LOCAL OPTION VIOLATIONS-TAX COLLECTOR DILATORY.

County Treasurer's Books Investi-gated-Ferries and EstraysCondition of the Jail.

To the Hon. Jno. Young Gooch,
Judge of the 3rd Judicial Distric of Texas:
The grand jury for the fall term of district court in conclusion of their labors beg to submit the foling report:
We have been in session for seventeen days and have been actually engaged during that period in inour knowledge.
We have reported one hundred and thirty-five indictments, forty felonies and ninety-five misdemeation law has been violated in great many instances, and we have done all in our power to present all who bave been guilty of violat ing this law.
We find that the tax collector has been very dilatory in the collection of various taxes, and we would recommend that he take immediate steps to collect all delinquent taxes, and we would es pecally recommend that the tax collector be more careful in the license paid by shows. It seems that he has collected too small amount for these shows, and has failed to collect for three show being exhibited, that is, has not collected for each performance as is required by law
We have partially investigated quite a number of minor offenses, but not being able to complete our invesugaion befors adjourument We have referred this class of of the peace, in whose jurisdiction they properly belong, vhio, with they properiy belong, who, with
the assistance of the various constables and county attorvey, can in vestigate this grade of offense a thoroughly as the grand jury, and some of these offeases we helieve should be speedily investigated.
We notice that the county treas urer is furnisbed by the county with an excellent cash book in which to keep a record of all fines, paid on both convict bonds and on judgments rendered in crimina cases, which, if properly kept, woild not only bea great and to the finance committee in their uivesti gations, but would we believe be a great saving to the county in en hancing the road and bridge and jury funds. We find also that the county treasurer has absolute ly ignored the part of this book in which the above mentioned recor should be kept, and we earnestly recommend that the county treas urer immediately begin the use of this book
We also find that out of the entire number of ferries in the county only four pay license, and only bond as is required by law. Un doubtedty the officers whose duty it is to iook after this matter should these parties to pay the license
and file such hond as necessary, or tppress the business. This mathion a fow hours before adjourn-

In regard to the estray stock: This, as the ferry matter, wa called to our attention at a late hour, and we did not give this matter such an investigation as we would have otherwise done. How over, we find that there are sever al instances in which stock hav been estrayed, and absolutely no record where any disposition wa over made of such stock. Th tray law, we anderstand, has been reglected for some time past and we urge upon the officers whose duty it is to look after this matter that they be more diligent than as heretofore been done
We find that jall is kept in goo condition as far as is dosssble. Bu dition, it being constructed out o wood instead of metal. Thi pipe when flushed out leaks all over the lower story of the jail creating an awful odor, which will necessarily cause sickness of th necessarily cause sickness of the hmates. And we recoumend have this pipe fixed at once. In the event that the cominissioners court bould fail to look after this court siould daspectfully suggest hat the next grand jury take such teps as are proper.

A gentleman who has lived in the infected regions of Central Texas for several years and who las been interested in farming, es pecially in the cultivation of coton, all his life, discusses the boll weevil in this way:
"From personal investigation and from reports received from avery section of Honston county, I am convinced that the boll weevil are here in full foree as numerous to the acre, perhaps, as in any other section of Texas. That they did not do more serious damage this season, is doubtless due to the dry hot weather prevalent in the pring and early summer. The damage which they have done since the rains began foreshadows what may happen to the entire crop next season should the wintor and spring be favorable to the preservation and propagatio his most formidable pest.
"Among all the suggestions of fered by Prof. Malley and others, some of which were fully tested by large planters in my section at an expense of many- thousands of dollars, none were found of practical value save the suggestions to pasture the cotton fields with cat tle as soon as the bulk of the cotlon could bo gathered, sacrikcing considerable remnants of the first crop.
"To derive the highest benefit conies while the foliage is still green, and the adult weevil still infests the plant. It is well
