
NUECES IS ON WILD RAMPAGE





WOMEN DEMAND VOTES

Launches Campaign for Amendment,

WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 1.—A week's campaign by the National American Woman Suffrage Association to secure the adoption of a constitutional amendment to enfranchise women was launched at a mass meeting in a local theater. It was the formal opening of the fortyfifth annual convention of the association. An assemblage which packed the edifice from footlights to gallery listened for nearly three hours to discussions on various phases of the suffrage cause by conspicuous advocates of the move-Suspended above the drop curtain was a huge yellow banner bearing the legend: "We demand an amendment to the United States Constitution enfranchising women."
The association adopted almost

troduced by Mrs. Helen Ring Rob-inson, a member of the Colorado State Senate, calling upon President Wilson "in his forthcoming message to Congress to adopt the woman constitutional amendment as an administration measure and urge Congress to take immediate and favorable action upon it," urging the Senate to pass the amend-ment, and asking the House to create a comimttee on women's suff-

Dr. Shaw Presides. of the association, presided over the meeting and in her brief address voiced the belief that "a deliverance—a speedy deliverance—of wo-men is about to come through the action of the American Congress and through the president of the United

Oliver P. Newman, president of the District Commissioners, welcom-ed the convention to the National capital. Introducing Mary Anderson, Margaret Minchey and Rose Winslow, all women Industrial Workers, Dr. Shaw said:

"The right of the people to a state of the people to a

voice in their own government is the one point to which we are directing our efforts. We know no politics—no political party. We stand for no class, for no race, but only for a voice for all the people in their own affairs."

Miss Anderson, a member of the Industrial Workers of the World, told of her experience before th Illinois Legislature and maintained that if the women had had votes they could have accomplished much by direct influence. Miss Hinchey, a practical laundry worker of New York, discussed the underfed women Industrial Workers, reciting of the trials they were compelled to undergo on account of low wages and bad working conditions.

Equality of Rights.

Miss Winslow ridiculed the establishment of working girls' homes and similar philanthropies. She, too, demanded equality of rights and equal chances for each girl to acomplish something for herself at a

Miss Robinson, the Colorado Senator, delivered the principal address in the afternoon, her subject being "Women as Legislators."

"The one great motive that has brought the woman movement to its present proportions," she said, "is the determination of women to protect the home. 





EGGS IN STORAGE AND OTHER EGGS

Iced Warehouses Benefit to Mankind Were It Not for the Trusts.

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., Dec. 1.—Declaring the trusts are monopolizing perishable products held in cold storage, a local dealer discussed cold storage interestingly yesterday with

especial reference to eggs. "I believe eggs can and are preserved in cold storage from ten to twelve months so they are as good if not better than freshly laid eggs,' said he. "Unquestionably refriger-ation of eggs is a boon to humanity and not a curse, as some people seem to think. The original idea in establishing cold storage warehouses was to preserve almost indefinitely perishable products from seasons of plenty to those of scarcity. That

to store and preserve the surplus when they are plentiful and hens are laying, to the winter months not sticking close to their nests. This plan must necessarily benefit the whole people, even though it pays a profit to the man who collects and stores the eggs until they are in demand.

"But the original idea was not to hoard the eggs or other products until such time of empty market merely to command exhorbitant prices. A 'corner' on any product of food means a monopoly by which the entire output is held by a few who are in position to demand any price they choose. The storage of eggs and other food is a great thing, and in keeping with this progressive age, but gobbling the market and running up prices beyond all reaon is another matter and against

'Some persons laugh when you tell them eggs are sold right here in San Antonio in the spring for from 5 to 10 cents a dozen whole-sale, but that's a fact, although I might add that the average price in the spring, when the hens are in-dustrious and ambitious, is 10 cents a dozen wholesale. It is then the wholesaler buys in large quantities and stores his surplus eggs in the cold storage for future use when eggs are in demand and what is known as yard eggs are scarce. of the south, where the hens con-tribute to the egg market throughout the winter, do not properly appreciate conditions in the North they experience months of severe cold weather when the hens simply quit laying and are

busy trying to keep warm.
"The man who buys eggs in the spring and stores them must take his chances, without hope of insu-r ance against fire and other accidents to the refrigerator plant. Some-times the machinery breaks down and a few days or perhaps a few hours' low temperature puts have dreds of dozens of eggs to the bad. The cost of storing the eggs runs the price up to about 20 cents per dozen wholesale. The fresh laid egg is always in competition with the storage egg, except during the win-ter months, when the hens are not laying generously.

"The packing house interests are trying to corner the egg market, as they have other products, and this is what has aroused the people. The trust controls many refrigerator plants and with unliimted capital is in position to buy up and plant enough eggs to run the prices sky high. Not content to monopolize the beef supply, they are controlling vegetables, fruit and other necessities of life. The storage supply in San Antonio and this section of the country is exhausted before the first of the year. In fact the holiday demand the country is exhausted before the first of the year. mand for eggs can hardly be supplied from the storage warehouses in this section and this means a call on the refrigerator plants in the North and, naturally, the price demanded is very high if not prohibitive."




