Double fatality crash Tuesday takes life of Tahoka man

A collision south of Tahoka on US 87 in the early-morning hours of Tuesday claimed the lives of two people, one a Tahoka man, when his vehicle was struck head-on by another vehicle reportedly traveling the wrong way on the wrong side of the highway.

According to Sgt. John Gonzalez, Texas Dept. of Public Safety, the preliminary investigation indicates that around 5:45 a.m. a Ford Explorer traveling northbound in the southbound lanes collided into a Ford pickup traveling southbound. Terry Dene Gwin, 42, of Tahoka, was identified as the driver of the Ford pickup. The driver of the Ford Explorer traveling northbound in the southbound lanes has been identified as Ivan Adam Davila, 35, of Horizon City El Paso, Tx. Both vehicles ended up in the center median. The crash occurred 4 miles south of Tahoka.

Traffic was diverted from the southbound lanes of US 87 for several hours Tuesday while officers worked

the scene. The crash is still under investigation.

Last Monday night, a Lynn County woman was attacked when a man forced entry into her rural home.

Jamie Rogers called 9-1-1 at 9:24 p.m. on Monday, Nov. 6, telling Lynn County Sheriff's Dept. that a man who claimed to be from the police department forced his way into her home located just off US 87 and attacked her. According to information this week from the Sheriff's Dept., she told officers that she heard someone knocking on her front door, and a man claiming he was from the police department saying he needed to speak with her. When she opened the door, the man forced his way inside and reportedly grabbed her around the neck. Her dog reportedly attacked the man and she was able to push the man back outside the door and lock it. The man left the scene before deputies could arrive. EMS was called to the home to check the woman for injuries, but did not transport her for medical care.

District Judge Carter Schildknecht assessed sentencing in three cases in 106th District Court proceedings held on Nov. 7 for Lynn County. Sentencing was as follows:

- Anthony Vera, pled guilty on charges of Possession of a Controlled Substance, To-Wit, Methamphetamine, from charges on Dec. 20, 2016; sentenced to 9 months in State Jail, plus payment of court costs and \$180 in restitution.

- Dalton Guerra, Judgment Revoking Community Supervision, sentenced to 5 years in Texas Department of Criminal Justice institution (less 180 days time credited), on charges of Indecency with a Child on Nov. 27, 2012; plus payment of court costs and \$2,500 fine.

- Tiffany Hernandez Castro, Judgment Adjudicating Guilt and Revoking Community Supervision, for the offense of Possession of a Controlled Substance in Amount Less than 1 Gram; sentenced to 58 days in county jail (less 58 days time credited).

Three other traffic accidents were reported during the past week. At 4:22 a.m. last Tuesday, a woman accidentally drove into the center median on US 87, south of CR 15. When she hit the ditch her airbag deployed. Xenia Ramos of Tahoka was the driver of the 2012 Ford. Lynn County EMS transported her to UMC hospital in Lubbock.

Jeffrey Thomas of Round Rock was the driver of 2009 Toyota that hit a wild hog on US 380, west of Tahoka, at 9 p.m. last Wednesday. He was driving in the eastbound lane when his vehicle struck the hog. No injuries were reported, but the vehicle had to be towed.

Two vehicles collided on FM 211 at FM 2192 at 7:34 p.m. Saturday, when one vehicle attempted a U-turn and the other struck it. No driver's names were available, but a Nissan Sentra and a Ford F250 were the vehicles involved. No injuries were reported.

Two cotton module fires were reported last week, one near Wilson last Monday night and one a half mile north of Tahoka on US 87 on Sunday night.

Two reports of theft were investigated by Sheriff's Officers. Last Tuesday night, a man reported that his girlfriend came into one of the barracks next to New Home Coop Gin and took his TV and other items while he was at work at the gin. And, a man reported a stolen gun at 9:13 p.m. Sunday night, but told officers that a man had been practicing with the gun and then failed to return it. Officers located the man, and the gun was recovered. The owner of the gun did not file charges, but the man who took the gun was arrested anyway after officers determined he was wanted on warrants out of Midland County.

Tahoka Police arrested a 21-year-old Temple man on charges of Possession of Narcotics after a traffic stop in the 700 block of Lockwood at 12:37 a.m. Saturday. A search of the man's vehicle revealed marijuana and drug paraphernalia.

