The little black length of distended fury, pictured above unloading his cargo in one of the big rodeos of the nation during the past season, now goes by the name of "Black Magic." But to Ozona rodeo fans of a few years ago he was known as "Juneteenth," the precision bucking pony who unloaded rider after rider in the local arena in the annual All-Colored Rodeo sponsored by the Ozona Roping Club.

Now a part of the Tommy Steiner bucking string, Black Magic, a product of the Pecos river country west of Ozona, (he was raised by

this editor), was selected by vote of bronc riders, members of the Rodeo Cowboys Association, for inclusion in the string of top rodeo stock to perform in the First National Finals Rodeo, the World's Series of the rodeo world, to be staged in Dallas Dec. 26-30. Sixty-nine top money winning cowboys in the five standard rodeo events the past year will compete in the National Finals, along with broncs and bulls voted tops by the riders.

The former Juneteenth has been ridden only twice in his lifetime and each of these times he was far from in top shape. Once he was ridden on his third performance in a single session and another

time when he was ridden too soon after recovering from being foundered. Among his victims was Jim Shoulders, Oklahoma cowboy who is this year's national champion. The little West Texas horse unloaded Shoulders the second jump when the Oklahoman drew him in Mason Square Garden.

He is said to be a classic "pro" of the bucking string, gentle as a cowpony in the pen and in the chute but a demon with a surcingle and a hated cowboy on his back. Photographically the picture leaves much to be desired in sharpness but it was the only one available at this time of the former Ozona horse in action.

## Plans Shape Up For 13th Annual 4-H County Show

### 30 Members To Show Lambs, Calves In Jan. 29 Event

The thirteenth Annual Crockett County 4-H Club Livestock Show will be held on Friday afternoon, January 29. Thirty 4-H members will be showing 120 fat lambs in the county commercial fat lamb show, all Crockett County lambs. Also being shown will be 25 registered Rambouillet sheep, 5 fat steers and 3 registered Hereford heifers.

The show will get under way at 1 p. m. with the judging of the breeding sheep, followed by cattle classes and ending up with the fat lamb show. All fat lambs will be graded into grades of prime, choice and good. The top ten lambs in each light and heavy division of both finewool and crossbred will be placed. Top lambs in each division will show for champion and reserve champion finewool and crossbred fat lamb. Each member will show a group of three fat lambs in either finewool or crossbred class.

Some 30 head of show type fat lambs are being fed by 4-H members for the major shows. These lambs will not show at the county show. Some of the typical of the commercial fed lambs will be shown at major shows following the county show.

Following the judging at the county show, a barbecue supper will be served to all visitors and exhibitors, followed by the auction sale of fat lambs. Each 4-H member will be allowed to sell one fat lamb at the county show auction sale. Price ceilings will be placed on the lambs according to their grade finish. Those members doing the best job of feeding will receive the highest price for their fat lambs.

J. E. "Spud" Tatum, vocational agricultural teacher of Rocksprings, Texas, will judge all livestock at the county show. Ray Siegmund, district agent of Fort Stockton, will judge the showmanship.

## Man Injured When Leg Caught In Motor at Ozona Air Force Base

Anthony Ramirez of San Antonio, civil service worker with an Air Force maintenance crew servicing radar equipment at the Ozona Air Force station, was painfully injured last Friday when his leg became entangled in an electric motor atop one of the radar towers at the station.

Ramirez was working alone on the tower when his trouser leg became entangled in the blower fins on a big electric motor which drives the radar screens. The rapidly whirling steel fins on the motor shaft which circulates air to cool the motor while it is in operation jerked the workman's leg into the spinning shaft chewing off skin and flesh and causing a broken knee cap.

Ramirez was treated in the Crockett County Hospital and was transferred Tuesday to a hospital in San Antonio for further treatment.

## L. B. Townsend, Former Ozonan, Dies Suddenly

### Suffered Fatal Heart Attack In His Store At Grapevine

L. B. Townsend, former Ozonan, died suddenly of a heart attack in his place of business in Grapevine, Texas, last Saturday evening at 7:10 o'clock.

Mr. Townsend, who with his family made their home in Ozona for more than twenty years, owned and operated the Townsend Variety Store in Grapevine where the family had lived for the past seven years. He had just closed the store for the day and had just completed checking the day's receipts when the sudden attack struck. Mrs. Townsend, who was with him in the store at the time, had just gone to the back to get her coat preparatory to leaving for home. She heard him call and looked up to see him slumping to the floor. He was dead when a doctor arrived.

