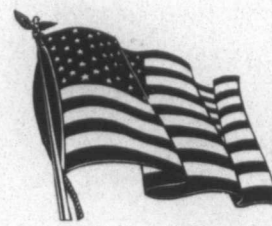

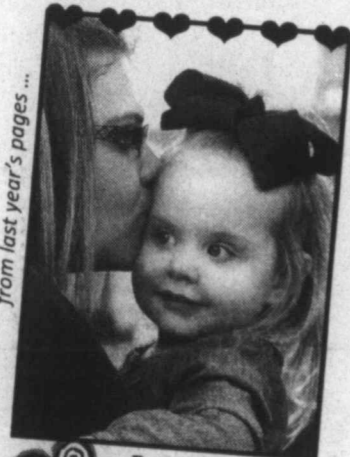

Commissioners approve county's financial audit

Lynn County Commissioners met in their first session of 2018 at 9 o'clock Monday morning, Jan. 8, approving the county's annual financial audit and discussing other details of county business.

Tyler Canady, representing the auditing firm of Bolinger, Segars, Gilbert & Moss, LLP, presented the 2016-17 financial audit to County Judge Mike Braddock and Commissioners Matt Woodley, John Hawthorne, Don Blair and Larry Durham, and other county officials present at the meeting, giving a "clean" opinion on the audit.

"Overall, I think you have great financial records, and your internal au-

ditor Brenda Wilson does a good job," Canady told the group when he finished going over the details of the audit.

Commissioners approved a bid from Guardian Security Solutions, LC for \$25,052 to reinstall existing security camera systems and add two new cameras during the courthouse renovation project, as well as installing the panic security system.

Sheriff Abraham Vega reported the current jail inmate count to the court, and noted that he has asked for a meeting with the Lynn County Animal Control Board to discuss the county animal shelter. Both the Animal Control Officer and her assistant have resigned their positions, with both job openings needing to be filled.

Fire, rollover, burglary in law reports this week

A fire in O'Donnell, a one-vehicle rollover, and a break-in at a county residence were in Sheriff's Office reports this week.

A fire was reported at Woolam Gin in O'Donnell at 2 a.m. Jan. 4, with O'Donnell Volunteer Fire Dept. responding to the scene. A damage report was not given.

A one-vehicle rollover occurred on US 87 just north of Tahoka near the FM 400 overpass at 6:29 a.m. Jan. 4. Driver of the Chevrolet Silverado was not identified on the call sheet, but no injuries were reported and EMS was not called to the scene.

Paul Harper called the Sheriff's Office at 4:34 a.m. Jan. 8 to report he had arrived home and discovered a break-in at his residence on County Road 20. A complete list of items reported stolen was not available, but did include a gun safe.

Tahoka Police arrested a 43-year-old man from Big Spring on charges of Driving While Intoxicated-2nd after stopping a 2012 Chevrolet Silverado at 3:48 a.m. Saturday on the US 87 Access Rd, just south of the FM 400 overpass.

Police reportedly observed the pickup truck traveling northbound on US 87 at 96 mph in a 75-mph zone before making the traffic stop. The driver was also issued citations for speeding, and for No Driver's License. He was transported to Lynn County Jail.

Police arrested a 34-year-old Lubbock man on charges of Public Intoxication on Wednesday, Jan. 3, after they were called to the scene of a domestic disturbance in the 2000 block of North 2nd Street in Tahoka.

Brenda Dotson reported theft of property Friday morning at 9:44 a.m., reporting theft of one of her campaign signs from the yard of a residence in the 2300 block of North 4th St.

Lynn County Jail held 44 inmates during the past week, including 15 for Ector County, 4 for Dawson, and 25 for Lynn County. Local charges included two for public intoxication, one for possession of dangerous drug, one for driving while intoxicated, two for possession of marijuana, and one for Application to Revoke Probation for Continuing Violence Against the Family.

Sheriff offers planning session for volunteer church security teams

Lynn County Sheriff Abraham Vega is reaching out to the churches in Lynn County, to offer an opportunity for volunteer church security teams to meet together in a planning session to discuss ways to keep their churches and congregations secure.

Pay property taxes by Jan. 31 or face additional interest fees

Lynn County property owners who have not yet paid their 2017 property taxes have just over two weeks left if they plan on getting by with no additional fees, interest or penalties tacked on their original bills.

January 31 is the deadline to pay property taxes. After that, the late payment fees, penalties and interest begin to add up quickly.

