 Naturally every individual feels a strong desire to know from what cause death is most apt to come of careful study, now offers a sort of guide based on the various ages of different persons. Prof. Von den Velden, of Munich, bas made den Velden, of Munich, has madeup a careful table, and elaıms to know what disease is most apt to kill a man or woman at a certain age.
For instance, that dread scourge tuberculosis, spares the infant except ind second half of th third year, when there is a star ling death rate among children from this disease. It is between
20 and 30 years the 20 and 30 years that tuberculosis reaps the balk of its grim and awful harvest. After 30 years the prob-
ablity of death from this disease ablity of death from this disease decreases rapidy and in propor-
tion unt) the 50 -year mark is past.
But just before the immunty from tuberculosis is aboot to end
say at 45 years, the terrible say at 45 years, the terrible
scourge cancer begins to cut the tbreads of human life. Beginning shortly before 50 years, cancer springs into the first place as the death cause. Before 45 cancer is
almost unknown as a general cause of mortality.

paraffine drinking cup. The cam. paign has made some progress in Texas, but not very much. It is a matter which deserves more at tention than it receives. Every person should be provided with a pucket drinking cup, and the littie bubbling fountains are easily provided on the school grounds so that no cups are needed.-San Antonio Express.

meat, are a very bad thing for the eater of it.
New light bas recently been. thrown on the value of boric acid as a meat preservative by an English investygator, who finds that while in the proportion usually used it retards all germ growth to some extent, the effect is principally manifest upon the harmless germs and upon those germs that cause disagreeable odors, while the most dangerous germs, such as. the typhoid bacillus and the bacilus which produces inflammation of the intestines, are scarely infuenced. Meat not treated with borle acid will in a comparatively short time give off odors warning against its use. The boric-treated meat may give off no such oders, even when containing exceedingly dangerous germs. In other words, meat poisoning is much more likely to happen with boric acid meat than with meat not so treat-ed.-Exchange.