Mr. Townsend was Ozona's first mortician, having served the community in that capacity as head of the undertaking department established by Joe Oberkamp in the twenties. He suffered a severe heart attack in 1945 while living in Ozona and on advice of his physician had to give up that type of work.

The family moved from Ozona to Llano in 1946 where they owned and operated a Goodyear store for several years. They opened the variety store in Grapevine in 1952. To a limited degree he continued to follow his first love, the funeral directing business, assisting local funeral directors when needed. He had acted as assistant in two funerals the day before the fatal attack Saturday.

Funeral services were held from the First Methodist Church in Grapevine at 2 o'clock Monday afternoon with burial following in Bluebonnet Hills Memorial Park in that city.

Surviving are the widow of Grapevine; two daughters, Mrs. John Bryant of Fort Worth and Mrs. Jack Jeanes of Richardson, Texas; three sisters, Mrs. Ada Sims of Brownwood, Mrs. Roy Kirby of Lometa and Mrs. Ted Doggett of Ozona, and five grandchildren.

Ozonans attending the funeral Monday were Mr. and Mrs. Ted Doggett, Mr. and Mrs. L. D. Kirby, and Mr. and Mrs. Hubert Baker. Mr. Kirby is a nephew of Mr. Townsend.

## Burglars Pilfer Vending Machine Cash Boxes Here

### Two Filling Stations Entered Same Night To Rob Machines

Apparently the same burglar or burglars hit two filling stations in Ozona last Thursday night to rifle cigarette vending machine money boxes.

The intruders apparently were interested only in the cash since nothing else was bothered in either station. Hit were the Fuantoz Dixie Station on Highway 163 at the south edge of Ozona and the Southwest 66 Truck Stop on Highway 290 at the west edge of the city.

The burglars did a minimum of property damage in gaining entry and were apparently pretty familiar with the vending machines since the damage in extracting the cash boxes was also at a minimum.

One of the cash boxes was found by sheriff's department officers in the right of way on Highway 163 just south of town. No clues as to identity of the intruders has yet been unearthed although several theories are being followed through in an effort to apprehend the burglars, Sheriff Billy Mills said.

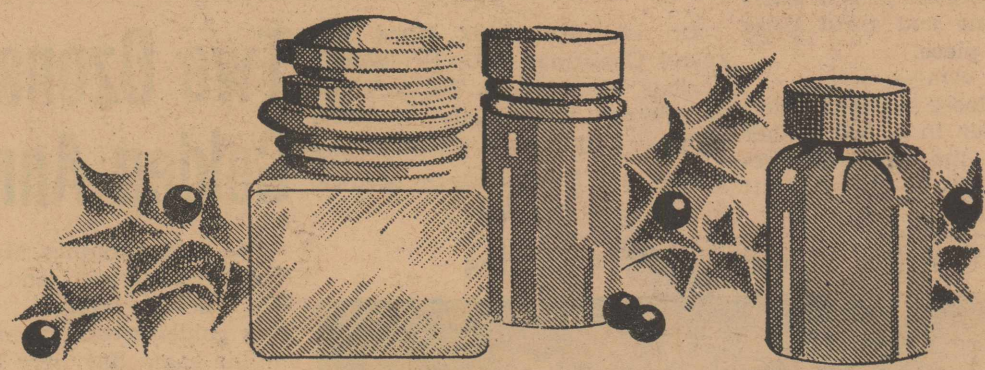

**Notes From The County Agent's Office**

Some taxpayers may overlook recent changes in income tax regulations that could reduce their 1959 tax. One new feature is the 20 percent first year depreciation allowance on tangible property. Farm and ranch operators should know the limitations on this special depreciation option in order to decide whether to use it, according to C. H. Bates, extension Farm management specialist.

To be eligible for this first year write-off, the property must have a useful life of six years or more. Usually a tractor or combine will qualify. Also, the property must have been purchased. Bates said any assets acquired by gift or inheritance does not qualify.

The maximum amount on which this depreciation can be taken is \$10,000 on a separate return and \$200,000 on a joint return. However, explained the specialist, this limitation may include several items of property to make up the total.

