Its Many Big Concerns of Today Are the Reflex of Those Early Hard-working Pioneers, Who Brought the Goods of Civilization to the Frontiersman and the Indians.

Jobbers in nearly every line of merchandise are to be found in San Antonio, but the leading lines are dry goods and notions. Two folies, the Halffs and the Oppenhers, have been bright lights an house in San Antonio soon after close of the Civil War. About same time other pioneer Texans, Goldfrank and A. B. Frank, es lished the house of Goldfrank, Frank & Co., later A. B. Frank & Co., at for many years this firm and D. Oppenheimer and M. Bro. were competing firms for the business of all of Southwest, Sout and West Texas and far into Mexic in dry goods and notions. Gold-frank, Frank & Co. and A. B. Frank & Co. handled groceries also until

Many years ago Mr. Goldfrank re tired from business and later A. B Frank moved to New York, the business being incorporated and finally sold to one branch of the Halff fam ily. D. & A. Oppenheimer found number of years ago that their bank ing business and great land interest occupied all their time and discontinued the dry goods business, but one branch of that family bought an interest in the M. Halff & Bro. corporation, so that these two families the Oppenheimers and the Halffs, are the San Antonio jobbers today in dry goods and notions.


During the many years these two houses have been doing business they have built up a trade that extends throughout Texas, beyond the con-fines of the state and far into Mex-It is estimated, and the figures probably are conservative, these two houses do an annual business of not less than \$2,500,000. Doing such business, each must buy in large quantities and, purchasing direct from the mills and manufacturers, and having ample capital with which to take advantage of all discounts, each is able to get the lowest cash prices. Their customers get the advantage of these low prices.

Frequently it happens that a merchant in the San Antonio territory thinks he can do better by buying from some of the big jobbers in New York, Chicago, St. Louis, Kansas City or other large markets of the north and east, or perhaps he thinks a better selection may be obtained further away from home. This might be true if he was buying from a small jobber, but the San Antonio dry goods jobbing houses can compete in prices and selections with any house in the country. It has been shown that having ample capi-tal they can buy as cheaply as their biggest competitors. Further than this, San Antonio has the advantage of exceptionally low freight rates large quantities the freight charges

are much lower than the charges on small shipments. The San Antonio jobbers can and do operate under less expense than the northern and eastern jobbing houses and this effects another saving in prices. Finally, a convincing reason why merchants within the San Antonio territory should buy in San Antonio is because the jobbers here can keep in closer touch with them and are in position to grant accommodation when needed. Crops may be late and collections slow, compelling the retail merchants to ask extensions. which can more easily be granted by jobbers within the same territory who know and understand these con-ditions when they occur much better than do distant jobbing houses.

This same argument holds good in other lines of trade, but within the San Antonio territory it applies especially to dry goods and notions lines because of the financial strength of the San Antonio jobbing houses and the immense business they are doing.

So well known are the two big dry goods jobbing houses of this city that their business is growing stead-ily day by day. Those that have been doing business in the San Antonio territory for some time have learned they can depend on the goods sold them and prices quoted here and those that have come in recently are finding this out. But the Southwest Texas country is filling rapidly with new settlers and many mercantile houses are being established by men from northern and eastern states who, perhaps long have dealt with houses near their former homes and who have not learned of the advantages to them of buying in San Antonio. It is necessary to call the attention of these to the San Antonio dry goods jobbing houses so they may buy their goods to the best advantage for themselves and their customers. Such of these as have not investigated the San Antonio market should do so at This is all that is necessary to make them steady and loyal cus-tomers of the San Antonio jobbing



Stocks of leather collars turned out with precision every working hour are sent from here to the stuffing room, where other workmen, with the aid of ponderous stuffing machines, complete the operation on the finished product. Thirty men are required in the horse collar department aging to keep assace, with

department solve to keen asace with In the adjoining department, the amous "Hereford Brand" saddles ire made. Here again the finest tanned leather is made into saddle of every description, grade and price Can furnish you the best silica sand The beautifully wrought designs and trimmings here executed upon this necessary article of the horseman' equipment, would even delight the horse. In addition to saddles, this department also turns out beautiful belts and hat bands for men's wear. They began the manufacture of thes about two years ago and the indus try has developed from about six styles to 125 at the present time. This department employs over thirty men with an output of about 5000 saddles a year, to say nothing of the numberless bridles, belts and hat bands made in addition.

Going to the next floor, we step ped into the harness department, the largest of them all. Every conceiv able kind of harness is made here worlds of leather, harness hardware and trimmings enter here, to come forth in the shape of durable, artis tic and high-grade harness. They produce any kind of harness here that one would wast. Fifty-three expert workmen in this department turned out last year 9400 sets of buggy and 2800 sets of wagon harness, requiring over 17,000 sides of leather therefor.

An entire floor, called the assembling room, is used for the purpose of gathering together the finished products of the various manufacturing departments and putting them in shape for the stockrooms on a floor below. 



It consists of a plain wooden box holding frames hung from a rabbet at the top and not touching the sides, top or bot-tom. Hives of this type are made to hold eight, ten or more frames. The size of frame in general use snown as the Langstroth (or L) known as the Langstroth (or L) frame (9 1-8 by 17 5-8 inches), is more widely used than all others combined. One of the best features in hive manufacture developed by Langstroth is the making of the spaces between frames, side walls, and spurs accurately, so that there is just room for the easy passage of bees. In a space of this size (called a "bee space"), bees rarely