Those who wait until after Feb. 1 will pay an additional seven percent in penalties and interest. Every month following that, the penalties and interest go up by two percent through June when the penalty fee remains at 15 percent.

Property owners who want to pay their taxes in person have until 5 p.m. Wednesday, Jan. 31 to pay their taxes

(without additional interest) at the Lynn County Appraisal District office, located at 1615 Main Street in Tahoka. If paid by mail, taxes must be post-marked by Jan. 31 to avoid penalties.

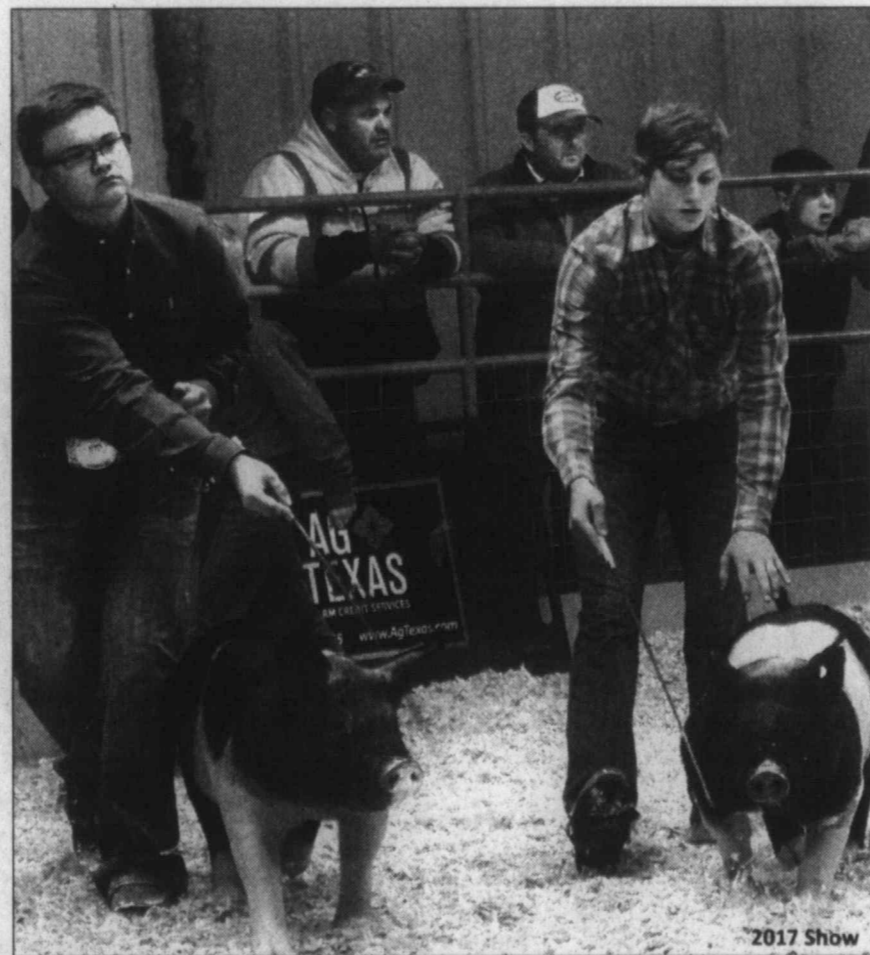
There is an option for homeowners over age 65 or disabled, to pay their taxes in four installments instead of a one-time full payment. To make the installment payments, the homeowner must notify the Appraisal District before the end of January, by phone or in person, of their intent to pay their tax bill in this method. The first payment is due by the end of January, with the other three payments due in March, May and July. For more information, contact the Appraisal Office at 806-561-5477.

336 animals entered in County Stock Show



Lynn County 4-H and FFA members are making last-minute preparations for the 80th Annual Lynn County Stock Show, which begins today (Thursday) at the county show barn. In this year's show, 150 exhibitors from all four schools in the county have entered 336 animals in the three-day event, including 231 barrows, 27 lambs, 39 steers, 20 goats, 14 pee wee goats and 5 mini Herefords.

Thursday's events (today) begin at 9:00 a.m. with the animal weigh-ins. Steer judging begins at 5:00 p.m., starting with the Miniature Hereford Show, followed by the Steer Show. After the Steer Show, the Pee Wee Goat Show will be followed by the Wether Goat Show, and conclude with Lamb judging.

Barrow judging begins at 9:00 a.m. Friday. The Pee Wee Barrow Show will begin after the barrow judging is concluded. All entries for baked goods must be in place from 9:00-10:00 a.m. Friday, with judging scheduled for 10:00 a.m.

