Willow Ridge residents air complaints at County Commissioners meeting

by JUANELL JONES group of about 20 residents of Willow Ridge, a subdivision north of New Home in Lynn County, attended the Lynn County Commissioners meeting Monday morning, telling county officials that they felt their area was unfairly targeted with a high increase in the market values of their homes, and also complaining that the county was not maintaining the roads in their subdivision.

Koby Reed, who said he had lived in Willow Ridge for 10 years, and appeared to be acting as spokesperson for the group, said, "Our community pays more in county taxes with the least in services, and it seems like we're being punished for building our homes here," he said, explaining that he and other residents in the Willow Ridge community believed that a recent increase by Lynn County Appraisal District in the market values of their properties unfairly targeted their area with a higher increase in market values than in other areas of the county. The group was there to ask the county to consider lowering the tax rate if possible to help offset the value

increase.

In addition, he said, the county roads in the subdivision were not being maintained by the county. "We are asking for some simple maintenance

on our roads," he said. Rick Kliber, one of the developers of Willow Ridge, was present at the meeting, and he told commissioners that the developers followed guidelines that had been furnished at the time of the development (2006), and built the roads to those specifications at that time, with the understanding that the road maintenance would be turned over to the county after a certain number of years.

"In our eyes, we felt we fulfilled our part regarding the roads, and after (See COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, page 11)




At 10:22 p.m. last Friday, a small grass fire was reported 1 mile south of New Moore, east of FM 213. O'Donnell VFD was called to the scene.

Last Wednesday night, Sheriff's Deputies were called for a welfare check at 7:47 p.m. 3 miles north of Tahoka on US 87 for a man laying in the east side ditch. The responding deputy requested an ambulance for the man, but he refused treatment. The report indicated the man seemed severely dehydrated and said he had low blood sugar. The man told the deputy that he was trying to get to Lubbock after his car broke down, and the vehicle was also reportedly repossessed. The man refused any assistance from the deputy, but later called 9-1-1 at 4 a.m. requesting help.


Saturday night about 10:30 p.m., a theft was reported at a convenience store in O'Donnell, when a man allegedly took a pack of cigarettes without paying for them.

Wilson students visit Tahoka Lake Pasture; Objects found in dig

On Thursday, May 11, Wilson Elementary School students in grades 2-5 took a ful day field trip. They began with a stop at Tahoka Lake Pasture, where Dr. Stance Hurst and his crew from the Lubbock Lake Landmark at the Museum of Texas Tech University talked to them about archaeology and history.

The students were shown the current "dig" underway and other historical sites. Each student and Wilson ISD staff signed the guest book at the TLP Visitors' Center before continuing their excursion on to the Pioneer Museum in Tahoka.

As usual, the folks at Tahoka Lake Pasture were delighted to have young people visiting. We hope to see public school students, their teachers, and administrators, as well as homeschooled classes of all grade levels visiting frequently, both for pleasure and as "lab-like" adjuncts to their school studies.

According to Dr. Stance Hurst, Tahoka Lake is one of only 40 salinas on the Southern High Plains. The Landmark field crew since 2001 has recorded 24 archeological areas within the overall large site 41LY52 (at Tahoka Lake). For the past two field seasons, the field crew has focused on excavation at Area 11, located along the western side of Tahoka Lake, that contains a campsite occupation located on terrace that overlooks the salina.

Most of the objects found at Area 11 thus far has consisted of hearth-stones and hundreds of small flakes that resulted from the resharpening and maintenance of stone tools. The large number of objects found suggests the campsite was occupied by several hunter-gatherer families. The age of the site is unknown because no diagnostic objects had been found and no organic (e.g., charcoal hearth fill) recovered for radiocarbon dating.

This past summer, several local volunteers helped the Landmark team excavate at Area 11 in the second week of May. The field crew continued to work within four 1x2m2 units that were established the

The big discovery this field season was unearthing a Chupadero Black-on-White ceramic sherd. This ceramic sherd type was commonly found in late Ceramic-age ((1,000 to 500 years ago) Southern High Plains sites. Pottery was made by Puebloan farmers in the Southwest and traded to Plains hunter-gatherers for such things as bison hides and meat.

This discovery of Chupadero Black-on-White ceramic sherd marks only the third sherd found at Tahoka Lake since 2001 and the only one identified to type. Future work at Tahoka Lake will continue to focus on excavation at Area 11 to reveal more about this late Ceramic-






Tahoka Independent School District Board of Trustees met in special session Monday at 6 p.m., approving three teacher hires and discussing superintendent candidate qualifications.