During the month of October, Sheriff's Office Communications staff processed 287 calls, including 122 for the County, 97 for City of Tahoka, 11 for City of O'Donnell, 33 for Lynn County EMS, 17 for Lynn County Animal Control, and 7 for county fire departments.

Lynn County Jail held 42 inmates, including 19 for Ector County, 6 for Dawson, and 17 for Lynn County.

Dr. Edward Smith named Municipal Judge; Council appoints McLelland to fill open seat

Tahoka City Council met Monday night, voting unanimously to name Edward Smith, PhD as the new Municipal Judge for the City of Tahoka, and naming Casey McLelland to fill the vacant seat on the council, from among a slate of three nominees.

Dr. Smith is a former Tahoka citizen who has moved back to Tahoka after retiring as Director of the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service. He has also worked as a Program Specialist with the Agricultural Food Policy Center to evaluate farm policies. Following his appointment as Municipal Judge by unanimous approval of the City Council, Dr. Smith was administered the Oath of Office by Mayor John Baker. He will assume his duties immediately.

Naming someone to fill the District 3 vacated seat on the City Council brought an unusual set of circumstances for the council to consider. After returning to open session after a short executive session to consult with the city's attorney, each of the three council members present at the meeting nominated a different person as their nominee for the vacated council seat. Councilman Ray Box nominated Casey McLelland for the position, Councilman Jeff Martin nominated Shiloh Braddock for the seat, and then Councilman Ronny Jolly nominated Barbara Jaquess for the seat. With each of the three voting for their candidate, it was left to Mayor John Baker to cast a vote to break the three-way tie, and Baker voted for McLelland. Jolly made another motion, which carried unanimously, that the newly-appointed council member serve until the next election in May 2018 (a 7-month period), at which time there would be a one-year unexpired term for the District 3 seat placed on the ballot.

Mrs. McLelland is an RN at Lynn County Hospital. She is taking the council seat vacated by District 3 councilman Tyler Hawthorne.

In other business, the council re-appointed Slate May as the city's representative on the Lynn County Appraisal District Board, and approved an expenditure of \$3753 from the city's Hotel/Motel tax revenue funds to pay a portion of the cost of electrical work at the city park for the Harvest Festival. The Harvest Festival's

Three file for county offices

Three people have filed for county offices as of Tuesday morning this week, to have their names placed on the ballot in the 2018 Republican Primary. Ed Follis filed for re-election as Justice of the Peace, Pct. 4, and Christie Oliván has filed for Justice of the Peace, Pct. 1. Sandra Laws filed for re-election as District Clerk.

Eight county offices have positions up for election in the 2018 March Primaries. The filing period opened Nov. 11 and continues through Dec. 11, 2017, for all candidates interested in filing for a seat.

The eight county offices that candidates may apply to file

for a four-year term include the County Judge, County Treasurer, County Clerk, District Clerk, Justice of Peace Pct. 1, Justice of Peace Pct. 4, County Commissioner Pct. 2, and County Commissioner Pct. 4.

Candidates interested in filing on the Republican ticket may contact Lynn County Republican Party Chairman John Baker, at 806-789-1257.

Currently in Lynn County, there is no County Democratic Party chairman, but candidates interested in filing on the Democratic ticket may contact the Texas Democratic Party, 512-478-9800, for information on how to file.

TISD Board approves audit, chooses seating for auditorium

Tahoka Independent School District Board of Trustees met in regular session last Tuesday night, approving the district's annual financial audit, and choosing seating for the soon-to-be constructed new auditorium. The Board also went into closed session for an hour and 20 minutes for deliberations during the meeting.

Trustees unanimously approved the district's 2016-17 financial audit as presented by Randall Terry and Ryan King, and approved TASB policy updates. Board members unanimously chose a bid from Indeco Sales Company of \$127,66 per chair for seating in the auditorium that will be constructed, with a total installed prize of \$45,957.60, over another bid from Lone Star Furnishings Company of \$165.83 per chair and total cost of \$59,699.

Trustees voted against using the services of GermBlast at the school district, with six of seven trustees voting against a motion

for the quoted price, and one member, Drew Stone, abstaining from voting.

Superintendent Alan Umholtz presented information to the Board regarding plans for construction of a restroom at the Tahoka ISD baseball/softball complex, noting that the school would be getting a bid quote from Toby Taylor.