The full 20 percent additional depreciation can be taken on equipment bought in December so it enables recovery of this much of the cost. Then, the regular year-

ly depreciation can be set up for the remaining cost, less salvage value. For example, a tractor bought on December 5 for \$4,200 would be allowed \$840 first year depreciation. In addition, one month's regular depreciation would be allowed. If a salvage value of \$160 is set up, the annual straight line depreciation on an eight-year basis would be \$400. Depreciation for the month of December would be \$33. So the total depreciation on this tractor for 1959 would be \$873 (\$840 plus \$33). In 1960 the depreciation allowance on the straight line method would be \$400.

Some situations in which this additional first year depreciation might be beneficial tax-wise are: In years of unusually high net income, and in periods when considerable borrowed capital is needed for beginning or expanding operations. Also, in case of casualty involving considerable equipment, such as a fire, windstorm or flood. Bates said the advantage of larger depreciation allowance

would "cushion" the financial shock of re-investing in equipment needed.

For a complete explanation of this and other newer features of the tax regulations, obtain a copy of the 1960 Farmer's Tax Guide. It is available from your local county agent's office and from the Internal Revenue Service.

William F. Bennett, extension soil chemist, knows that the most important single factor in establishing and maintaining a luxuriant lawn is a sufficient quantity of proper plant food for healthy growth.

"Providing enough proper plant food for lawn growth is easy if we know the chemical make-up of the soil," says Bennett. "A soil test will tell us this and also just what to add to bring the soil up

to a high plant food value."

Bennett points out that while soil may be high in some chemical contents there may be a deficiency in others. Guesswork will not always work when it comes to applying fertilizers to overcome these deficiencies. The only sure method is to have a chemical analysis, or soil test, made to determine exactly what chemicals are needed to bring your soil up to proper production level.

Your local county agent will show you how simple and cheap it is to have your soil tested and

fertilizer recommendations made for your own individual lawn.

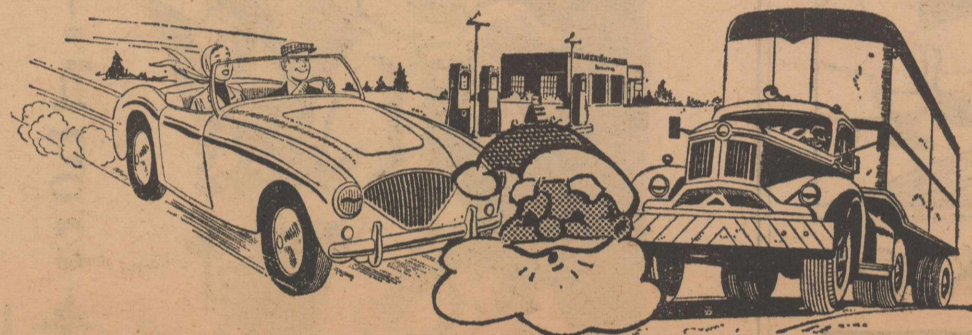

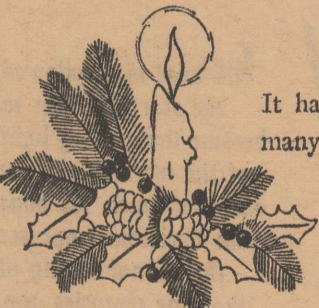

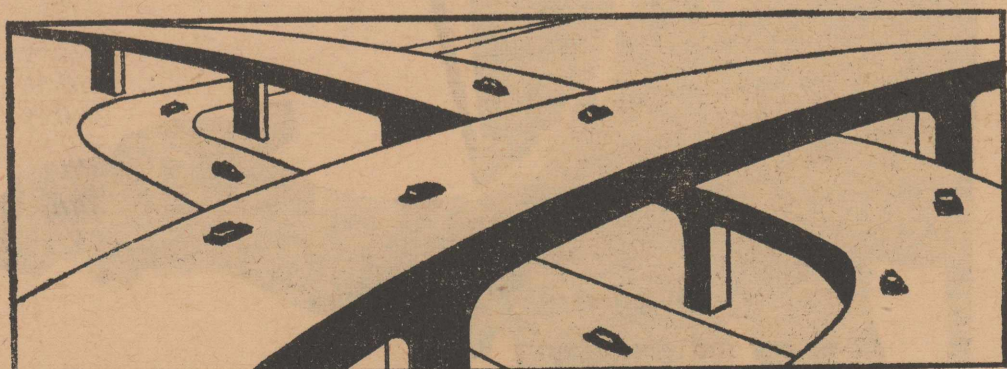

### Devonian Gas Pay Completed On U. T. Land West Of Ozona

Northern Natural Gas Production Co., Wichita, Kan. No. 1-14 University, Crockett County Devonian gas well, 25 miles west of Ozona, has been completed for a calculated, absolute open flow of 1,800,000 cubic feet of gas per day. Production was through perfora-

tions between 7,538 - 7,610 feet, which had been acidized with 10-500 gallons.

