NOT ANONYMOUS: In Defense Of Ozona Schools

An Editorial

An anonymous letter writer in Ozona during the past week spread some misinformation and half truths about the operation of Ozona's school system that need some clarification.

Though the writer of an anonymous letter scarcely deserves the dignity of even an informal reply, we think the issues here are too important to the community's future welfare to be ignored. Certainly everybody has the right to express his opinions on any subject, and as has been repeated over the years, this newspaper's columns are open to such expressions from anyone. But expressing an opinion and presenting what purports to be facts but which will not stand up under strict examination are two different matters.

The writer of the mimeograph broadcast, for instance, presents the challenge, "If you are really interested in what goes on in your public schools, you will be interested in the following information."

So, we'll take the results of a recent achievements test given in most public schools in Texas, just completed in the Ozona system. These tests are scientifically prepared to test the general knowledge of students in English, reading and reading comprehension, math, science, and history. There is no chance for "watering down" here since the tests are prepared by experts and the student makes his own grade average by his answers.

All of the students who maintain high scholastic averages in their classroom work scored high averages on this test, and among the athletes, the tests showed intellectual averages above present grade levels in almost every case. So, it would seem that those who attain high scholastic standing in the local schools earn those grades and do not get them by "watered down" courses.

Site No. 7 in the series of seven dams designed to control flood waters on Johnson Draw watershed and prevent a repetition of the disastrous flood of June, 1954, which took 16 lives and did an estimated \$12 million in damage.
