San Antonio, Tex., March 81.District Attorney Baker of this county heartily indorses the antrambling bill passed by the legisature and says it will be rigidly enforced in this county, He says he so wishes while the reform wave on that the legislature would xact a law making it a penal ofense to carry concesled weapons. "While the legislature is geting excited over the existence of smbling," said Judge Baker, "I would also like to see its indignaion aronsed aganst the pistol totrs. The legislature should pass a aw just as atringent against carying concealed weapons as against gambling, for the laxity in enforcing the 'pistol toting' law is responsible for people being murdered every day. Texas ought to have a law like that of Tennessee. There it is a felony to sell or have in ne's possession any pistol except United States Army pistol, and it is a felony to carry that kind except openly in the hand. The law has stopped 'pistol toting' in ennessee and would stop it in lexas."