Casing (5-inch) was set at 7,690 feet, the total depth.

Original application was filed as a 1 1/4-mile northeast outpost to the Ingham (Devonian gas) field, however the project is separated from the field by an 8,584-foot Ellenburger failure. Operator may ask for discovery allowable. Location is 660 feet from the

south and west lines of 14-29-University. It is also 1 3/4 miles southeast of the recently opened Lancaster Hill (Devonian gas-distillate) field.

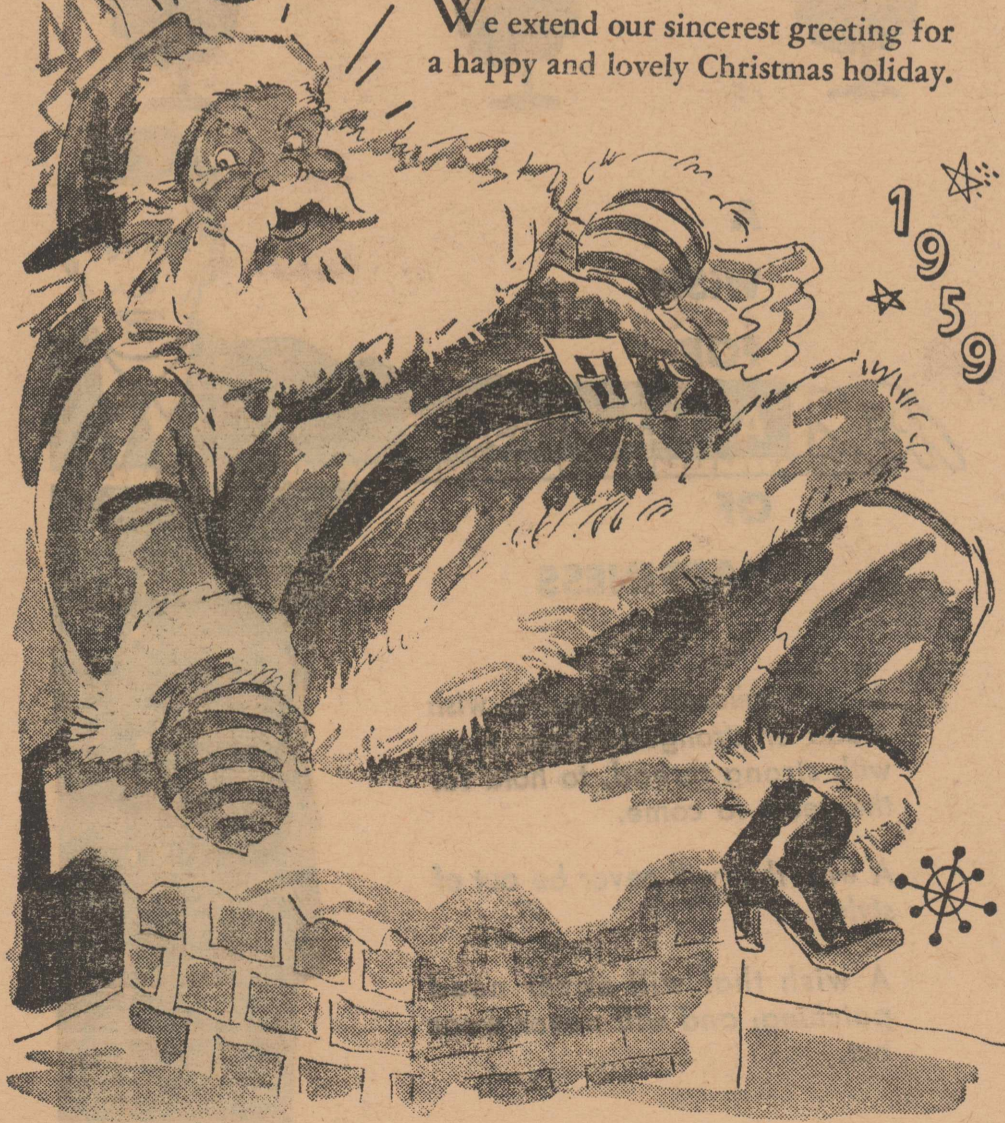

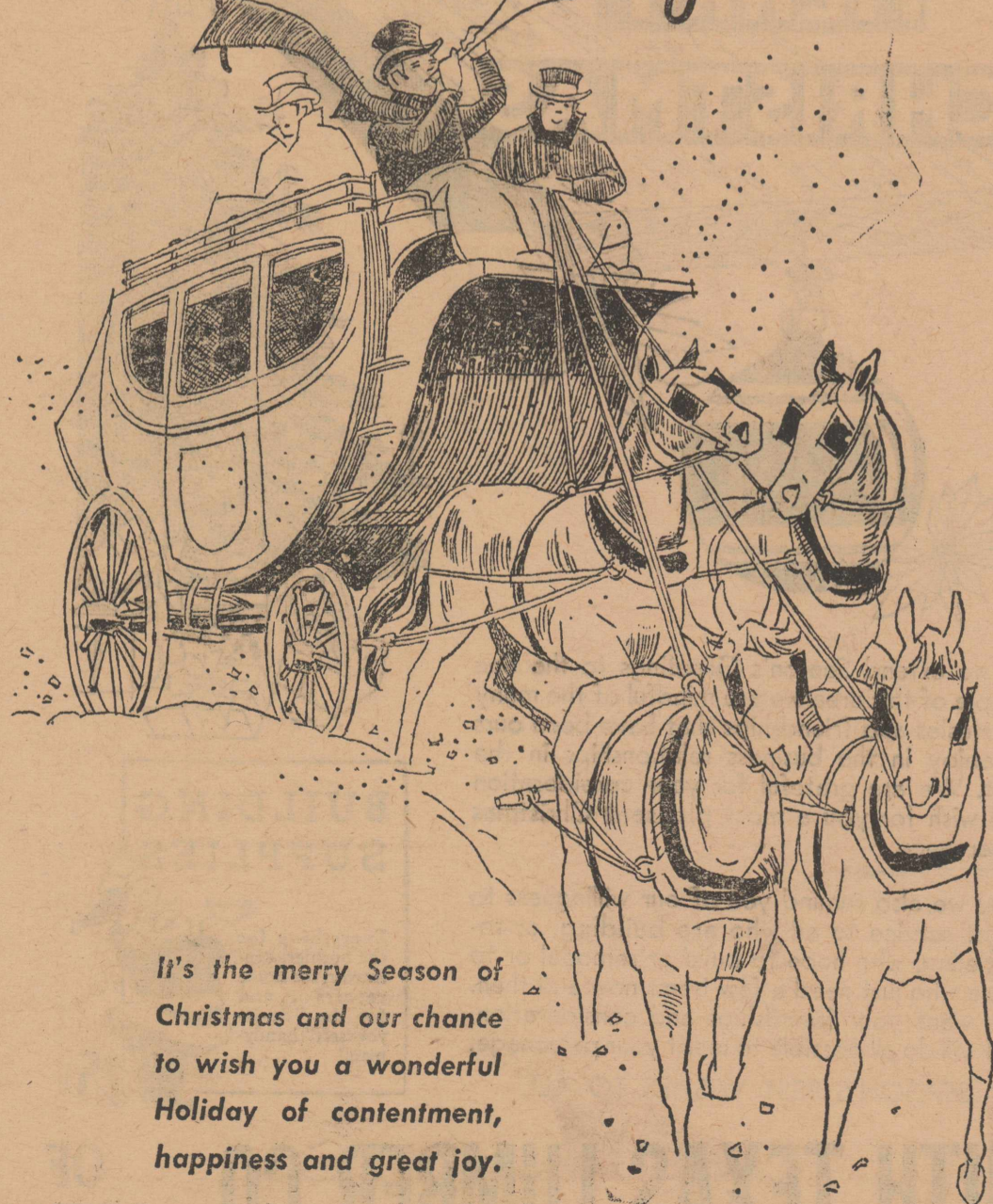

**Ozona Child Admitted To Gonzales Center**

Brent C. Saunders, Ozona, has been admitted to the Texas Rehabilitation Center (Gonzales Warm Springs Foundation) for treatment. Brent is the son of Mrs. Maxine Saunders of Ozona.

