

#### HEAVY RAIN FELL WEDNERDAY MORNING.

Railroad Track Under Water South of River-Creeks Higher than for Years-Tanks Washed Out.

A splendid rain fell at Cotulla and surrounding country Wednesday morning, beginning at 7:30 o'clock and continuing for almost two hours, the fall totaling 1.35 inches.

The cloud came up from the Southwest. There was no wind but vivid lightning and heavy thunder. The heaviest part of the rain seemed to have fallen just South of town and extended in a narrow strip southwest and northeast. Between Cotulla and Tuna the railroad track was under water in several places; creeks were higher than they have been for many years and tanks were washed out on Childers' ranch. Along the I. & G. N. the rain extended from Millett to Atlee. Encinal reported an inch rain Wednesday night.

No damage was done to the onion crop; growers say it will be benefitted. Crops on the dry land farms are making rapid growth.

BEST WAY TO SET POSTS.

After many years' experience, have concluded by placing the small end of the post in the ground. A post will last much longer than with the large end down. The reason for this is obvious. When limbs are off it always leaves a cut that holds more or less water and where worms have worked, the holes are always lownward. These poles hold some noisture but by placing the top end down this moisture runs out and leaves the post dry.

At first thought it looks as though the post with the large end up would not make a good appearance. lowever, says an expert in Farm and lome, I have generally found that he large end is the straight end, and frequently there is a crook at the small end. If this be placed in the round, the fence when completed boks much better. I also have found hat small posts for wire fence last nger than large ones, for they do ot hold moisture as long. A post ould never be reset until it is well asoned. The end posts should alays be placed in concrete; then need be no bracing or anchors


