

The face of curbing from surface or wearing coat to top of gutters shall receive a wash of ement mortar, same proportion above mentioned, filling all voids and uneven places, leaving this part of curbing smooth and true to line.

The cement to be used to be of good Portland cement and shall stand a test of not less than 500 pounds tensile strain per square inch 7 days after sample has been made, six days of which time sale sample to be kept under water.

The 1 inch topping or wearing surface to be put on the four inches of concrete immediately after the concrete has been put in place and before said concrete has had time to set.

All cements to be used in the construction of sidewalks and curbing may be inspected by the engineer appointed by the City Council, and sample of same taken for the purpose of testing at least 7 days before the same is used in construction of said work. It shall be housed in a convenient and dry place, and, if required to have the inspector's stamp plainly marked on each package.

Section 2. The City Council may, by Ordinance, order and compel the laying and construction of sidewalks by property owners in front of or abutting on their land after giving notice to the owner or owners or agents of said property, said notice to be signed by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk. When the owner or agents are unknown, such notice shall be served by publication in some newspaper published in the town of Cotulla, once each week for four successive weeks. The cost of said publication to be a charge against the property of such unknown owners in front of which such sidewalks are ordered to be constructed shall be completed within 60 days from the service of notice to construct sidewalks hereinbefore ordered to be constructed within 30 days from service of notice. 





This is a good price when one considers that in spite of the drouth last year in West Texas many farmers raised kaffir-corn in such abundance that they sold it as low as fifty and sixty centy per one hundred pounds.

Kaffir-corn is now being manufactured into several different kinds of food for human consumption, which are meeting with favor. The Produce Exchange at Chicago and other points now quote prices on kaffir-corn. The only moral to this: Plant more Kaffir-corn.




