FAULT OF THE PEOPLE.
Harvey C. Stiles, a gentleman of international reputation as a horticulturist, was in Cotulla this
week and incidentally took a week and incidentally took a
stroll in the residence distriet of stroll in the residence district of our town, and later in an interview given the Record expressed
much surprise that he found but few beautiful yards and the almost total absence of tree culture. To use his exact language which is plain and to the point; "As a matter of fact, I bel'eve your town is the most barren of that particular evidence of culture and refinement of any town I have seen in Texas.'
Those words from a man knows should make us mit up and take notice. We endeavor to excuse ourselves on account of the brackish water of our shallow wells, (the only kind at present available) but Mr. Stiles says this is no excuse as there are a number of varieties that will thrive with the water we have, to which appears in this issue, to which appears in this issue,

varities. One is the date palma tree of both beauty and fruit, and we have evidence that this tree will do well. He examined the soil here and says it is ideal for the growth of the pecan and the climatic conditions that are now being grown are not adding value to the land, but he says every five year old pecan tree is worth one hundred dollars, and if farmers would begin putting out pecan groves now in a few years time their property would be very valuable. Mr. Stiles says it may be that a few have tried pecans without that a man versed in tree cause ture could easily overcome, and those parties should not be discouraged, but first get a little more knowledge in the growing
of trees and then make another of trees and then make another effort. Mr. Stiles says he will stake his reputation that pecans
will thrive anywhere along the Nueces, and urges the farmer to plant them if he wants to make his land valuable.

The citrus fruit crop of Southern California was damaged by the freeze this week to the ex
tent of many millions of dollars It has been placed as high as forty millions, and the lowest entimates are twenty-five millions. Ninety per cent of the crop was destroyed. This is a ter
rible blow to the growers and one from which it will take years to recover. The mercury went down to below 18, severa degrees lower than was recorded in Southwest Texas, where prac tically no damage was done by the cold.
