## COURT BESEIGED BY TRAPPERS.

Temple of Justice Had Appearance of Great Hide Houses Monday.

Monday and Tuesday the Commissioners' Court was besieged by trappers, each having numerous coyote and wild cat scalps, for which they desired to exchange for the real coin, as provided for in the wild animal bounty act passed by the last legislature.

The trapper must bring the entire hide of the animal, and it is the Court's duty to "officially mark" it so that there is no danger of it being counted again. Monday nearly five hundred hides were brought in and stacked in the hallway for checking and marking. Tuesday about a hundred more came in. The total number paid for by the court was 427 coyote scalps and 162 wild cats.

## Compulsory Education Bill



Jno. W. Woods

Austin, Texas, Feb.—Hon. Jno. W. Woods, representing the 121st District in the Lower House, has introduced a bill providing for compulsory education of children between the ages of 8 and 14 years. The Legislature is giving preferred attention to educational matters and some of the strongest members of the Legislature are on the committees dealing with educational subjects.

Many interesting statistics and instructive comparisons have been presented by Mr. Woods, who is authority on educational matters as well as an earnest friend of the children. Only 65 per cent of our scholastic population is enrolled in school, and the average schooling now received by each child in Texas is 55 days per annum. The bill provides one hundred and twenty days schooling per annum for each child, but school trustees are permitted to reduce the compulsory attendance to 72 days if they see proper. In California the average number of days schooling each child receives is 97 and the expenditure per capita of average attendance is \$59.01 against \$18.55 in Texas. The passage of the bill will result in practically doubling the school attendance in this State.

## Women "Appeal To Reason"

Austin, Texas, Feb.—Mrs. Hortense Ward of Houston is asking the Legislature to pass a law giving married women contractual rights. The proposed measure has the endorsement of the Texas Federation of Women's Clubs. Similar legislation has been placed on the statute books of many States. The Texas homestead law was the first of its kind in the world and was enacted primarily to protect wives against the business recklessness of husbands, and the women now ask that the principle involved be expanded and extended to all property.

There are other important measures before the legislature of exclusive interest to women. A bill granting the right of suffrage to women has a favorable committee report in the House, and the struggle for the keys to the women's suffrage is exclusively theirs.

The women do not lobby; they "appeal to reason," but they are much more successful in promoting legislation than men. This session of the Legislature has witnessed more women appearing before committees than that of any assembly in the history of Texas law making.

**SAN ANTONIO TO THE FRONT**

When settlements in Texas were few and far between, San Antonio was the great market for the big ranches that dotted the country for 100 and 200 miles in every direction. Few Texans are aware of the fact that San Antonio, always known as a health resort, is a busy manufacturing center, and chief among these industrial plants it has in its midst is one of the largest food product manufacturing concerns in the United States.  
The San Antonio Macaroni Factory. This modern industrial plant, one of San Antonio's proudest boasts, justly lays claim to its well-known slogan, "Where Cleanliness is Climax," for various and well-founded reasons. Situated on South Flores street, away from the noise and the grime of the business district, there stands a large white brick building, architecturally inviting and pleasing to the eye, within whose confines there are produced those famous edibles of Italian origin, Macaroni, Spaghetti, Vermicelli, as well as Egg Noodles of every description, and also the famous "Chillimac," the flavor of which carries one's memory back to the witchery of the Spanish art of cooking wherein they excelled in blending the chili pepper with cereals and meats.  
Entering the plant, the cordial invitation, a placard on the wall, urges you to inspect the factory and witness the numerous processes required to produce the finished article. Most forcibly you will be impressed with the immaculate cleanliness of the floors, the white painted walls, the large, airy, screened windows everywhere, and, most agreeably of all, the presence throughout of pure, balmy San Antonio ozone that circulates unrestrained in all parts of the building. Truly, money and science have not been used sparingly here to reach the apex of sanitary perfection.  
Under the guidance of the superintendent of the factory, you are first shown the giant mixing machine, where the finest hard winter wheat, together with pure artesian water, is mixed with other ingredients to make the plastic dough; from this machine the mixture is carried to the kneader, a large circular steel tub in which there revolve impense round triangular discs that knead the mass into shape. These shapes are then transferred to the great steam presses, of which there are two double and two single presses. Through these presses, untouched by human hands, the dough mixture is put in one end and comes forth at the other in the form of delicious Macaroni, Spaghetti, Vermicelli or Noodles as the case may be.  
After this process, the Macaroni and Spaghetti are strung on four-foot sticks and these sticks are then carried out by workmen to the drying racks, where the pure air circulates freely. These racks are out in the open, protected by screens. In case of inclement weather, these racks can be emptied in quick time and the products transferred to any one of the immense dry rooms, of which there are eight. These dry rooms are constantly stored to a capacity of 5000 pounds of Macaroni, Spaghetti, Vermicelli and Noodles each. All these products are air-dried, with the exception of Vermicelli, which is kiln-dried, and for which purpose there is a special room.  
One of the modern innovations of this great plant is a narrow-gauge railway system which runs to every part of the building. By it the materials are brought from the stock rooms to the mixing machines, thence from there to the kneading apparatus from where the journey continues to the steam presses. The finished products are then carried by rail to the drying rooms and from the drying rooms to the packing department, whence it is finally conveyed by rail to the shipping department and through to the very doors of freight cars on the siding outside the building. This interior railway was installed at a great expense, but it has justified the outlay by reason of the expeditious sanitary manner in which the products are transported from the raw material to the dining tables of the people in the great Southwest.

