It will be noticed that during the thre years which be served as County Judge from 1890 to 1892 inclusiv -the total tax rate for all county purposes was 40 cents on the $\$ 100$ The minates of the Court during his period of service do not show the lisuance of any County Bond for any parpose.
The public will also note that for the year 1890 the State Ta Rate for all purposes was 32, cents on the $\$ 100.00$; slso please note that the assessed wealth o the County for 1890 was 82,598 775.00. The total taxes paid by the people of the County (not by the Commissioners' Court) to the State that year were $\$ 8,446.00$ total paid by the people to the County for all Countr purposes that year were $\$ 10,395.10$. These were amounts as shown by the aseeseor's rolls for that year But it is understood of course that there were delinquents every vear whose taxes amounted approximately to 8 to 10 per cent of the whole.
