The race for commissioner precinct 1 was the closest of the three county contests. Jesse C. Marley beat incumbent commissioner C. O. (Lefty) Walker by 42 votes to become the Democratic nominee for that post. Marley polled 245 votes to Walker's 203, making a much closer contest than in the first primary. Marley will face James Baggett, Republican, in the November election.
