## Five accidents, two involving deer, reported in Lynn County last week

Five traffic accidents were investigated by officers in Lynn County during the last week, including two that involved vehicles hitting deer.

Lynn County EMS transported Jesse Calvillo, the driver of a 1998 Ford Ranger, to a hospital for treatment after he was involved in a rollover one mile north of Tahoka on US 87 at 6:50 p.m. last Wednesday. Calvillo's vehicle was reportedly sideswiped by an

18-wheeler semi, which caught the passenger side bumper and sent the vehicle into a rollover. No report was given as to the extent of his injuries.

Ashley Forrester was the driver of a vehicle that hit a deer at 7:53 a.m. last Thursday near County Road 18 and FM 1328. No injuries were reported. Saturday night at 10:33 p.m., Ty Conger hit a deer with his pickup on US 87 near County Road 14. The deer reportedly hit the grill guard of the truck, and

no injuries were reported.

Another accident occurred in Tahoka Friday afternoon at 2:44 p.m. at the corner of N. 2nd and Ave. J. Martha Calvillo DeLeon was the driver of a white 2005 Chevrolet Trailblazer SUV that reportedly failed to yield right of way while turning from Ave. J left onto N. 2nd, colliding with a maroon 2001 Chevrolet Tahoe driven by Ashley Munoz. According to the police report, cars parked on both

sides of both roads while waiting for the Tahoka Homecoming Parade to begin may have obstructed the driver's vision. Both vehicles suffered some damage, but no injuries were reported.

Martin Rosas' 2005 Chevrolet Silverado pickup was apparently struck in the parking lot of a Tahoka grocery store, in a hit-and-run report last Thursday at 5:15 p.m. Rosas told Tahoka Police that he parked and went

## Marisol Morin crowned Lynn County Harvest Festival Queen

during Saturday's Harvest Festival, and two Tahoka Elementary girls were crowned Co-Princesses of the festival, with outstanding ticket sales. Aubrianna Lozoya and Madison Lee were both named Co-Princesses for the 2017 Harvest Festival.

Marisol, 14, is the daughter of Johnny and Elisa Morin, and she will receive the Harvest Festival Queen Scholarship, as well as an extra \$100 based on her ticket sales. First runnerup was Nadalie Carrasco, 15, daughter of Victoria DeLeon, of Tahoka, and second runnerup was Madison Moya, 16, daughter of Jesus and Melanie Moya. They will also receive a Harvest Festival Scholarship upon their entry into college. Additionally, all three were also awarded a Harvest Festival Madison Lockaby Memorial Scholarship, which was presented by the Todd and Kristi Lockaby family in honor of their daughter, Madison, who was the 2013 Harvest Festival Queen.

Harvest Festival Co-Princess Aubrianna Lozoya is the daughter of

Blanca Garza and Larry Saldana. She won \$1,300 in prize money and cash awards based on the number of raffle tickets she sold. Co-Princess Madison Lee, daughter of Amanda and Joey Jolly, and Brad Lee, won \$1,050, in prize money and ticket sales. All



princess candidates who sold tickets earned \$100 cash for every 350 tickets they sold for the festival. Other runners-up who earned cash for ticket sales and extra prize money for being in the top five included Madison

**Lynn County protects workers, saves tax dollars**

Lynn County is saving local taxpayer dollars and protecting county employees on the job with the help of personal protective safety equipment provided by the Texas Association of Counties Risk Management Pool (TAC RMP) at no cost.

County road construction crews are regularly exposed to risks while maintaining county roads and bridges. As a member of TAC RMP, the county received the safety kits at no cost to help protect county crews. The kits are just one of many risk control services and programs that the county has access to at no cost through its membership.

Each safety kit included a reflective safety vest, gloves, hard hat, two pair of safety glasses and two sets of ear plugs. The equipment is intended to make employees more visible to motorists, while they work around traffic and heavy equipment and provide them with eye, head, hand and ear protection. All equipment conforms to standards set by American National Standard Institute (ANSI).

The county's membership in TAC RMP provides it with competitively priced risk management coverage and risk control services that are county government specific. With more than 380 members statewide,

TAC RMP helps Texas counties and other county governmental entities manage taxpayer dollars efficiently and promote worker safety.