### DAY IN JAIL EVADED BY MISSOURI EDITOR

W. R. Nelson of Kansas City Adjudged in Contempt—Takes Case to Higher Court.

Kansas City, Mo., Feb. 11.—An appeal to the Court of Appeals on a habeas corpus writ is all that kept William R. Nelson, owner of the Kansas City Star, and multimillionaire, out of jail. Nelson was found guilty of contempt of court and sentenced to one day in jail by Judge J. A. Guthrie of the Circuit Court for publishing an article in his newspaper, which Judge Guthrie decided was a "sneer at the courts, at the judges and at legal procedure."

Nelson's defense was thrown out at the hearing. The article in question first told about an incident in Judge Guthrie's court during a divorce trial, and then about another case in which "the judge" had asked advice of an interested lawyer, and entered his decision accordingly. This incident, however, did not happen in Judge Guthrie's court, and Nelson contended that the words "the judge" did not refer to Guthrie. Guthrie admitted he had decided Nelson's case before the hearing.

### LIMIT PRESIDENTS TO 6 YEAR TERMS

SENATORS ADOPT RESOLUTION TO CHANGE CONSTITUTION.

But One Democrat Votes Against Amendment, Which Goes to House—Capital News.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 11.—By a vote of 47 to 23—one more than the necessary two-thirds—the Senate has adopted the resolution for an amendment to the Constitution providing for a single six-year presidential term.

Although it was expected the vote would be close, the friends of the single-term idea were surprised by their victory. Before the final roll was called they had conceded defeat. Three or four Republican Senators, whose support was not expected, saved the day.

Following is the text of the resolution as adopted:

The executive power shall be vested in a President of the United States of America. The term of office of President shall be six years, and no person who has held the office by election or discharged its powers or duties or acted as President under the Constitution and laws made in pursuance thereof, shall be eligible to again hold office by election.

Senator Shively of Indiana was the only Democrat to vote against the resolution. He based his opposition on the six-year provision, contending that a case might arise where a had President would hold office and that there ought to be opportunity to get rid of him at least at the end of four years.

The single term question then went to the House.

### 20,000,000 STAMPS LOST

Portrayed San Pedro Miguel as "Gatun Locks" in San Francisco Exposition Issue.

Washington, D. C., Feb. 11.—More than 20,000,000 2-cent stamps of the Panama Exposition series have been destroyed by the postoffice department because of an error in the printing.

All the stamps bore the inscription "San Pedro Miguel," but the beautiful view set forth represented San Miguel. The department, not wishing to subject itself to criticism, ordered the entire issue destroyed. The error on the die will be corrected, new plates made and a fresh supply printed. It is doubtful if one of the wrongly printed stamps ever reaches the public.

