## Stamford Lake Site Approved

A dam on Deadman's creek to create a source of water for the city of Stamford has been approved by the city council of that city and engineers instructed to seek approval of the State Board of Water Engineers on the location.

Some time ago Stamford city officials authorized the engineering firm of Freese and Nichols to make a survey of potential sources of supply. Their report was made a few weeks ago and included a detailed study of the entire problem.

Six different sources were investigated and a complete report on each made. These included the Clear Fork of the Brazos, the drilling of wells in the Haskell-Rule area, piping of water from the Fort Phantom Hill reservoir, a dam on Paint Creek and a dam on Cottonwood. Costs in each instance were estimated, together with the type and amount of water that would be available.

The home of Mrs. W. W. Clark near the south county line and a short distance north of Stamford, was destroyed by fire early Sunday morning after the structure was hit by lightning during a rain-storm. The house and all contents were a total loss.

Equipment received included power hack saws, motor tester (analyzer), tool cabinets and shop tools.
