MILLIONS FROM TEXAS SOIL.

Fort Worth, Texas, Jan. -The gross wealth of Texas increased approximately \$1,057-239,500 during the year 1912, according to statistics complied by the Texas Commercial Secretaries and Business Men's Association. Agriculture was the leading industry in Texas and through this channel \$699,842-500 was added to the state's wealth. Foreign capital ranks second with a total of \$180,940-000; value added by process of manufacture \$156,040,000; minerals \$18,755,000 and fish and oysters follow last with \$1,012-000. The following table shows the gross wealth increase for the past year by months. The month of October shows the largest increase in wealth due to the fact that during that period 1,697-427 bales of cotton were ginned, representing a total value of \$127,312,500 for the seed and lint. January was the smailest month in increased wealth with a total of \$39,953,500. For the entire year, cotton leads all other farm products with a value of \$365,250,000. while corn comes second with a total of \$98,113-000. Livestock is also an important factor in this division with a total production of \$65-000,000, while the products of the forest reach the high figure of \$32,400,000.



## **GOLD EYE MOVES FREELY**

Gold Ball Put in So That Muscles Usual Functions.

Philadelphia, Jan. 14.-His left eye replaced with a gold ball, an arti-ficial eye, which he moves with per-fect freedom and control, little sixyear old Alexander Calevitch attracted much attention when he was ex hibited today at a meeting of the Ophthalmic Society by Dr. Samuel D.

Risley. The unusually successful substitution of an artificial eye was the final of a series of treatments administered by Dr. Risley since the child came under his care about three months ago. The boy was struck in the eye with a piece of wood on October 13, the doctor said, and was brought to him for treatment.

Splinters were removed from the injured eye, leaving the sight considerably impaired. Shortly after the sight of the other eye began to fail through sympathetic irritation. In order to save the sight of the uninjured organ, Dr. Risley removed the ball in such a manner that the mus-cles of the eye are permitted to function as freely as before. When an artificial eye was placed over the new eyeball the child could use it so perfectly that its artificiality could not be detected without close examination.

## LOSS ON ORANGE CROP MAY BE \$50,000,000

in California-Lemons Also Suffer.

Los Angeles, Jan. 14.—Every acre of oranges and lemons from San Bernardino to Los Angeles has been frozen was the report that came tonight from Pomona, centre of one of the heaviest producing sections of the citrus fruit belt. Only a fifth of the Reports received from all parts of fruit crop may be salvaged, it was asserted. If this be true, the total xpecta-These loss on 150,000 acres of fruit will amount close to \$40,000,000. More conservative estimates, however, figured the total damage at \$20,000,-000. Between \$5,000,000 and \$8,-000,000 of this sum will be the loss to railroads in curtailed freight receipts. The weather bureau issued a bulletin tonight that the worst of the cold wave had passed.

According to growers, a sudden re-turn to the warmth of normal winter conditions would irreparably damage fruit which might be still in such condition that a gradual rise of temperature would leave it in mark-etable shape. This additional loss would mean practically the ruin of

Last year's crop netted the growers \$35,000,000. Eleven millions went to the railroads in freight and refrigerator charges. At the begin-ning of the season this year's erop value was estimated at \$50,000,000 Actual losses to both growers and railroads, however, will be dependent to a certain extent on the attitude of overnment toward the shipment of slightly damaged fruit.



This is \$500 per acre. And the man who bought such a grove at that price would also make a magnificent investment; one certain to double in value twice more next 15 years.


