Threat To Ozona, Sonora Water Supplies Stopped By RRC

Announced plans of the Cities brought to the attention of the Kindergarten: Popcorn and pony Texas Railroad Commission.

In response to an appeal by the First grade: Dart gun, wishing Sonora Lions Club, on the ground that use of the quantities of fresh water contemplated, from depths corresponding to that of the sources of supply for the cities of Ozona and Sonora, would endanger these municipal supplies, the Texas Railroad Commission reminded the Cities Service that it had been granted the waterflood permit on the basis of use of salt water obtained at a depth of 1800 feet not fresh water at a depth of approximately 450 feet.

Early in August, the Sonora Lions prepared a letter to Cities Service requesting that they refrain from using fresh water in the extensive waterflooding operations planned in the Page field. The company, according to a letter to local interests received this week, "advised us that they were "fortunate in obtaining an excellent supply of fresh water at a shallow depth" and that they were 'contemplating' the use of this water in waterflooding the Page field.

The Sonora group then appealed to the Texas Railroad Commission against this threat to theirs and their neighbor city's source of municipal water, and received a copy of a letter dispatched by Revival Services will begin Sun- the Commission to the Cities Ser-
