Vehicles hit deer in three separate mishaps

Three different vehicle accidents in Lynn County last week involved a vehicle hitting a deer, and a onevehicle rollover sent the driver to the hospital last Tuesday night, according to reports from the Lynn County Sheriff's Office this week.

Venue changed for first time ever: 42nd annual Harvest Festival to be held at city park

The 42nd Annual Lynn County Harvest Festival is just a few weeks away, slated for Saturday, Sept. 16, and for the first time in its history the event is being moved to a new venue. Due to the restoration project at the Lynn County Courthouse, this year's festival will not be held on courthouse grounds. Instead, the event will be held at the Tahoka City Park, located at N. 1st and Ave. J.







John L. Smith


John L. Smith, 83, of Golden, CO, formerly of Tahoka, went to be with his Lord and Savior on July 1, 2017.






First, I'd like to apologize for not having any Wilson news last week. I completely lost track of the days and missed the deadline. My apologies.