Celebration to mark 40th year of the Sale Auction

While it is the 80th Annual County Stock Show, this year also marks the 40th annual Lynn County Livestock Sale Auction, and the Lynn County Livestock Association has scheduled a new venue just for this year's auction. Although the County Stock Show will be held as usual at the county showbarn, this year's Lynn County Stock Show Sale Auction will be held on Saturday, January 13, at the Cotton Creek Barn in New Home. A steak dinner will be served at 5 p.m., with the presentation of belt buckles and auction starting at 6 p.m.

Tickets for the meal are \$12 and can be purchased at the Lynn County Livestock Show, January 11-12, or at the door the night of the event.

"For the past 40 years, the Lynn County Livestock Show has rewarded Lynn County 4-H and FFA members for their hard work and accomplishments with the animal projects at the Annual County Livestock Show. To celebrate the 40th annual Auction, the Lynn County Livestock Show Board would like to invite everyone to attend a special night to celebrate the past and recognize our youth for their hard work," said a board member.

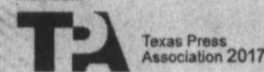

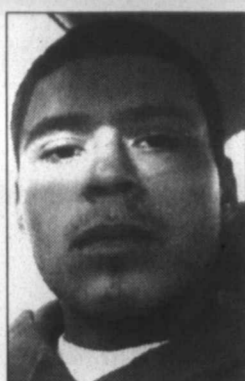

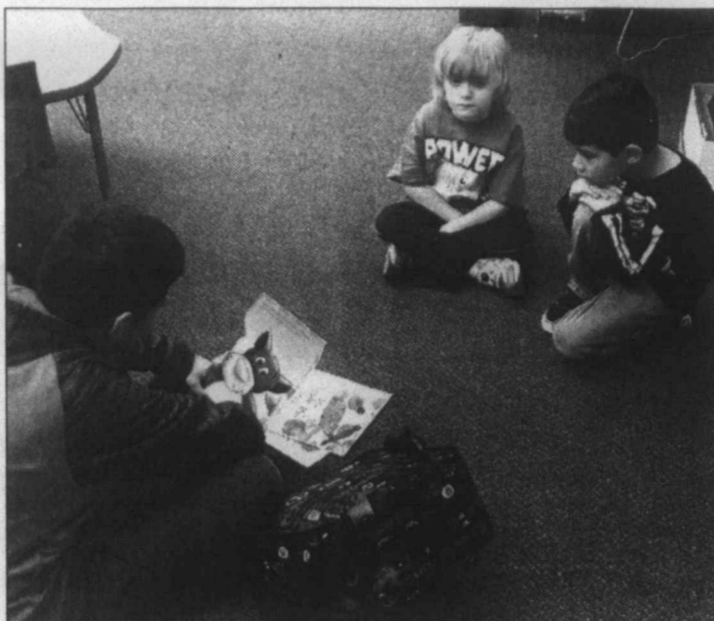

A Commitment to Obey

Psalm 1:1-6

Scripture proclaims God's great power and majesty while also revealing His deep mercy and love. He is worthy of wholehearted, passionate submission but doesn't often get it. Are you among the few who offer themselves to Him without reservation?

Complete obedience is a choice to follow God regardless of the consequences. This means that we obey the Lord even if our friends choose a different path or when suffering and embarrassment are guaranteed. Seeing His will done is more important than our own comfort or personal ambition. We commit the consequences to God and cling to His promises: He will never leave us (Deut. 31:6), and He makes good out of every situation (Rom. 8:28).

Notice the word commitment in the title of today's devotion. I'm not writing about obedience that is born of the moment (as in, I choose to follow God in this instance) but about total submission as a way of life. Setting restrictions on compliance is so tempting—we want to be able to change our mind when obeying upsets our lifestyle, the final result is unclear, or we're just plain scared. But let me ask you this one sobering question: If Jesus Christ is the Lord of your life, what right do you have to limit how and when you'll do His will?

Believers have no right to set their own limits; their one criterion for making decisions should be, What does God want me to do? The answer at times may cause suffering, but obedience is always right. And following God in all things is the surest path to favor and spiritual growth.

