hundred tons of milo, kaffir, and hundred tons of milo, kaffir, and
feterita heads, which they profeterita heads, which they pro-
pose to grind into meal and use pose to grind
in connection with cotton seed
sial meal in the feeding. All farm-
era agree that the only satisfactory way to feed milo or other similar feed is to grind it into meal. This method eliminates
the waste entirely, otherwise it is very great. Riverdale is the first farm on the River to put
their own cattle on feed. on their own grown products.

fome reason I was never able to obtain settlement, and
finally gave up hope. Since ettlement has been made ior the horses I hope to soon hear
about my cattle claim." Mrs. Speer can recall many experiences of Indian raids in carly days and is one of the very
few women living who survived the raids of the red men and has
