

LOCATION OF APIARY.

A correspondent asks me to give nim the name of some favored locaion where he can engage in the bee business to advantage. To reply to this one is reminded of the sailor who asked the ship captain where might go to get a good swim. There is hardly a spot in this whole part of Texas that is not peculiarly favored by nature as the home of the honey bee. Of course, some loca-tions are better than others and, while we can practically pick and choose, we should know what really constitutes a good location. The first essential is water. There

must be a constant and unfailing sup-ply of water at all times available for bees. Open tanks in this locality is the best source of supply next to a running stream. Should the water dry up, the keeper must remember to at once provide a substitute supply. This is the best done by placing a barrel near the apiary and keeping at twell filled. Plank or chip "floaters" should be provided to prevent drowning.