The Texas Rehabilitation Center is the Southwest's largest facility for comprehensive treatment of the physically handicapped. The Center is a non-profit, non-sectarian hospital which assures needed care to disabled citizens of all ages.

With the incidence of polio reduced by the Salk vaccine, more than two-thirds of the Center's patients have handicaps resulting from non-polio diseases and accidents, such as spinal cord injuries, strokes, arthritis, cerebral palsy, muscular dystrophy, and arteriosclerosis. Crockett County patients have received more than 789 days of treatment at the Center.

The reduction in polio patients brought a corresponding reduction in the Center's income. There is no National Foundation to pay for non-polio patients. Nevertheless, the Center still accepts any Texan deemed medically improvable regardless of ability to pay.

The net result, however, is that the Center is more dependent on contributions than ever. A long-range fund-raising program is under way, and the continued operation of the Center depends on how well Texans respond to this appeal for help.

**OLD TIMER DEAD**

Funeral services were held last Saturday in San Angelo for Fincy C. Bates, 92, one of this West Texas area's well known old timers, who died Thursday in a San Angelo hospital. A pioneer ranchman, Mr. Bates was the first county clerk of Schleicher county and was on hand for the Eldorado school land rush of 1901. He ranched near Sheffield until moving to San Angelo in 1938.