The new issue will bear the inscription "Panama Canal." Never before has so vast a quantity of stamps of a single type been destroyed, especially one that had never been issued.

The 1, 5 and 10 cent stamps commemorating the exposition were placed on sale January 1, but the set is yet incomplete, because of the mistake in printing those of 2-cent value.

Minister Who Becomes Undertaker Will Seek to Dispel Gloom.

San Francisco, Cal., Feb. 11.—The Rev. Dr. Bradford Lovitt has resigned his pastorate of the First Unitarian Church to become an undertaker. He announced he had been compelled to abandon the ministry on account of weak eyes and that he was entering the undertaking business in the hope of "dispelling its atmosphere of superstition and gloom, which we have inherited from the heartless and sometimes heathen methods and ideas of the past."

### GIRLS SOLD AT AUCTION BY SLAVERS

Loathsome as the Traffic Is, Investigators Declare That National Attention Is Only Solution of Problem.

NEW YORK, Feb. 11.—Recent revelations concerning the most horrible maelstrom of modern civilization—white slavery, show that innocent girls in all parts of the country are still falling victims to the vile traffic. This is in spite of the efforts of investigators, law officers and government agents. The investigators warmly endorse the recent announcement plan of John D. Rockefeller Jr., to combat white slavery with money, but it is also declared that the United States government should take more radical steps, not only to check, but to end the evil.

What One Authority Says. "At least 2000 white slaves are brought into this country every year" is the assertion of General Theodore A. Bingham, U. S. A., former police commissioner of this city. "They are brought in like cattle and disposed of for money like cattle. They are enticed from their homes. This does not mean by any means especially girls from little towns, are not drawn into the underworld by processes of deception practically identical to those used in Europe."

Loathsome as the white slaver traffic is in the minds of upright men and women, those who have studied it contend that it should not be ignored for this reason, because in its spread it is reaching everywhere and has become a matter warranting grave national concern. The chain of men and women trafficking in white slaves has its largest centers in New York and Chicago. They also operate freely in San Francisco and Los Angeles, Cal., Seattle, Wash., Nome, Alaska, Denver, Col., Omaha, Neb., and New Orleans, La., as well as in smaller cities. While unfortunate girls are being brought into the United States from other countries, American girls are being lured to the big cities and there drawn into the clutches of the "gray hawk" or are being tempted to downfall when facing want, as a result of low wages in the cities.

Girls Sold at Auction. Samuel H. London of El Paso, Texas, who for seven years has been studying the white slave traffic from Alaska to the Panama Canal Zone and from the Atlantic to the Pacific Ocean, tells how girls are sold at auction in New York by white slave traffickers. The brutes who gain control of these women, he declares, make \$570,000,000 a year.

In the back room of a cafe in the lower East Side London says he saw a crowd of men gathered around an auctioneer, who conducted his sale just as he would an ordinary auction of horses. These auctions are conducted late at night and have been continued for a period of more than two years.

"No girl in any class is safe. You have but to take notable disappearances like the Dorothy Arnold case," declared London.

Learn Slavers' Code. "I have a code of the white slavers by which agents in one city report the escape of a white slave in another. If she rebels against her master she is forced to submit. I have known of girls who have broken away from men in this city and have gone into another city. The code was used for telegrams just as in every other business and flashed from city to city. The headquarters for commercialized vice have their agents on the lookout. And the girl is eventually found and terribly maltreated. It is easier to escape the police than these vigilant agents."

London was aided in his work in New York by a special agent of the Department of Justice, and a report was made by the agent to the Department at Washington more than a year ago.

"White slavery is carried on in New York on a much larger scale than any other place in the world," said London. "There are 25,000 white slave captives in the city of New York, against 37,000 in all other parts of the country. White slavers here are more fearless than in any other place, because they are able to 'connect' with the ward politician. Ninety-five per cent of the girls who disappear in New York are taken captive by white slavers."

"If the people at large knew the real condition they would be horrified. The few trust has agents working in all the sweatshops. There it is easy to pick out the best looking girls, because of the hard conditions under which the girls work."

