MORE ABOUT INCOME TAX. Unmarried men and women who are bread-win ners for others are granted exemptions on their earnings before figuring the Income Tax now be ing collected. Although a return must be filed by every unmarried person, and by every married person living apart from wife (or husband); who recomition is made in the law of the home burdens recomition is made in the law of the home burden
carried by millions of such persons, and relie from excessive taxation is especially provided. In addition to the ordinary personal exemption o $\$ 1000$, and additional exemption of $\$ 1000$, is grant ed to "heads of families;" and there is also pro vided an exemption of $\$ 200$ for each dependen under 18 years of age or who is mentally or phy ically defective.
The $\$ 200$ for each dependent may be claimed by any taxpayer who is the chief support of such de pendent. This is not confined to dependents who
are members of the family or relatives. On the are members of the family or relatives. On the
other hand it does not include servants or others who are earning their living. And it does not ap ply to the wife or husband of the married taxpay er, even though such person may have become total burden.
It should be remembered that the peron who claims exemption as "head of a family" must qualify for it. Two single persons who divide be tween them, more or less equally, the financia and other responsibilities of a household canno But if a single person actually assumes the toty responsibilities of the household and is aided by having one of his brothers or sisters support him self and contributing an amount that could not practically be codsidered more than his board such trivial circumstances must not be allowed interfere with his clear claim for exemption
A single person is the head of a family if December 31st he had become the sole support o close relatives (by blood, marriage or adoption) living in the same house with him and looked up trol in the matters affecting the support and main trol in the the household The phrase "sole suppo
The phrase "sole support" is here used in the deper 'ente wre loiking for a suōstantial portio of their support. There may be another source of income (such as interest on bonds, dividends on tocks, pension) which, if meagre enough to stil leave the recipient dependent, should not inter fere with the claim for exemption. Such meagre
income of dependents, as well as the inconse quential profiton the board of any self support ing member of the household, must however be ncluded in the return of the head of the house hold.
xclude the parties from the claim for the addi tional exemption. Article 302 of Regulations 4 defines that a head of a family is "a person who actually supports and maintains in one househol or more individuals who are closely connected with him ty blood relationship, relationship by marrag or by adoption, and whose right to exercise family als is based upon some moral or legal obligation Once he existence of the fact that a taxpaye is the principal cause for the creation or mainte nance of a home is established it cannot be destroy ed by his mere temporary or unavoidable absence from it. If a father is left with a young child to whom he cannot give the proper attention himself, and he piaces this child with relatives or elsewher he should still be considered the head of the famiy even if yet further force of circumstances would oblige him to live elsewhere; provided that he still education and filial feelings of the child, and did not [while furnishing the support] allow the child not [while furnishing the support] allow the child
to become a virtual orphan. If, however, without necessity the dependent continuously makes his home eisewhere, his benefactor is not the head of
a family, irrespective of the question of support.
