

"The Soviet Union acted first to deploy ABMs, is installing more than 60 ABM launchers, and is testing an improved model — whereas the United States has not yet deployed ABMs of any kind.

Sen. Jackson is a Democrat who places his nation's security above partisanship. His arguments appear to be substantial. It might serve the cause of national defense if all of the critics of the Safeguard ABM system and the constant apoligists for the Soviet Union would take the few minutes necessary to read the senator's remarks. They might well learn something.
