
Texas voters have turned down pay raises for their legislators enough times in the past years that it comes as a surprise in November the voter will find Amendment Number 1, is the same song, second verse. Even more of a surprise is the number of individuals and associations endorsing the passing of the proposed amendment to raise legislative salaries from \$4,800 per year to \$15,000, and provide for annual sessions.

It is the opinion of this newspaper that annual sessions are not necessary and that a pay increase for members of the legislature would further increase the costs of state government when it is already overburdened in meeting the needs of the people.

Every legislator in this state knew what the salary was when he ran for office. The job is not a full time job. When pay raises for legislators are mentioned, nobody ever mentions that besides the \$4,800 annual salary, state representatives receive \$875 and senators \$2, 400 per month in expense accounts.

Raising the salary to the proposed amount would be such an incentive for private gain that there would be more con men as candidates than you could shake a stick at. There seems to be a concentrated effort to brainwash the people of Texas into believing that the more the salary the more efficient the state government, Darolyn Wilson of Ozona are also that a salary raise will buy honesty. Most of our legislators, or perhaps the best of our legislators, have other sources of income and do not depend on their state salaries or expense accounts for their livelihood.

As for higher salaries attracting more competent candidates, that's just a lot of hogwash. Nobody worth his salt is going to give up a lucrative business, professional or otherwise, to go after a \$15,000 a year, plus expenses, political job. This is just wishful thinking. If this amendment is passed, it will be the first of many and the taxpayers in this state will be at the mercy of the merciless.

A more efficient governof the taxpayers' dollar would be a greater incentive than anything else to give legislators their oft asked for pay raise.

sion 5 of the Crockett County Soil and Water Conservation District will meet in the S. C. S. office Tuesday, Oct. 9 at 7:30 p.m. to elect one member to serve on the Board of Directors. The member must be qualified by owning land in the subdivision.

Subdivision #5 consists of all lands in Crockett County lying west of county road following Howard's Creek and South of highway 290.

To be eligible to vote in a Soil and Water Conservation District Directors election, a person must own agricultural land within the subdivision where the election is being held, must live in the county, all or part of which is in the Soil and Water Conservation District. The voter must have attained the age of 18 years. No poll tax is required. Under the community property laws a dry spring.

Qualified voters of subdivi- of Texas the wife of a landowner also owns land and is entitled to vote and hold office.

Soil and Water Conservation District Directors serve a term of five years, the term beginning the day after he is elected. State law requires that a Soil and Water Conservation District Director take an oath of office and execute a loyalty oath before he is officially a Director.

Laird's Balloon

Presidential aide Melvin Laird recently told reporters President Nixon is considering an increase in the income tax, as a means of combatting inflation.

Since this is a move the President has publicly pledged an all-out effort to avoid, the Laird statement was considered a trial balloon by many. While the President has ordered a study of the proposal, and others recommended by Arthur Burns, chairman of the Federal Reserve Board, he said there would be no tax increase this year.


Economists tend to view the inflationary scene with a professional, mathematical eye; they therefore often propose taxing personal incomes as a means of checking inflation in a somewhat dispassionate way; the reduced income leaves the average citizen less money with which to buy fewer things.

While this works to stem inflation, obviously, it should be the last resort of governments at a time when the average citizen is also being affected by rising prices, rising interest rates and other forms of inflationary hardship.

Since Mr. Nixon based his presidential campaign last year in part on a platform to avoid further income taxes, he should certainly employ every other method available to him as "hief executive, including raising corporation taxes, before adding to the average citizen's tax burden at this time of serious inflationary pressure on family budgets.

The Rotary Engine Car

From industry sources comes word that General Motors, Citrogen, Toyota and Mercedes are now spending millions to develop rotary engines for automobiles. General Motors has already announced it would offer some rotary-engine automobiles (through Chevrolet) next year. One of the intriguing features of the rotary automobile engine is that it contains so few moving parts, weighs less than conventional power plants and seems to offer promise that it can do a comparable job much cheaper, and with less maintenance and probably less fuel. These are major claims, perhaps not yet finally proven. But it is a fact that the rotary engine now being offered the automobile public has 67 basic parts, of which three move, compared to the conventional engine's 230 basic parts, of which 166 move. Obviously, such a simple engine is more quiet, and if it can help toward solving the air pollution problem also, the rotary engine seems to have much to offer, and one suspects-despite a recent blunt remark by one U.S. automotive giant-the rotary engine could be the automobile engine of tomorrow.



School & Discipline

It is well to take stock of our local schools every so often, and the new school year now underway is a good time to review local conditions.

In the first place, capable school administrators, from superintendent and principals on down, are not as easy to find as some imagine. The really good officials in this field are the objects of much competition.

Parents of children-many of whom have been raised on progressive theories which are now largely discreditedhave an obligation to cooperate with school authorities in every way possible and to make their task easier as they attempt to guide, train and educate the children of this community.

Children must be disciplined, as well as educated, for if they are not disciplined they cannot be educated. This is one point parents must keep in mind. Also, it should be remembered that proper disciplining never hurt anyone, and is a prerequisite in our social order, a lack of which is responsible for much of our juvenile delinquency.

As the school year gets underway, we urge all parents to cooperate with teachers and school officials, and encourage their children to approach school with the proper attitude.

Jamming Stops

The announcement by State Department officials in Washington that Russian jamming of Voice of America broadcasts had ceased as of the second week of September is of considerable significance.

The major thrust of most of President Nixon's critics, in discussions of the new detente between Russia and this country, is that Mr. Nixon has not achieved much in the way of a freer flow of information between the peoples of the two countries in return for technological aid and massive grain sales to Russia.

The Russians have been jamming Voice of America broadcasts for decades. They now seem to have stopped jamming British Broadcasting Corporation programs and West German broadcasts also. This, coupled with the increasing boldness of prominent Russians to speak out for more individual freedom, gives hope that the average citizen in Russia will become better informed, less susceptible to the anti-American line of Radio Moscow.