The board entered into closed session at 6:25 to discuss superintendent candidate qualifications, reconvening into open session at 7:50, and then adjourning at 7:51 p.m.



State climatologist predicts hot summer

Above-average temperatures and dry conditions across Texas could be a sign of things to come this summer, says the state climatologist.

Dr. John Nielsen-Gammon, College Station, said he is concerned arid conditions could be prevalent through the summer following the warmest winter on record and a relatively dry spring with above-average temperatures.

March temperatures averaged 6 degrees higher than normal, he said. Cool spells in the first half of May have reduced average temperatures for the spring months, but the season was still 2-3 degrees warmer than usual.

Recent weather patterns around most of the state have also delivered very little moisture, Nielsen-Gammon said. The combination of dry, windy conditions and warmer temperatures could be the precursor to a long, hot summer.

"If dry conditions continue and soil moisture isn't replenished, we could get into drought relatively quickly," he said.

Buying a property? HPWD can help with groundwater questions

Buying a home or property
is always a little stressful. However, buying a home or property
in the country where there are
little or no city services can be
extremely stressful.

The electric co-op can supply electricity. The gas company can bring natural gas to your home. But who is going to supply water on your acreage? Most rural homes are supplied by groundwater from private wells. This is where the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District (HPWD) can help.

Since its creation, HPWD has monitored changes in aquifer levels within its service area. Each winter, District staff measure water levels in more than 1,400 privately-owned wells in the observation well network. The measurements are compared to those of the previous year to determine the rise or decline in the water table.

HPWD staff can calculate the amount of saturated thickness beneath a property by comparing the water level measurement to the depth of the base of the aquifer. These water level and saturated thickness data are available using the interactive "all-in-one" map feature on the HPWD website (map.hpwd.org)

When looking at prospective property, we encourage you to go to the interactive map feature, zoom in to the area of interest, and click on observation wells in the area to view the depth to water, saturated thickness, and depth to the base of the aquifer information.

Observation wells are spaced approximately three miles apart—so there is a good likelihood that there will not be one on the property of interest.

However, you can estimate the depth to water by looking at data from several nearby observation wells.

The interactive maps have a tab which allows access to water well drillers' logs. Accessing this will allow the public to view the depth to water and determine the depth of the formation. This process should help estimate the saturated thickness of the aquifer in most areas.

If there are still questions concerning the depth to water

and there are existing water wells on the property, HPWD staff can measure the depth to water in the wells, if the current landowner grants permission to do so.

HPWD staff are always ready to help you evaluate the water under the property or properties you are interested in purchasing. Feel free to stop by the HPWD office at 2930 Avenue Q in Lubbock or call us at (806) 762-0181 for assistance/information.

Texas Medicaid mosquito repellent benefit aims to protect Texans

AUSTIN—Starting May 1, Texas will begin providing this year's statewide Medicaid benefit for mosquito repellent to prevent Zika virus transmission. The Texas Health and Human Services Commission is offering the repellent to more Medicaid clients to ensure additional Texans are protected from the virus that can be devastating to unborn babies.

For the first time in Texas, some boys and men will be eligible to receive the benefit, as well as women ages 45 to 55. Eligible recipients can pick up mosquito repellent at participating pharmacies without needing a prescription, as Texas Medicaid has issued a standing order for mosquito repellent for the benefit.

"We want to support the health and safety of Texans," said HHSC Executive Commissioner Charles Smith. "The best way to protect yourself from the Zika virus is by using mosquito repellent."

Zika virus is transmitted to people primarily through the bite of an infected mosquito, but it can also spread by sexual contact. While symptoms are often minor, Zika can cause severe birth defects in the babies of some women infected with the virus during pregnancy.

The benefit is for pregnant women, women ages 10-55, and males age 14 and up who are enrolled in Medicaid managed care, fee-for-service, the Children's Health Insurance Program and CHIP-Perinatal programs. Recipients can pick up mosquito repellent without needing a prescription. In addition, individuals who meet the eligibility criteria for Healthy Texas Women, Children with Special Health Care Needs, or the Family Planning Program can receive the benefit. Eligible clients in the CSHCN program require a prescription.

The 2017 benefit includes up to two cans per month per eligible beneficiary. People are encouraged to call the pharmacy ahead of time because supply can vary by location.
