Isouac Joint Resolution No. 27.

Proposing en amendment to Art. 7 of the Constitution of the State of Texas by changing Sec. 3, providing for a thirty-five cent tax levy for the maintenance of the public schools of Texas, and providing free text books in public schools of the State of Texas, and making an appropriation therefor.

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

Section 1. That Section 3, Article 7, of the Constitution, be so changed as to read as follows (creating a new sec-

Sec. 3. One-fourth of the revenue derived from the State occupation taxes and a poll tax of one (\$1.00) dol-lar on every male inhabitant of this State, between the ages of twenty-one and sixty years, shall be set apart an-nually for the benefit of the public free schools; and, in addition thereto, there shall be levied and collected an annual ad valorem State tax of such an amount not to exceed thirty-five cents on the one hundred (\$100.00) valuation, as, with the available fund arising from all other es, will be sufficient to maintain to set aside a sufficient amount of the said tax to provide free text books for the use of children attendng the public free schools of this tate: provided, however, that should be limit of taxation herein named be fficient, the deficit may be met by ropriation from the general funds ne State, and the Legislature may provide for the formation of school istricts by general or special law rithout the local notice required in ther cases of special legislation; and thorized to pass laws for the assess-ment and collection of taxes in all said districts, and for the management and control of the public school or schools of such district, whether such districts are composed of territory wholly within a county or in parts of two or more counties. And the Legislature may authorize an additional ad valorem tax to be levied and collected within all school districts heretofore formed or hereafter formed, for the further maintenance of public free schools, and the erection and equipment of school buildings therein; pro-vided, that a majority of the qualified property taxpaying voters of the district, voting at an election to be held for that purpose, shall vote such tax, not to exceed in any one year fifty cents on the one hundred dollars valuation of the property subject to taxa tion in such district, but the limitation upon the amount of school district tax herein authorized shall not apply to incorporated cities or towns constituting separate and independent school dis-

Sec. 2. The foregoing constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of the State at an election to be held through out the State on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1918, at which election all voters favor ing said proposed amendment shall write or have printed on their ballots the words, "For the amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas providing for the levy of a specia school tax for the maintenance of the public schools of the State and to pro vide free text books in the public schools of the State of Texas," and all those opposed shall write or have printed on their ballots the words GRAND OPERA SINGERS

House Joint Resolution No. 2.

To amend Section 10, Aracle 1, of the Constitution of the State of Texas providing for certain rights of ac cused persons in criminal prosecu-tions, and the manner in which the case may be prosecuted, and providing for the procuring of the tes-timony of the witnesses for both de-fense and prosecution.

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

Section 1. That Section (10) of Arti cle (1) of the Constitution of the State of Texas be so amended that the same will read and hereafter be as follows: Sec. (10). In all criminal prosecu-

tions the accused shall have a speedy public trial by an impartial jury. He shall have the right to demand the nature and cause of the accusation against him, and to have a copy there-of. He shall not be compelled to give evidence against himself and shall have the right of being heard by himseld or counsel, or both, shall be con-fronted by the witnesses against him and shall have compulsory process for obtaining witnesses in his favor, ex-cept that when the witness resides out of the State and the offense charged is a violation of any of the anti-trust support the public schools of this for a period of not less than six his in each year, and it shall be luty of the State Board of Educabluty of the State State, the defendant and the State shall have the evidence admitted by deposition, under such rules and by deposition, under such rules and laws as the Legislature may hereafter provide; and no person shall be held to answer for a criminal offense, un-less on an indictment of a grand jury, except in cases in which the punish ment is by fine or imprisonment, otherwise than in the penitentiary, in cases of impeachment and in cases arising in the army or navy, or in the militia, when in actual service in time of war or public danger.