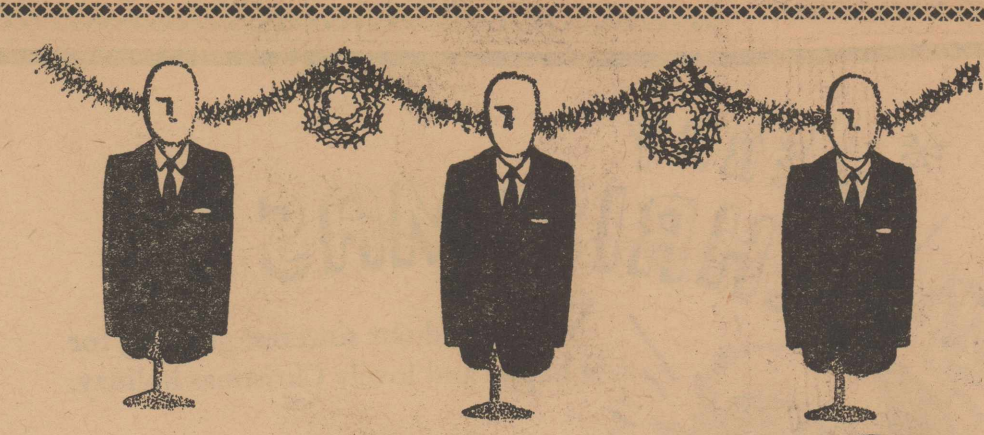

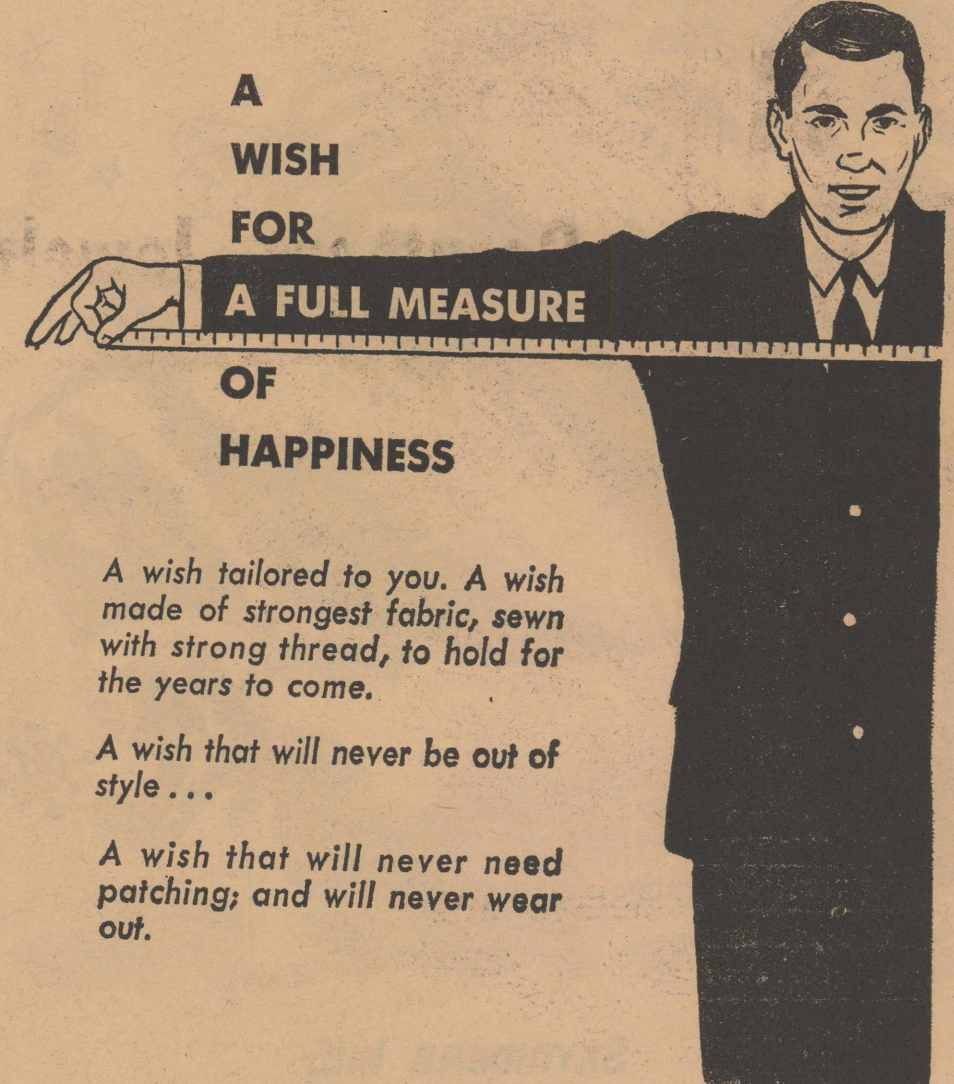

**Sutton Co. Ranchers Organization To Fight Range Grass Fires**

College Station — Sutton County ranchers have come up with a unique way to get equipment for fighting grassfires, according to G. O. Hoffman, extension range specialist. Twenty sections of rangeland in Sutton and Schleicher counties had burned by late summer and it was determined that a large part of this area could have been saved if proper equipment had been available.

Hoffman said D. C. Langford, Sutton county agricultural agent, reported that landowners joined together under the sponsorship of the Sonora Chamber of Commerce and taxed themselves \$10 per section of rangeland in order to purchase proper equipment.

A four-wheel drive firetruck has been purchased and equipped to supplement a similar vehicle purchased several years ago. Two-way radios have also been purchased so that fire fighting can be supervised from the air. Many ranchers are also equipping their pickup trucks with these radios so fires can be reported more quickly and this will better the communication system, Hoffman said.

Ranchers having power sprayers have been urged to register them with the Chamber of Commerce so they can be located quick-

ly in case of fires. Many ranchers keep their sprayers full of water and ready during the grass fire season, the specialist noted.

Fire lanes have been constructed around and through several ranches and along roads to prevent fires. Land owners have also posted fire prevention signs furnished by the local newspaper on gates and cattle guards leading into their ranches to remind hunters and others of the fire hazard.

Sutton County has the best cover of grass it has had in the memory of many of its ranchers, and they plan to maintain that cover if possible by protecting it from fire, Hoffman added. It is hoped that other counties in the area will adequately equip their fire departments with range fire fighting equipment so the fire department can cooperate in controlling large range fires.

ress, Miss Katherine Goode, Roy Henderson and Johnnie Henderson. The fascinating story of the honeymoon trip which Mr. and Mrs. Henderson took to Arkansas where Mr. Henderson was to meet his bride's parents and relatives for the first time, is told in a manuscript on the fly leaves of the bride's book.

The ink is browned after a half century, but the writing is clear and the story intriguing.

"December 22nd, 1909, at 7:30 a. m.," the story begins. "Floyd Richmond Henderson and Mary Lillian Stewart were quietly married at the home of Dr. and Mrs. A. W. Clayton in Ozona, Texas.

"Breakfast was served at eight o'clock and immediately afterward the bride and groom started on their trip to Arkansas, the former home of the bride.

"They were started on this journey in the two cylinder Buick in company with Roy Henderson and Katherine Goode. The radiator leaked out all the water and after traveling seven miles the party returned to Ozona to get another car as this one had to be fed snow to make it run.