### TOWN NEVER TURNS LIGHT OUT

Cheaper to Let Natural Gas Burn Throughout Day. Augusta, Kan., Feb. 11.—The natural gas street lights in Augusta never are turned out.

"We find it cheaper," explained Mayor Ed Weidlein, "to let them burn than to pay a man \$20 a month to turn them out every morning and light them again at night."

"The only trouble we have with gas," explained the mayor, "is keeping the pressure from blowing the mantels to pieces."

In the panic year Allen lost faith in the banks and to be sure and keep his money safe, buried it in his pasture.

A few days later he was seriously injured in a runaway accident, and as a result lost his memory as far as the resting place of the money other concerned. He could remember other incidents in his past life, but could not tell in what part of his place the money was hidden.

While Allen was hitching up one of his mules the other day, the animal suddenly kicked him on the side of the head, and for some time Allen was unconscious.

He was sent to a Kansas City hospital for treatment, and the physicians removed a piece of his skull. ### NEW GUN FIRES 652 SHOTS

File of Men Can Discharge as Many Bullets as Whole Company With Rifles.

New Haven, Conn., Feb. 11.—A special order of 500 rifles of a new model has been ordered here by the United States government. They are automatic, and will discharge 652 shots a minute.

The new gun, although a little heavier than an ordinary rifle, will be used as a field gun, the operator lying on the ground and supporting the front of the gun on a little tripod. Thirty bullets can be fired in the fraction of a second, another magazine can be adjusted in a fraction of a second, and these successively discharged until the record of 652 is obtained. Novices have fired 500 bullets a minute.

This rifle will enable a single file of soldiers to do the work of an ordinary company with the old gun. The force of the projectile is a trifle greater than that of the latest other rifles. The government order is a little more than half filled already.

### LIMIT PRESIDENTS TO 6 YEAR TERMS

SENATORS ADOPT RESOLUTION TO CHANGE CONSTITUTION.

But One Democrat Votes Against Amendment, Which Goes to House—Capital News.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 11.—By a vote of 47 to 23—one more than the necessary two-thirds—the Senate has adopted the resolution for an amendment to the Constitution providing for a single six-year presidential term.

Although it was expected the vote would be close, the friends of the single-term idea were surprised by their victory. Before the final roll was called they had conceded defeat. Three or four Republican Senators, whose support was not expected, saved the day.

Following is the text of the resolution as adopted:

The executive power shall be vested in a President of the United States of America. The term of office of President shall be six years, and no person who has held the office by election or discharged its powers or duties or acted as President under the Constitution and laws made in pursuance thereof, shall be eligible to again hold office by election.

Senator Shively of Indiana was the only Democrat to vote against the resolution. He based his opposition on the six-year provision, contending that a case might arise where a bad President would hold office and that there ought to be opportunity to get rid of him at least at the end of four years.

The single term question then went to the House.

### 20,000,000 STAMPS LOST

Portrayed San Pedro Miguel as "Gatun Locks" in San Francisco Exposition Issue.

Washington, D. C., Feb. 11.—More than 20,000,000 2-cent stamps of the Panama Exposition series have been destroyed by the postoffice department because of an error in the printing.

All the stamps bore the inscription "Gatun Locks" but the beautiful view set forth represented San Pedro Miguel. The department, not wishing to subject itself to criticism, ordered the entire issue destroyed. The error on the die will be corrected, new plates made and a fresh supply printed. It is doubtful if one of the wrongly printed stamps ever reaches the public.

The new issue will bear the inscription "Panama Canal." Never before has so vast a quantity of stamps of a single type been destroyed, especially one that had never been issued.

The 1, 5 and 10 cent stamps commemorating the exposition were placed on sale January 1, but the set is yet incomplete, because of the mistake in printing those of 2-cent value.

### WANTS CHEERFUL FUNERALS.

Minister Who Becomes Undertaker Will Seek to Dispel Gloom.

San Francisco, Cal., Feb. 11.—The Rev. Dr. Bradford Leavitt has resigned his pastorate of the First Unitarian Church to become an undertaker. He announced he had been compelled to abandon the ministry on account of weak eyes and that he was entering the undertaking business in the hope of "dispelling its atmosphere of superstition and gloom, which we have inherited from the heartless and sometimes heathen methods and ideas of the past."

