Budget Set For Ten Counties Composing Girl Scout Council

The ten counties in the Council news to the Stockman. No. 210. tf area are Concho, Crockett, Irion, Kimble, Mason, Menard, Reagan, Schleicher, Sutton and Tom Green. With population increases in all of these counties since 1950, with the exception of Concho, Irion, Kimble, Mason, Menard and Sutton, the reduction in per-capita assessment will bring approximately the same budget as that based on 1950 census.

The Crockett county suggested budget this year was set at \$595 against \$594.45 from the 1951-55 figure. Budgets from other counties in the Council area, based on the new population and 14-cent per capita assessment are: Concho, \$602; Irion, \$196; Kimble, \$560; Mason, \$686; Menard, \$476; Regan, \$555; Schleicher, \$462; Sutton, \$524, and Tom Green, \$10,220.

In addition to the money which each zounty pays into the Frontier budget, each county supports its own local Girl Scout house and organization. They pay their janitor, utilities, breakage about the house, and also furnish books to


