# **Tahoka Economic Dev. Board, City Council** approve \$50,000 for Sr. Citizens building

"We are very pleased that the Taho-

he Lynn County Senior Citizens building fund is getting a huge boost of \$50,000 in funds from the Tahoka Economic Development Board, which with the \$42,568 already in the fund puts them at \$92,568 - just \$17,432 short of the full \$110,000 project to remodel the former Tahoka City Hall on Lockwood Street into new facilities for the Senior Center. Tahoka City Council approved the expenditure from the half-cent sales tax collected by the Tahoka Economic Development Board, upon the recommendation of the Board. The funding is contingent upon a financial audit being performed for the Senior Center's previous year of operation and a clear audit being presented to the board.

# Dog attacks 12-year-old girl as she enters grocery store

A 12-year-old girl was attacked by a female Rottweilermix breed dog as she attempted to enter Thriftway Grocery store in Tahoka about 7:15 p.m. Monday night. The girl, daughter of Mindy Tejeda of Tahoka, had ridden her bike to the store, and two dogs came upon her as she was attempting to go into the store. The Rottweiler dog reportedly grabbed the girl by her arm, and store employees who witnessed the attack ran outside with a grocery cart, ramming it into the dog to force it to let go of the terrified little girl, according to a report by City Animal Control Director Lee Mary Rodriguez.

After the employees were able to bring the girl inside and called 9-1-1 and her mother, EMS arrived at the scene to examine her injuries. According to Rodriguez, the girl's mother said that there were teeth marks that barely broke the skin, and she was not transported to the hospital for any treatment at that time

The owner of the two dogs was reported to be Jessica Liendo, whom Rodriguez said had been ticketed previously for the dogs running loose. Animal Control confiscated the Rottweiler and will quarantine it for 10 days, as required by law for dog bites to determine if rabies is a factor. Rodriguez said the dog has been deemed "dangerous" and the owner would have to pay heavy fines and comply with regulations regarding "dangerous" dogs if the owner chooses to get the dog back.

A woman driving a 2013 Dodge Durango on US 87 hit debris on the road at 6 p.m. last Tuesday, causing damage to the front end of her vehicle and two blowouts as she ended up in a field next to the highway. The driver, Amanda Johnston of Lubbock, was reportedly not injured. She had been driving northbound on US 87 just north of FM 1317 when her vehicle struck the debris in the road, jamming up underneath her vehicle and causing two tires to blow out. Timothy Weatherspoon of Midland was the driver of a 1990 Mazda that caught on fire while he was driving northbound on US 87 about 6 miles

south of Tahoka at 6:54 p.m. Friday. Tahoka Volunteer Fire Dept. responded to the scene, and Lynn County EMS transported the driver for treatment of unknown injuries.

Another accident occurred at 12:02 p.m. Friday at FM 1054 and US 380, where a van reportedly struck a car and knocked off a side mirror and causing dents. No information on the vehicles or drivers was available from the Sheriff's Office call sheet.

In 106th District Court proceedings held June 12, District Judge Carter T. Schildknecht sentenced Francisco Raul Aguilar, 33, to Deferred Adjudication of Guilt Community Supervision term of 5 years, plus a \$1000 fine and court costs. Aguilar pled guilty to third degree charges of Injury to a Child/Elderly Individual or Disabled Individual that occurred on March 18, 2018.

Tahoka Police arrested a 31-year-old Tahoka woman on charges of Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle Saturday morning about 9:20 a.m. The woman reportedly drove a white Ford pickup off of property at 1329 Lockwood Street without the owner's consent, and Tahoka Police were still at the scene investigating when she drove the pickup back onto the property. She was arrested at the scene.







The Tahoka Economic Development Board, formerly known as the ACT Board, met with four members present on Thursday, June 7, at 5:15 p.m. in City Hall. Gary Jones, Carmen Chapa, Joe Craig and Bill Schoemann all attended the meeting with City Administrator Jerry Webster serving as the Executive Director. Absent were Tim Pledger and Julia Allen

The Board reviewed and approved minutes from previous meeting as well as the financial status report. In actionable items, the board approved to enter into a contract (with

cerning the possibility of a recycling center be located on FM 400 where the City currently owns 300 acres and is occupied by the Tahoka Landfill. Joe Craig explained he did not think it would be economically feasible to have in Tahoka due

to small city/county population and the amount of waste currently going into the landfill. Craig explained that it is cheaper to bury it verses trying to recycle it. Environmentally, it is the right thing to do to recycle, but economically, it is not. The board discussed signage being returned on buildings downtown but no clear place had been decided as to where to place the signs. The board invites and thanks all citizens who attend the meetings and any citizen with a business idea that would economically benefit the community is encouraged to present their idea to the board for consideration or assistance.

## Warren Taylor is champion in PGA tourney held here







While outdoors, people should drink plenty of water and take breaks. in shaded or air-conditioned areas," said Keith Rhodes, chief executive officer, American Red Cross North Texas Region. "Heat waves may also cause power outages. If affected, resi-

#### Symptoms Of Heat Related Emergencies -Heat-related symptoms can include:

- Cool, moist, pale or flushed skin
- Heavy sweating
- Headache
- Nausea or vomiting
- Dizziness or loss of consciousness
- Weakness

What To Do - If you see someone suffering from heat stress, follow these steps:

1. If losing consciousness or vomiting, immediately call 9-1-1

- 2. Relocate to an air conditioned or shaded area
  - 3. Slowly drink cool water

4. Apply ice or cold towels to head, neck, groin, wrists, ankles and underarms