### GIRLS SOLD AT AUCTION BY SLAVERS

Loathsome as the Traffic Is, Investigators Declare That National Attention Is Only Solution of Problem.

NEW YORK, Feb. 11.—Recent revelations concerning the most horrible maelstrom of modern civilization, white slavery, show that "most girls in all parts of the country are still falling victims to the vile traffic. This is in spite of the efforts of investigators, law officers and government agents. The investigators warmly indorse the recently announced plan of John D. Rockefeller Jr., to combat white slavery with money, but it is also declared that the United States government should take more radical steps, not only to check, but to end the evil.

What One Authority Says.

"At least 2000 white slaves are brought into this country every year," is the assertion of General Theodore A. Bingham, U. S. A., former police commissioner of this city. "They are brought in like cattle and disposed of for money like cattle. They are enticed from their homes. This does not mean by any means that girls from our own country—especially girls from little towns—are not drawn into the underworld by processes of deception practically identical to those used in Europe."

Loathsome as the white slave traffic is in the minds of upright men and women, those who have studied it contend that it should not be ignored for this reason, because in its spread it is reaching everywhere and has become a matter warranting grave national concern. The chain of men and women trafficking in white slaves has its largest centers in New York and Chicago. They also operate freely in San Francisco and Los Angeles, Cal., Seattle, Wash., Nome, Alaska, Denver, Col., Omaha, Neb., and New Orleans, La., as well as in smaller cities. While unfortunate girls are being brought into the United States from other countries, American girls are being drawn into the clutches of the "gray hawk" or are being tempted to downfall when facing want, as a result of low wages in the cities.

### GIRLS SOLD AT AUCTION.

Samuel H. London of El Paso, Texas, who for seven years has been studying the white slave traffic from Alaska to the Panama Canal Zone and from the Atlantic to the Pacific Ocean, tells how girls are sold at auction in New York by white slave traffickers. The brutes who gain control of these women, he declares, make \$570,000,000 a year.

In the back room of a cafe in the lower East Side London says he saw a crowd of men gathered around an auctioneer, who conducted a sale just as he would an ordinary auction of horses. These auctions are conducted late at night and have been continued for a period of more than two years.

"No girl in any class is safe. You have but to take notable disappearances like the Dorothy Arnold case," declared London.

### Learn Slavers' Code.

"I have a code of the white slavers by which agents in one city report the escape of a white slave in another. If she rebels against her master she is forced to submit. I have known of girls who have broken away from men in this city and have gone into another city. The code was used for telegrams just as in every other business and flashed from city to city. The headquarters for commercialized vice have their agents on the lookout. And the girl is eventually found and terribly maltreated. It is easier to escape the police than these vigilant agents."

London was aided in his work in New York by a special agent of the Department of Justice, and a report was made by the agent to the Department at Washington more than a year ago.

"White slavery is carried on in New York on a much larger scale than any other place in the world," said London. "There are 26,500 white slave captives in the city of New York, against 37,000 in all other parts of the country. White slavers here are more fearless than in any other place, because they are able to 'convert' with the ward politician. Ninety-five per cent of the girls who disappear in New York are taken captive by white slavers."

"If the people at large knew the real condition they would be horrified. The Ice trust has agents working in all the sweatshops. There it is easy to pick out the best looking girls, because of the hard conditions under which the girls work."

### TOWN NEVER TURNS LIGHT OUT

Cheaper to Let Natural Gas Burn Throughout Day.

AUGUSTA, Ky., Feb. 11.—The natural gas street lights in Augusta never are turned out. "We find it cheaper," explained Mayor Ed Weidlein, "to let them burn than to pay a man \$20 a month to turn them out every morning and light them again at night. The only trouble we have with gas," explained the mayor, "is keeping the pressure from blowing the mantels to pieces."

### MULE'S KICK RESTORES MEMORY OF TREASURE

Farmer Hides \$3865 in Panic, Finds Location in Accident, Remembers by Second Injury.