"After eating turkey dinner at Dr. Clayton's they started on their journey again, this time accompanied by Dr. Clayton and Pleas Childress in Dr. Clayton's E. M. F. Studebaker. It was a cold, bad day and the ground was covered with snow which by this time had begun to melt and the car could not travel fast. About night they reached the Humes ranch, twenty miles from Ozona. There lived a bunch of cowboys only and the bride obtained her first knowledge about making baking powder biscuits. After supper, the bride and groom washed dishes while Dr.

Foster & Davis after the elder Baggetts had moved to Quanah. But Early had a modest flock of sheep which he pastured on the place and the newly married couple made their first home at what was known as the Aemotor place, named for a windmill of that make which watered the pasture. The ranch was later divided among the six children and the Early Baggetts settled on their present holdings 12 miles south of Ozona.

Clayton and Mr. Childress prepared the bridal chamber. They proved to the bride and groom that they had had experience before.

"The next day about noon, a car came out from Ozona driven by Mr. John Lee Nesbit. In it were Miss Rena Turner and Mr. Felix Kilpatrick. The road was worse than the day before and night found this tired couple at the 09 ranch eight miles farther up the road.

"The next day they met with better success and about ten o'clock p. m. found them in San Angelo at the Landon Hotel where they stayed until 2:30 p. m. the following day when they boarded the train for Fort Worth.

"Reaching Fort Worth they found they had missed their train and so spent the day at the Metropolitan Hotel and boarded the train about 8 p. m. for McNeill, Ark. About 11 o'clock a. m. the next day they stepped off the train at McNeill where the groom had a shave the first time since leaving Ozona.

"The train for Magnolia had gone so after the groom had freshened up to meet his wife's people whom he had never seen, they rode six miles in a surrey to her former home.

"Tired but happy they reached their destination where they spent two weeks pleasantly and returned to their home town, Ozona, Texas."

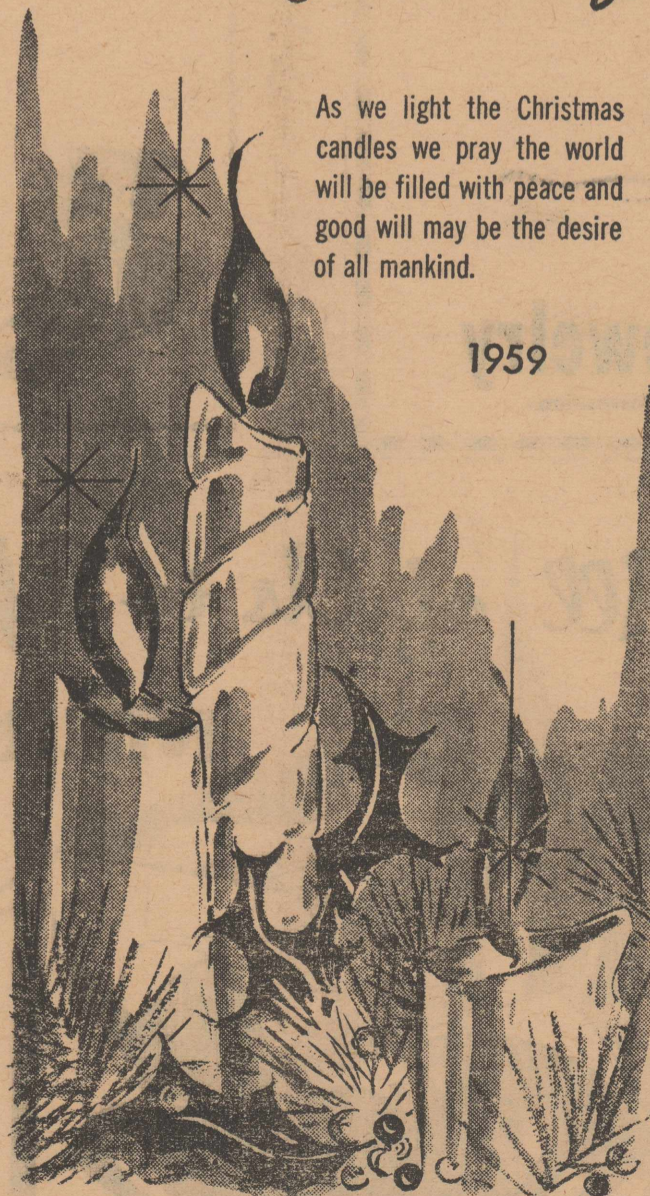
