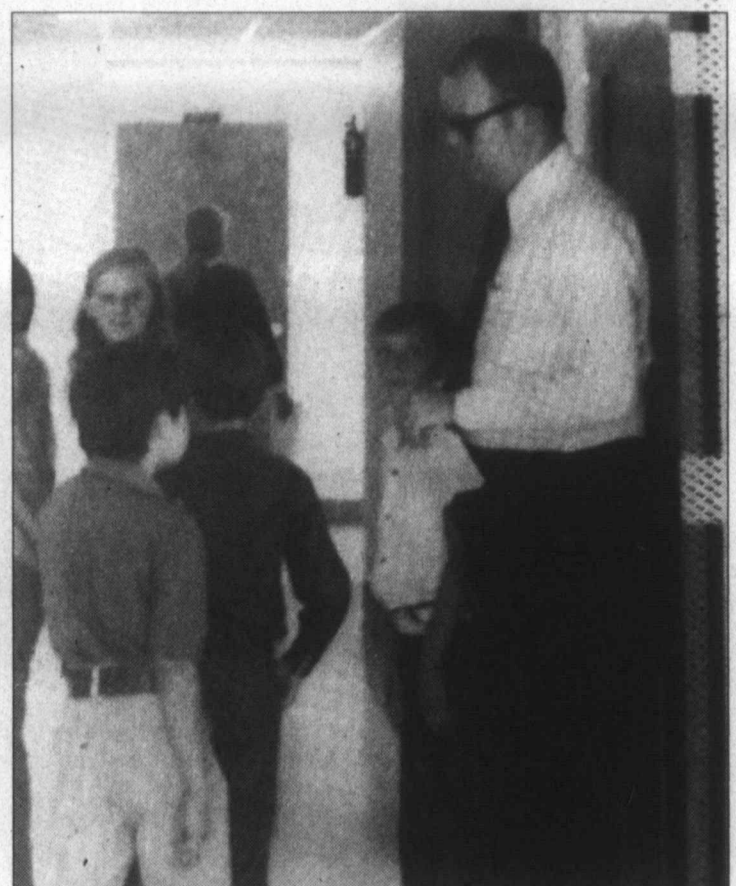
