### IRRIGATION

By Frank Dillon, C. Irrigation Expert.

A synopsis of the Burges-Glass-cock General Irrigation Bill has given in these articles, but the 33rd Legislature did not stop with that in doing everything possible for the encouragement of irrigation in the State of Texas. Another bill pass-ed by the Legislature which like the one previously referred to will become a law July 1st, 1913, is known as the District Irrigation Bill

and is called "An Act to authorize the County Commissioners' Courts to create and

establish irrigation districts, etc It authorizes any county commis-sioners' court in the State to establish one or more irrigation districts, which districts may or may not in-clude cities, towns or villages; and such irrigation district when established may either build or purchase irrigation works and issue bonds in payment therefor. Upon receipt of a petition signed by a majority in value of the land owners within the proposed district the commissioners' court after due notice and hearing of said petition, if it shall appear that the construction or purchase of the proposed irrigation plant is feas-ible and practicable and that it would be of benefit to the d istrict. shall grant the same and its find-ings shall be recorded. While if to ings shall be recorded. While it to the contrary the court finds the project impracticable or otherwise objectionable it may dismiss the peobjectionable it may dismiss the pebassador Prepares Protets... right of appeal from the decision of the commissioners' court to the district court having jurisdiction. Upon granting the petition aforesaid, the commissioners' court will order an election to be held, after due legal notice of same has been given, to be governed by the election laws of the State, as to whether the irrigation district shall be abolished.

In the same way the owner of any irrigable lands contiguous to any established district may petition to have said lands included therein and the board of directors after having an accurate survey made may admit the tract as a part of the irrigation district, provided, it can be irrigated without prejudice to the rights of any of the lands originally contained therein; and when sair lands are so admitted they become the State should be given an opportunity to pass final judgment. A referendum retition might delay the enactment of a law more than a year. The referendum plan is backed by many business men who fear that the law's offensiveness to Japan may injure the prospects for California's great world's fair.







## THIS BRUTE GOT WHAT HE DESERVED

Farmer Who Gave Child Brutal Whipping Must Serve Two Years and Pay Big Fine.

Fort Worth, Tex., May 13.—For brutally lashing an 8-year-old boy, Ed Munz, a farmer who lived near Temple, must serve two years in fail and must pay a \$1000 fine. In addition, Munz must pay the court costs of several hundred dollars and a \$500

of several hundred dollars and a \$500 judgment in a damage suit in behalf of the boy. A suit brought by the child's mother is pending. Munz has begun serving his prison term.

Earl Blake's father is dead. His mother, being unable to care for him, agreed to let Munz take him for his board and clothing to do the chores chout the farm Father P. A Hock about the farm. Father P. A. Heckman of St. Mary's Catholic Church found the boy suffering from a score of cuts and bruises inflicted by a blacksnake whip. One of the child's ears was nearly torn from the head. Earle testified that Munz had whipped him "lots of times." Testimony showed that the boy has told Munz

## ARE REALLY COLDBLOODED

Temperature of Murderers Strikingly Subnormal, According to Statistics Made Public.

Chicago, May 13.—Cold bloodedness is a physical characteristic of the habitual criminal, according to statistics published today in the Journal of the American Medical Association. The temperature of mur-derers is found to be strikingly subnormal. Abnormally rapid pulse and respiration are found to be characteristic of the confirmed criminal.


