TO REFUND STATE BONDS,
provisions of the Bill Introduced by
Mr. Boyd. Austin, Texas, Feb. 10.-A bill was
introduced yesterday by Mr. Boyd, hairman of the house finance commit turing January 1, 1904.
The bill provides that the governo
shall have lithographed bonds of the state ot the denomination of 81000 eac to the amount of $\$ 288,000$ to be termed
"the State of Texas refunding bonds of the issue of 1904." They shall be dated January 1, 1904,
and run forty years, but the option of redemption after five years is re
tained. The rate of interest is left tained. The rate of interest is lert
blank, payable January 1 and July 1 annually in the city of New York, or
at the treasury at Austin. These bonds are for funding, canceling and reti ting the $\$ 288,000$ of bonds due January 1. 1904.

The governor and treasurer shall nepar and accrued interest. The sum $\$ 500$ is appropriated for lithographing the bonds.