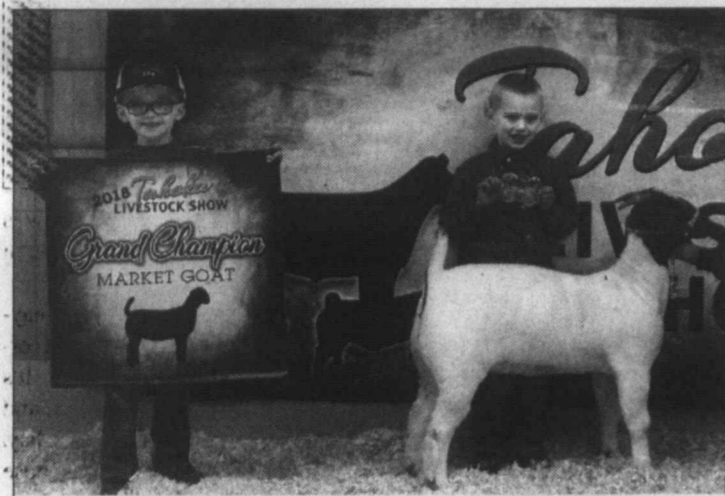

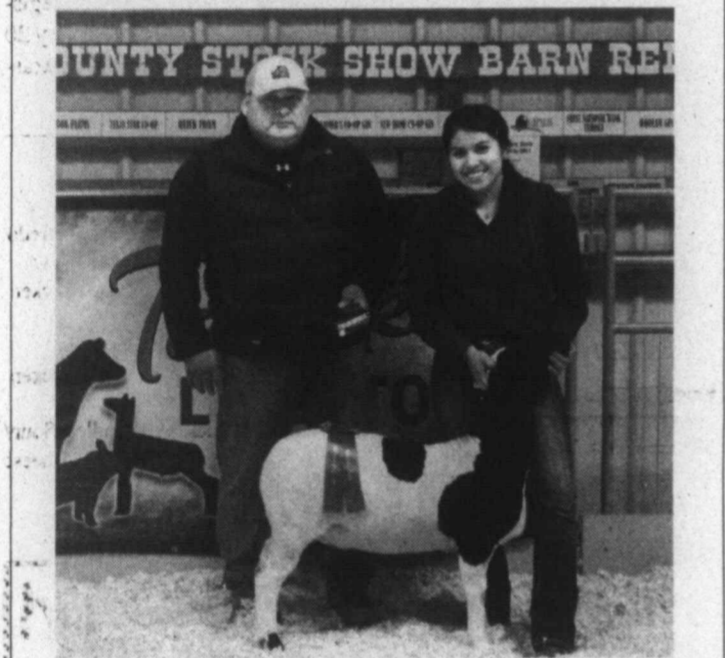

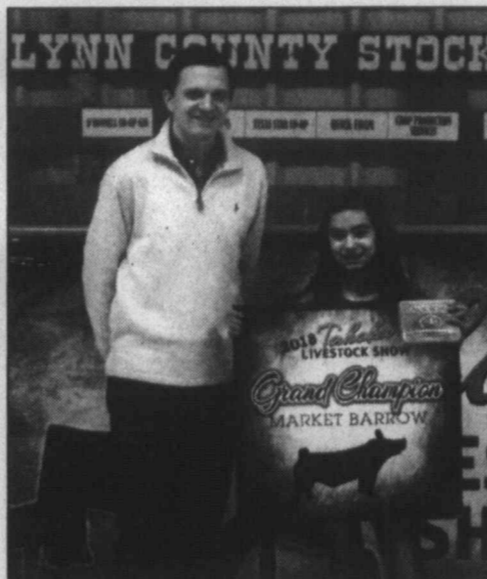

City Council discusses streets, animal control

Tahoka City Council met Monday night in regular session at 6 p.m., taking care of business in just over 30 minutes before adjourning. Mayor John Baker led the meeting, with council members Johnny Rosas,

Ronny Jolly, Casey McLelland and Ray Box present, and councilman Jeff Martin absent. City Administrator Jerry Webster, Police Chief Miguel Reyna, and others were present as well.

The council tabled any action on passing a resolution that would convert a portion of Texas State Highway Loop 472 south from US Hwy. 380 to US 87 from a state road to a city street, pending further information from TxDOT. It is anticipated that when the city does accept the street, the portion of

the street that cuts through the city square will be removed in conjunction with the courthouse renovation project, which would mean the street around the courthouse would become a true square again, with traffic routed one-way around the courthouse square.

Reports from the city engineer indicated that the city waterline replacement project is progressing well, and is actually slightly ahead of schedule.