Enid, Okla., Feb. 11.—As the result of an accident, John Allen, a farmer living near here, forgot where he had buried \$3865 during the panic of 1907, and as a result of another accident remembered where the money was hidden, and recovered it.

In the panic year Allen lost faith in the banks, and to be sure and keep his money safely, buried it in his pasture.

A few days later he was seriously injured in a runaway accident, and as a result lost his memory as far as the resting place of the money was concerned. He could remember other incidents in his past life, but could not tell in what part of his place the money was hidden.

While Allen was hitching up one of his mules the other day, the animal suddenly kicked him on the side of the head, and for some time Allen was unconscious.

He was sent to a Kansas City hospital for treatment, and the physicians removed a piece of his skull. With the removal of this piece, Allen at once recovered his memory, and when he returned to Enid he went at once to the pasture, located the stone which marked the burial place of the treasure, and, digging, found the money where he had placed it.

### NO SKIRT FOR HER

DR. MARY WALKER ROUTS THE CHICAGO POLICE.

Eighty-Year-Old Physician Points to Special Permit Congress Gave Long Ago.

Dr. Mary E. Walker, who for more than forty-five years has worn trousers by virtue of a special act of the Congress of these United States was arrested on the streets of Chicago for wearing "em. It remained for a Chicago policeman to attempt to override the act of Congress and arrest a national institution. He knows better, now.

Although Dr. Walker is 84 years old, she is still filled with the fighting spirit which won her the medal of honor of Congress for conspicuous bravery on the battlefields during the Civil War, when she held a commission as surgeon in the United States army. The biting cold weather had no terrors for Dr. Walker, who left the home of her friends for her daily constitutional. She was clad neatly in black broadcloth trousers, cutaway coat and vest, overcoat and silk stockings. Dr. Walker was strolling leisurely down the streets, contemplating the time when all womankind would have the ballot and wear "em just as she does, when she caught the eagle eye of Policeman Peter Cleary.

### NEW GUN FIRES 652 SHOTS

File of Men Can Discharge as Many Bullets as Whole Company With Rifles.

New Haven, Conn., Feb. 11.—A special order of 500 rifles of a new model has been ordered here by the United States government. They are automatic, and will discharge 652 shots a minute.

The new gun, although a little heavier than an ordinary rifle, will be used as a field gun, the operator lying on the ground and supporting the front of the gun on a little tripod. Thirty bullets can be fired in the fraction of a second, another magazine can be adjusted in a fraction of a second, and the new model is slightly discharged until the record of 652 is obtained. Novices have fired 500 bullets a minute.

This rifle will enable a single file of soldiers to do the work of an ordinary company with the old gun. The force of the projectile is a trifle greater than that of the latest other rifles. The government order is a little more than half filled already.

## THE SCALP LAW.

Is the wild animal bounty law a good law? That is a question we have heard discussed considerably this week. It is costing the state many thousands of dollars to kill out the coyotes and wild cats and in this particular section we believe these animals are a benefit rather than a detriment. They live most entirely on rabbits, rodents, etc., and when they are exterminated, rabbits will multiply into untold thousands. As it stands today to believe one rabbit does more injury to the stockman and farmer than two coyotes. It is said that one jack rabbit will destroy enough grass to pasture a steer, but unlike the steer which simply bites it off, the rabbit destroys its roots. The farmer must surround his field with rabbit proof wire, if he would prevent his garden and truck crops from being destroyed.

The Commissioner's Court of LaSalle county in session this week paid for 427 coyote scalps and 162 wild cat scalps, at the rate of \$1 per scalp. The state pays 75 per cent of this amount and the county 25 per cent. If this amount of money had been paid out on rabbit scalps at five or ten cents each, the country would have been benefited, but as it is the money has been expended in exterminating animals that are really a benefit to the farmer and the stockman from the fact that they are destroyers of their worst enemy—the rabbit. We understand that not only in this county, but also in other counties of this section the bounty law on coyotes especially is unpopular and there is a possibility that the present legislature will be asked to repeal it.

What is actually needed is a bounty on rabbit scalps. The country literally swarms with them and the damage they do will run into the thousands each year.