**'Love for Micah' benefit dinner set in Wilson**

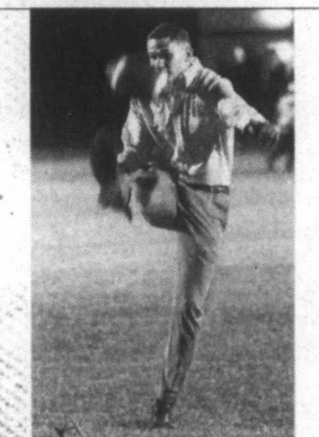

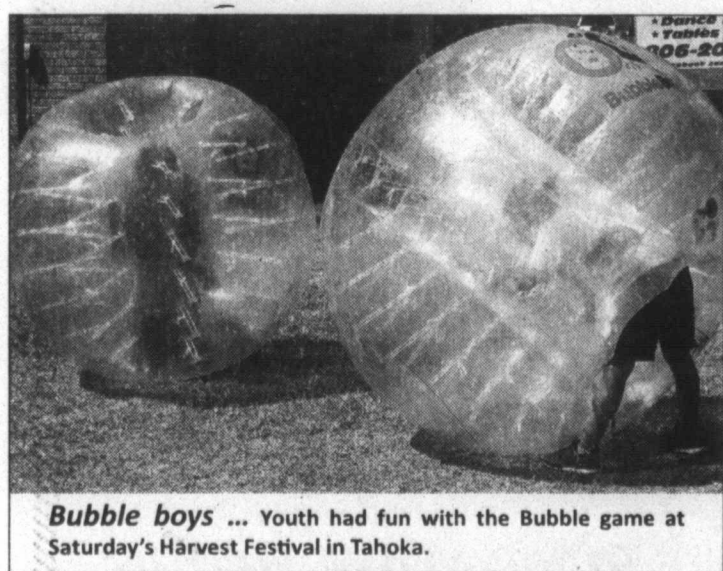

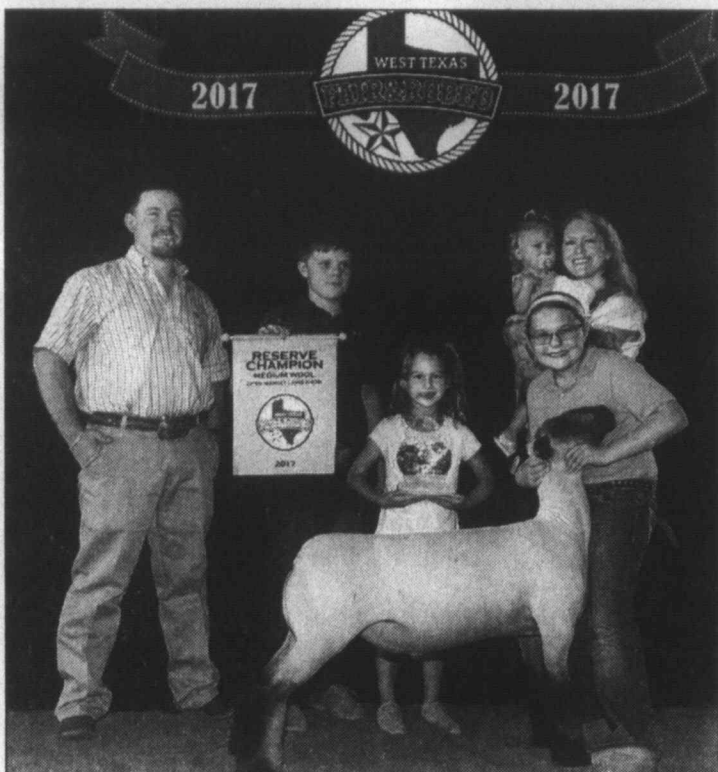

Wearing bright yellow shirts sporting the day's theme,

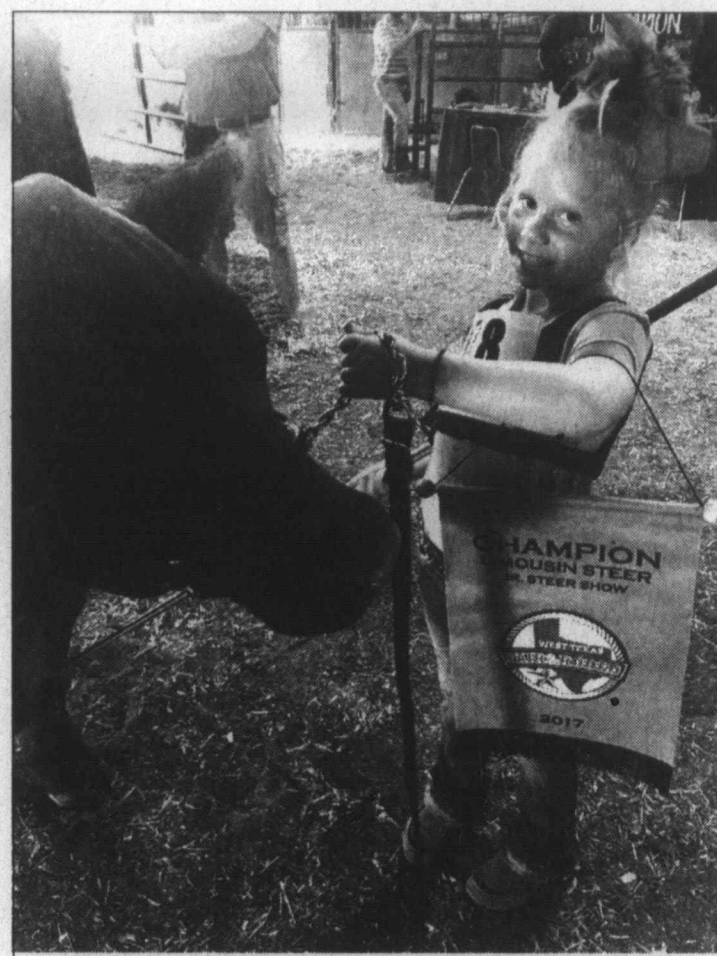

Brief Explanatory Statements of Proposed Constitutional Amendments  
Special Election,  
November 7, 2017

**Proposition Number 1 (HJR 21)**

HJR 21 proposes a constitutional amendment that would permit the Texas legislature to expand the circumstances under which a partially disabled veteran or their spouse may qualify for an exemption from ad valorem taxation of part of the market value of the veteran's residence homestead. Currently, the Texas legislature may provide that a partially disabled veteran or their spouse is entitled to an exemption from ad valorem taxation of a percentage of the market value of the disabled veteran's residence homestead only if the residence homestead was donated to the disabled veteran by a charitable organization at no cost to the veteran. The amendment would allow the Texas legislature to provide that the exemption also may be taken when the residence homestead was donated, sold, or transferred to the disabled veteran by a charitable organization for less than the market value of the residence homestead. The amendment also harmonizes certain related provisions of the Texas Constitution.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for an exemption from ad valorem taxation of part of the market value of the residence homestead of a partially disabled veteran or the surviving spouse of a partially disabled veteran if the residence homestead was donated to the disabled veteran by a charitable organization for less than the market value of the residence homestead and harmonizing certain related provisions of the Texas Constitution."

**Proposition Number 2 (SJR 60)**

SJR 60 proposes a constitutional amendment to require that certain conditions be met for the refinancing of a home equity loan to be secured by a voluntary lien on a homestead. The amendment also would: redefine what is excluded in the calcu-

lation of the cap on fees associated with a home equity loan, lower the cap from 3% to 2% of the original principal amount of the extension of credit, and specify that such fees are in addition to any bona fide discount points used to buy down the interest rate. The amendment would further specify the list of authorized lenders to make home equity loans, change the threshold for an advance of a home equity line of credit, allow agricultural property owners to acquire home equity loans, and update technical terminology in the Texas Constitution. The amendment would be effective on January 1, 2018, and applicable only to a home equity loan made or refinanced on or after that date.

The proposed amendment would appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment to establish a lower amount for expenses that can be charged to a borrower and removing certain financing expense limitations for a home equity loan, establishing certain authorized lenders to make a home equity loan, changing certain options for the refinancing of home equity loans, changing the threshold for an advance of a home equity line of credit, and allowing home equity loans on agricultural homesteads."

