Senate Joint Resolution to amend Section 51, of Article 3, of the Constitution of the State of Texas, so as to authorize the grant of aid to in digent and disabled Confederat soldiers and sailors and their wid ows, and to soldiers who served in the militia and in organizations for the protection of the frontier and their indigent widows, and to gran aid for the establishment and maintenance of a home for the indigen and dependent wives and widows of Confederate soldiers and sailors, and Consh women as aided the Confed uracy and authorize a special cacy pension tax and makin appropriations for same.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas:
Section 1. That section 51, Arti cle 3, of the Constitution of the State of Texas be so amended a to hereafter read as follows:
Article 3. Section 51. The Legis lature shall have no power to make any grant or authorize the making of any grant of public money $t$ any individual, association of ind viduals, municipal or other corpo ration whatsoever, provided, how ever, the Legisiature may grant aid to indigent and disabled Confeder ate soldiers and sailors who came to Texas prior to January 1, 1900 and their widows in indigent cirmastances, and who have been Cona inie residents of the State of the whee January 1, 1900, and and sailors anterior to January 1900; to indigent and disabled sol diers, who under special laws of the State of Texas, during the war be ween the States served for a perio of at least six months in organzations for the protection of the rontier against Indian raids or Mexican marauders, and to indigen and disabled soldiers of the militia of the State of Texas, who were in active service for a period of a east six months during the wis between the States, to the widow of such soldiers who are in indigen circumstances, and who were mar ried to such soldiers prior to Janu ary 1,1900 , provided that the wor "widow" in the preceding lines of this section shall not apply to women born since 1861, and also to grant aid for the establishment and maintenance of a home for said soldiers and sailors, their wives and widows, and women who aided in the Confederacy under such regulations and limitations as may be provided or by law; provided, the Legislature may provide for husband and wife remain together in the home
The Legislature shall have the power to levy and collect, in addition to all other taxes heretofore permitted by the Constitution of Texas, a State ad valorem tax on property ngt exceeding five cents on the one hundred dollars valua tion for the purpose of creating a special fund for the payment of pensions for services in the Confederate Army and Navy, frontier organizations and the militia of the State of Texas, and for the widows of such soldiers serving in said armies, navies, organizations, or militia.
Sec. 2. The Governor of the State is hereby directed to issue the necessary proclamation for the submission of this amendment to the qualified voters of the State of Toxas at the general election of State officers, in November, 1913. At which election all voters favoring this amendment shall have written or printed on their ballots the words

Board of Regents of the State University, and the boards of trustees or managers of educational, eleemosynary and penal institutions of the State and such other boards as have been, or may hereafter be established by law, may be elected or appointed for term of six (6) years, one-third of the members of said boards to be elected or appointed every two (2) years in the manner provided by law, fixing the time for holding the election, and making the appropriation therefor Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:
Section 1. That Article 16 of the Constitution be amended by adding a new section thereto, to be known and designated as " 30 a ," and to read as follows:
Section 30a. The Legislature may provide by the law that the members of the Board of Regents of the State University and Boards of Trustees or Managers of the educa tional, eleemosynary, and penal institutions of the State, and such boards as have been, or may here after be established by law, may old their respective offices for th term of six (6) years, one-third o the members of such boards to be elected or appointed every two(2) years in such manner as the Legis lature may determine; vacancies in such offices to be filled as may be provided by law," and the Legisla ure shall enact suitable laws to ive effect to this section.
Sec. 2. The foregoing Constitu tional amendment shall be sub mitted to a vote of the qualified electors for the members of the Legislature, at the next general election to be held in this State, at which election all voters favoring said proposed amendment shal have printed or written on their ballots: "For the amendment o Article 16 of the Constitution of the State of Texas, regulating the term of office of the Board of Regents of he State University, and othe Boards of Trustees, or Managers heretofore or hereafter established by law." And all voters opposed to said amendment shall have printed or written on their ballots the words: "Against the amendment of the State of Texas, regulating the erm of office of the Board of Re gents of the State University, and other Boards of Trustees, or Manaers, heretofore or hereafter established by law."
Sec. 3. The Governor of this State is hereby directed to issue the necessary proclamation for said necessary proclamation for said lection, and have the law of this State Sec 4. The sum of five thousand $(\$ 5,000.00)$, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the State Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to defray the expenses of said proclamation, publication, and election.
