A rash of three accidents in and near Ozona Tuesday afternoon produced some heavily damaged cars but fortunately no serious in-

The first accident in the series which kept Highway Patrolman Jim Harvey busy most of the afternoon occured about 1:45 p. m. when a small Austin-Healy car was heavily damaged in a collison on U.S. 290 in front of the Ozona Oil Co.

The crash occurred when Richard Flowers attempted to cut over to the M&M Cafe and either failed to see or misjudged the position of the other car. Airman Bob Smith, driver of the other car, escaped injury and his wife sufferer only minor cuts and bruises.

The second crash, a grinding, one at the corner of 12th and Avenue E saw a car driven by Mrs. Pearl Young struck broadside when it emerged from a blind corner. The impact of the collision sent the two cars, the second Hillery Phillips lawn.
