Ohio raises 100,000,000 bushels of corn, 37,000,000 of wheat, 37,000,000 of oats, 12,000,000 bushels of tobacco, 35,000,000 pounds of potatoes, and 3,500,000 tons of hay yearly. The vineyard produces 2,500,000 gallons of wine and 20,000,000 pounds of grapes.

ELECTION IN TEXAS.

The Democrats win but reports are incomplete. The Populists fill a Big Vote and the Election is Close in Some Districts—Returns Very Incomplete and Total Figures Unobtainable.

1st district—Culberson has without doubt carried this district with the populists close on his heels. 2nd district—The democratic candidates are elected on the face of incomplete returns. 3rd district—Democrats slightly in the lead. 4th district—Bowie county claimed by the populists. Cass county democratic by 600. Franklin county, Culberson 80, Nugent 800. Henderson county Culberson majority 4. Red River county indications are that the populists have carried it for Davis. Lamar county democratic by 200. 5th district—Collin county, Culberson, 674, Nugent, 346. The balance of the democratic ticket wins at the same average. Cooke county, Culberson 377, Nugent 126. Hill county, Democrat, Culberson 532, Nugent 224, Schmidt 121. Fannin county indications are that the democrats have carried the county from 1000 to 1500. 6th district—Boswell county, Culberson carries this county. Dallas county, Culberson 1,500 ahead, Kerby, populist, 1,500 in the lead for congress. Ellis county is an even race between Culberson and Nugent. Hill county, vote is close the result will not be known until morning. Johnson county, Culberson 100 in the lead. Kaufman county, Culberson 500 ahead. Navarro county, democrats leading, no figure can be given. 7th district—Bell county, Culberson 715, Nugent 521, with indications that the whole democratic ticket is elected. Brazos county, Makemon 744, Culberson 586, Nugent 141. Falls county, democrats claim everything. Limestone county, Nugent is about 800 votes ahead. 8th district—Waco, Texas, large populist gains, no figures given. Milam county, Barber, populist, claims that he is elected for congress. Robertson county partial returns show that the democrats are in the lead. 9th district—Parker county, populists ahead. Fort Worth, Culberson 2500, Nugent 1500, Makemon 400, Schmidt 200. 10th district—Dallas county, populists over the democrats, in the city. Democratic majority about 800. 11th district—Blanco county, Nugent is in the lead. Harrison county gives small majority for Culberson. 12th district—Harris county, indications the democrats have carried this county by a very small majority. Hay county, large democratic majority. Austin, Texas, not counted in all precincts. Indications are that the democratic ticket is running slightly behind, sowing populist gains; the count will not be completed until tonight. Weston county, republican and populist vote nearly equal, but the democrats. Williamson county, for congress, Hinchins, populist, is about 100 ahead. The democrats will probably carry it in the county offices. Hutchins county, slightly ahead in the district. 10th district—Indications are that Rosenthal, republican, is elected congressman from this district by a close vote. Fort Bend a seat republican by 700 majority. Gonzales county, populist is several hundred.
