The 12th Annual Crockett County 4-H Livestock Show will be held Saturday, December 13th, in the Junior Livestock Show Barn. Twenty-eight 4-H club members have been busy getting their livestock groomed and fitted for the show. Highlight of the show will be the commercial fat lamb classes in which 25 4-H members are showing 85 head of Rambouillet and crossbred lambs, all bred and raised in Crockett County.

Ten first year feeders will be initiated into showing livestock and will have separate classes to compete in so as not to show against more experienced feeders. All lambs will be graded and then separate classes will be provided for the pairs of lambs which will be placed. 


