Lamesa man arrested here on grand jury indictment

A Lamesa man has been arrested in Grand Jury indictments from proceedings in 106th District Court held here on May 1. Arrested last week for felony indictment was:

· Paul Chavarria, 56, of Lamesa, charged with Driving While Intoxicated with two or more previous convictions for the same type offense.

Two vehicle accidents, and two thefts were reported during the past week. Jim Wood of Wilson reported someone broke a window to gain access to a home he was remodeling at 1306 Houston Street, stealing some tools. The theft was reported at 12:11 p.m. last Tuesday.

At 1 p.m. Monday, Linda Adamek reported theft of a lawnmower, swimming pool pump, and all the meat from a deep freeze located outside her home in the Southland area in Lynn County.

No injuries were reported in a traffic accident reported at 2:43 p.m. last Wednesday, when a 2013 4-door Chrysler vehicle struck a semi truck in the northbound lane in a construction zone on US 87 about a mile north of Tahoka.

A one-vehicle rollover occurred Sunday night about 7:30 p.m. 12 miles north of Tahoka on US 87 near CR 3.

The driver, Amanda Blevins of Colorado, was reportedly able to get out of her vehicle, and she was transported by Lynn County EMS to Lynn County Hospital for treatment.

Saturday morning, an oil spill from a tank was reported at 9:20 a.m. at the intersection of FM 211 and FM 1730. TCEQ officials were notified of the spill.

A Tahoka man, 43, was arrested on charges of public intoxication just before 1 a.m. Saturday morning, after family members called about the man at a residence on South 3rd Street. Tahoka Police found the man standing outside the home, arguing with the home's residents through a glass storm door. Police arrested the man on charges of Public Intoxication, and also found he had a city warrant for public intoxication as well.

A 48-year-old Tahoka man was arrested at 9 p.m. Sunday on charges of Driving While License Suspended/Invalid.







HEARD A MINISTER a couple of Sundays ago telling us how we ought to love everybody and treat them right, and in his pre-game warmup he mentioned telling someone once just "how the cow ate the cabbage."





This was a good day, To think and to pray. Strange, that prayer is so right, When there could be a fire fight.


Wheel back into base, Tomorrow, another ride to face. Convoys done for the day, Looks like rain's on its way.

So, we remember today, All those who went away-And gave their lives, that we, Might live here and stay free.