**Proposition Number 3 (SJR 34)**

SJR 34 proposes a constitutional amendment that would prevent certain office holders from serving indefinitely beyond the expiration of their term. Office holders who are appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate and receive no salary would only be able to serve until the last day of the first regular session of the Texas legislature that begins after their term expires.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment limiting the service of certain office-holders appointed by the governor and confirmed by the senate after the expiration of the person's term of office."

**Proposition Number 4 (SJR 6)**

SJR 6 proposes a constitutional amendment that would allow the Texas legislature to require any court that is hearing a challenge to

the constitutionality of a state statute to notify the attorney general of that challenge, if the party raising the challenge notifies the court that the party is challenging the constitutionality of such statute. Additionally, the amendment would allow the Texas legislature to set a period of not more than 45 days following the notification to the attorney general that the court must wait before rendering a judgment that a state statute is unconstitutional.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to require a court to provide notice to the attorney general of a challenge to the constitutionality of a state statute and authorizing the legislature to prescribe a waiting period before the court may enter a judgment holding the statute unconstitutional."

**Proposition Number 5 (HJR 100)**

HJR 100 proposes a constitutional amendment to provide a more detailed definition of "professional sports team" for purposes of their charitable foundations, which the Texas legislature may permit to hold charitable raffles. The amendment also deletes a requirement that an eligible professional sports team charitable foundation permitted by the Texas legislature to hold charitable raffles had to be in existence on January 1, 2016.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment on professional sports team charitable foundations conducting charitable raffles."

**Proposition Number 6 (SJR 1)**

SJR 1 proposes a constitutional amendment that would allow the Texas legislature by general law to provide that a surviving spouse of a first responder who is killed or fatally injured in the line of duty is entitled to receive an exemption from ad valorem taxation from all or part of the market value on the surviving spouse's residence homestead, as long as the surviving spouse has not remarried since the death of the first responder. It would also allow the Texas legislature to provide that the surviving spouse, who qualifies

and receives the exemption and then qualifies a different property as the surviving spouse's residence homestead, receive an exemption from ad valorem taxation of the different homestead in an amount equal to the dollar amount of the exemption of the first homestead for which the exemption was received in the last year in which the surviving spouse received the exemption for that first homestead. Like the initial exemption, this benefit will only remain available if the surviving spouse has not remarried since the death of the first responder. The proposed amendment would apply only to ad valorem taxes imposed for a tax year beginning on or after January 1, 2018.

The proposed amendment would appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for an exemption from ad valorem taxation of all or part of the market value of the residence homestead of the surviving spouse of a first responder who is killed or fatally injured in the line of duty."

**Proposition Number 7 (HJR 37)**

HJR 37 proposes a constitutional amendment that would allow the Texas legislature to make an exception to the law regarding the award of certain prizes. Currently, the Texas Constitution requires the Texas legislature to pass laws prohibiting lotteries, raffles, and other programs where the award of gifts is based on luck or chance. The proposed amendment would make an exception to this general rule to allow the Texas legislature to authorize credit unions and other financial institutions to institute programs which, in order to encourage savings, would award prizes based on luck or chance to the credit union's or financial institution's customers.

The proposed amendment would appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment relating to legislative authority to permit credit unions and other financial institutions to award prizes by lot to promote savings."

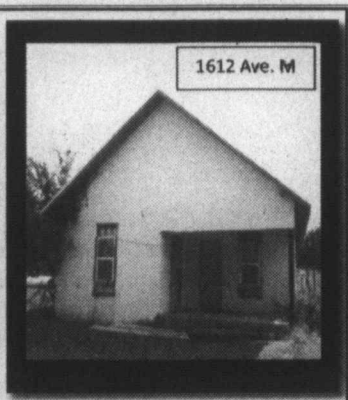
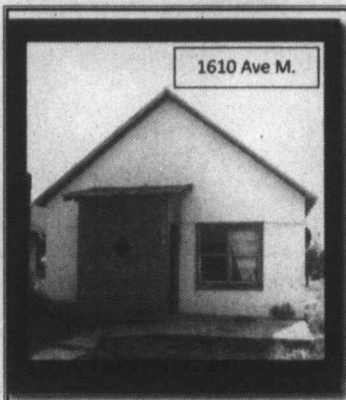