The special demonstration Northern Railway is now on its tour of the system and will reach Cotulla March 5th. Our people do not want to let this date slip from their minds. If we can get as good a turnout to this as is usually had at a tent show, everybody will be there. Good crowds are meeting the train at every stop. As Cotulla is to be one of the only two stops between San Antonio and Laredo, we must make good.

With the season that is now in the ground our cotton crop this year should be a bumper and barring any unforeseen events it will be. Everybody has an optimistic feeling. More land is being cleared over the country and the acreage put in the fleecy staple this year will larger than ever. With our truck crop being marketed now, our onion and cattle a couple of months later, and then a good cotton crop in the fall, who will say that we won't be going some?

Did you ever see as much cloudy weather in Southwest Texas? It appears that the weather man has got all balled up and is dishing out the wrong brand to us. At any rate he is giving us a different kind to what we have been used to, and while we don't mind a little of this brand once in awhile, we do object to taking it in unbroken doses. Mix it up with a little sunshine and it will taste better.

## La Salle County Commissioners Favor Repeal of Scalp Law.

The Commissioners Court of La Salle county, in session this week adopted a resolution favoring a repeal of the bounty law on coyotes and wild cats. Copies were sent to the Senator and Representative of this district with the request that they take the matter up. Over six hundred scalps were paid for at this term, and the feeling generally is that the extermination of the coyote will do more harm than good, as the rabbits, the worst enemy of the stockman and farmer, will then literally take the country.

Following is the resolution as adopted:

February 12.—To the Speaker and Members of the House of Representatives of the State of Texas:

The undersigned, composing the Commissioners Court of LaSalle County, Texas, would most respectfully represent and show as follows:

That on account of the destruction of the coyotes and wild cats in this section of the country the rabbits are increasing rapidly and a serious condition confronts us; that in addition to the filthy work imposed upon the Court by the law requiring us to pay bounties on the said animals when killed this is costing the State and the Counties considerable money which is worse than wasted for the reason that said coyotes and wild cats do the people practically damage but do a great deal of good by keeping down the number of rabbits, which said rabbits are ruining the farms by eating the produce and ruining the ranges by eating the grass.

We believe we represent the sentiment of nine-tenths of the taxpaying citizens of this county in respectfully but earnestly

requesting that you at once repeal so much of the bounty law as requires payment for the killing of coyotes and wild cats.

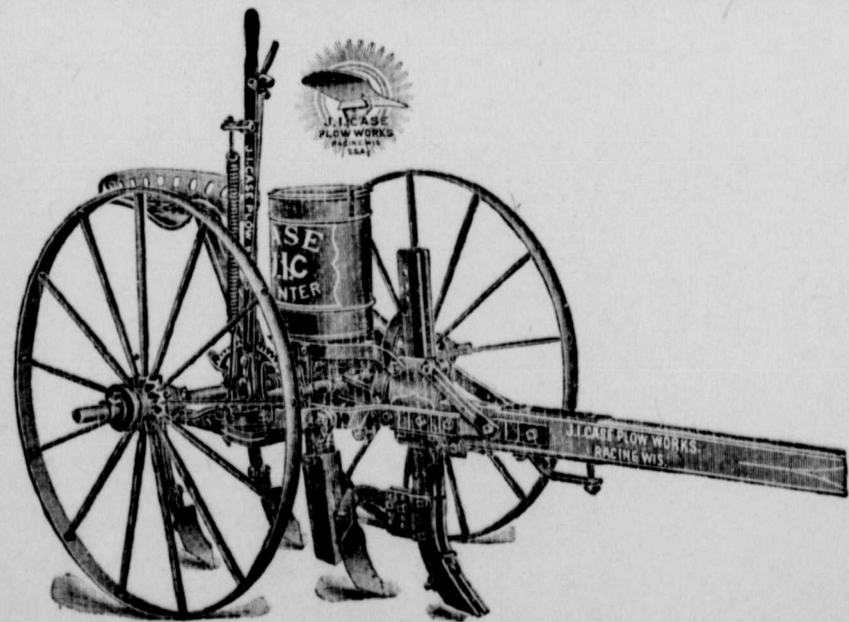
