

A COSTLY BUILDING. Arrangements for Completing and Fur-

nishing the St. Louis City Hall. Sr. Louis, April 29.-City officials have been in conference this week over the final details for completing the erection of the new city hall The only question involved is one of expense. It has been about decided that \$1,500,000 will be sufficient to complete the remaining stories of the hall and have it ready for occupation. The furnishings will cost a considerable sum in addition, but the result will be eminently satisfactory.