Supt. Umholtz said he was very pleased that TISD had received a Superior rating on their accounting practices in the FIRST (Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas) Report.

TISD Administrators presented reports at the meeting, including A.D. Stephen Overstreet, who noted that the Cross Country teams did well, and that Natalie Stice would be signing with a college during Friday's pep rally. High School Principal Don Worth said that the school Community Service Day would again be held this year, on the Tuesday before Thanksgiving. Middle School Principal Kelly Kieth reported 135 students in middle school, and that the first school dance was held the previous weekend. Elementary Principal Christa Ritchey reported attendance is up, and that the elementary Fall Festival and book fair went well, as well as the school health fair.

Lynn County Commissioners get TxDOT road materials

Lynn County Commissioners met in routine session Monday morning, with all four commissioners present including Don Blair, Matt Woodley, John Hawthorne and Larry Durham, and County Judge Mike Braddock presiding.

Commissioners moved to accept TxDOT road supplement material for Precincts 1 and 3, and approved a resolution to approve the submission of a grant application for the Lynn County Sheriff's Dept. to the Office of the Governor, BG18 Rifle-Resistant Body Armor Grant Program.

Slate May was appointed by commissioners to the Lynn County Appraisal District Board, and monthly bills were approved.

Sheriff's Deputy Pete Vallejo presented a report on the Sheriff's Office, informing county officials that they would be advertising for a new jailer soon.

County Clerk Susan Tipton asked for a volunteer to help canvass the votes from the Nov. 7 Constitutional Amendment Election, and Commissioner Matt Woodley volunteered.

cost share was \$1500, and another \$1500 came from the city's general revenue fund, for the total bill of \$6753. Other monthly bills were also approved.

Tahoka Police Chief Miguel Reyna presented a report for the month of October, noting that the PD processed 98 calls during the month. ACT Board (Advancing the Community of Tahoka) president Julia Allen presented a brief report, noting that board member Abraham Vega was going to head up a ballpark project and coordinate with school officials on the project. She also reported a balance of \$231,941 in ACT funds,

which are collected from a half-cent sales tax in the city.

Juanell Jones, representing the Lynn County Harvest Festival, told city officials that the Harvest Festival Committee had recently voted unanimously to keep the festival at the city park for all future festivals, if city officials approved.

"We heard nothing but positive comments from citizens about having the Harvest Festival in the city park this year," Jones told the group. "We had to move the festival this year because of the courthouse grounds being unavailable during their renovation process, and it just went very well at the

park. Parents especially liked that the playground was there for children, and the layout of the booths worked well," she said during the public forum portion of the meeting. Council members agreed that future festivals could be held at the park, although it was not an official motion since the item was not on the agenda.

Three of four council members were present at the meeting, including Jolly, Martin and Box, and councilman Johnny Rosas was absent. Mayor John Baker led the meeting, with City Administrator Jerry Webster and others present.

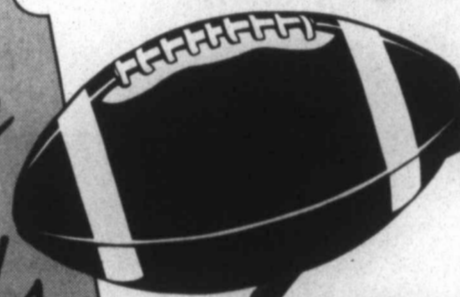
your Thanksgiving dinner.