Mayor Baker informed the council that the Lynn County Animal Control Officer and assistant had resigned, currently leaving the county animal shelter (which also accepts animals for the City of Tahoka) without official staff. City officials are to meet with other members of the Animal Control Board on Jan. 16 to discuss the issue. The Animal Control Board is comprised of two city officials from each of the four cities in the county, and the county judge.

Chief Reyna presented three amendments for the police department policy and procedures manual, to comply with changes in state regulations, which the council approved.

The mayor informed the council that ACT Board (Advancing the Community of Tahoka) member Dee Dee Pridmore has informed the city that when her term ends on Jan. 31 she will not seek reappointment to the board, which means the council would need to consider a new appointment to the board. Two other ACT Board members, Julia Allen and Abraham Vega, also have terms expiring at the end of January. Both have indicated that they would accept reappointment to the board. Monthly bills were approved as presented.

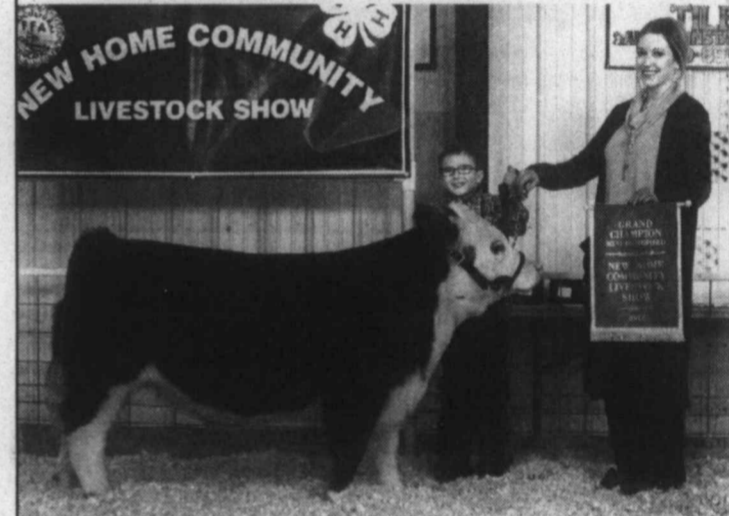

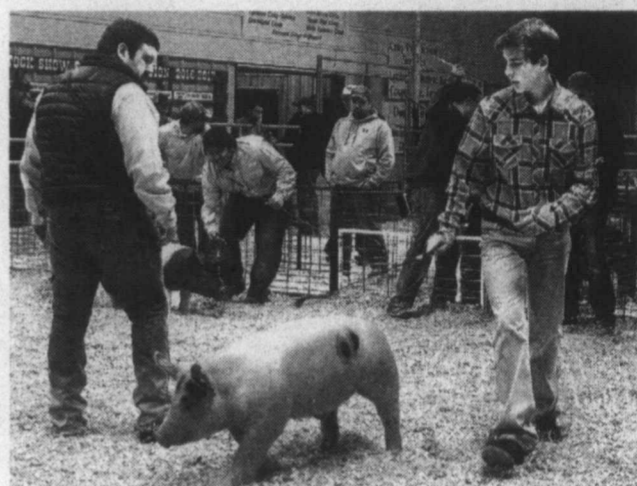

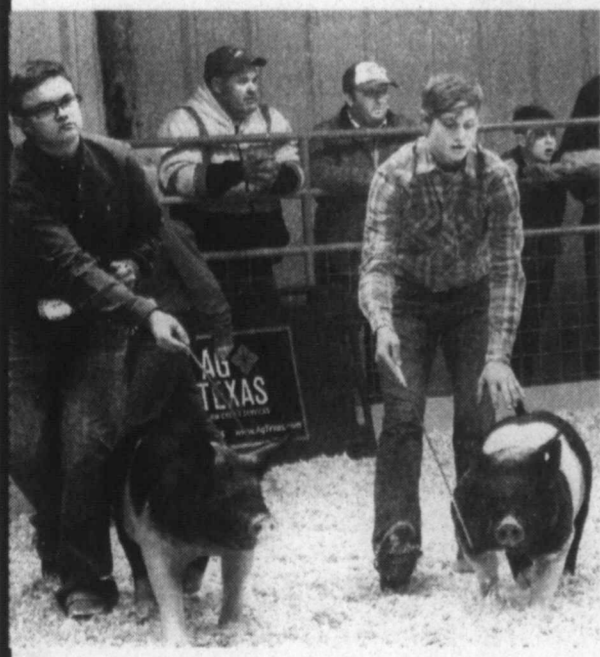
