There are approximately 22,500 memspapers in the United States, Of these about 200,000 people as journalists-editors and editor1al writers.
No wonder, an increasingly large number of young men are looking forward to newspaper work as a ife profession. But most of these make the mistake of imagining that the best opportunities are found in work on the big city dailies, and of making it their first ambition to become a reporter
of these great newspaper. atisfying, and the best-payin positions, however, are on the country newspapers. Go among the force of any great daily, and you will find more than half of them are ambitious to save up noney, so they can buy a country and rush of a daily paper not only vears a man out physically, but also tends to destroy his individality. The salary of a reporter runs from ten to thirty dollars a week-the average being about ional men get more than that in other professions.
On a country newspaper, estime to prepare his work, and he has some leisure for other things. There is a much better chance for him to grow and for his individu lity to have full sway. Where you hear of one reporter becoming prominent in the nation's affairs, you hear of ten country ediors.