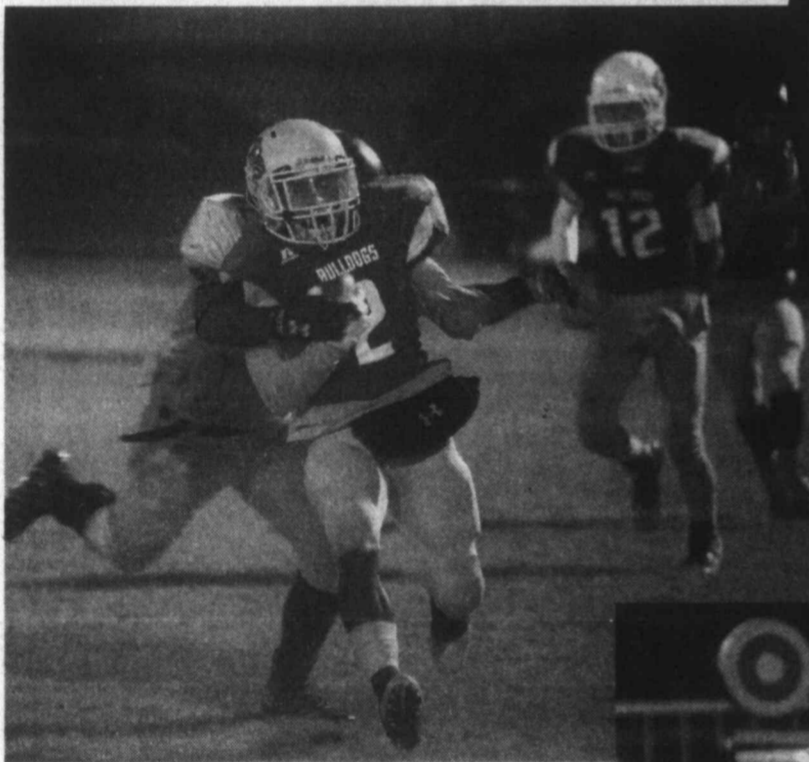

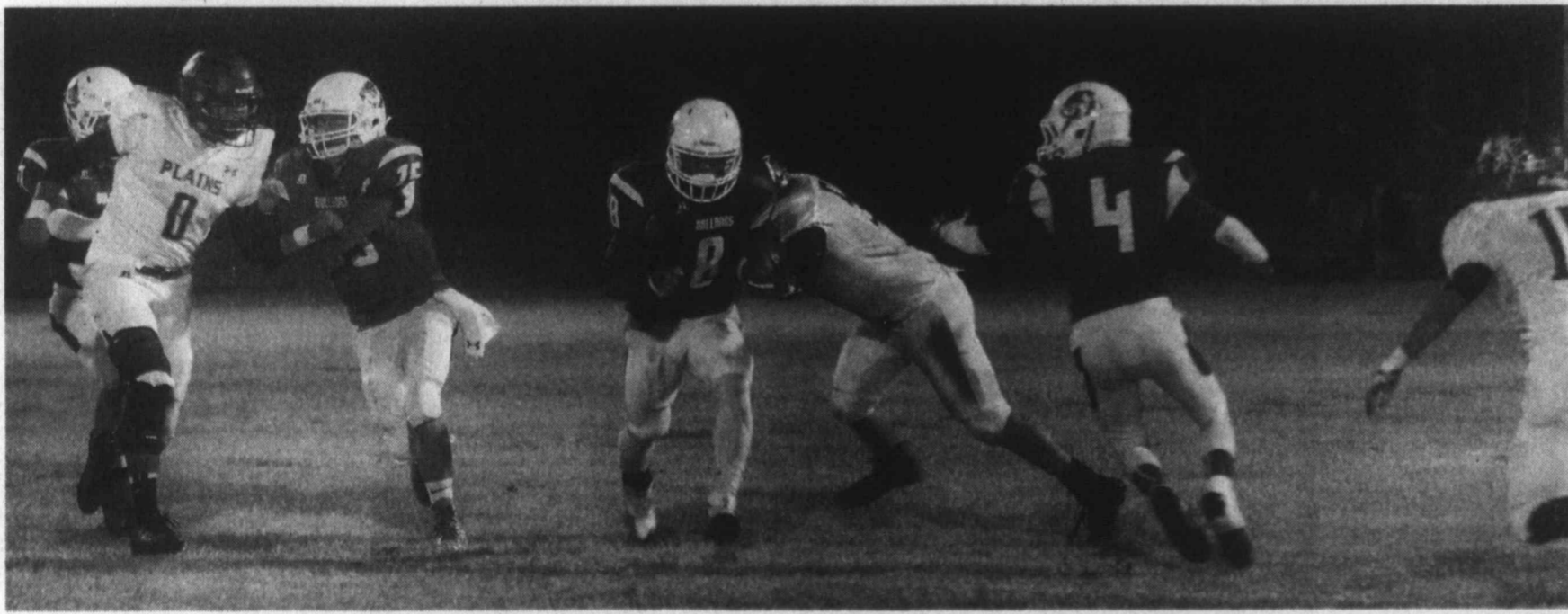
