Farmers' meetings have been held at Woodman Hall, Arbor Douglass School House, Unio Grove, Latexo, Daniel School, Porter Springs, Wesley Chapel, Shad Grove and Lone Pine School. Shilo School is billed for the 18th and second visit to Douglass School the 20th.
These meetings have been atended by practically all of the farmers in the neighborhood and over one hundred of them have joined the club. After the first alarm is sounded. within a period of seven or eight minutes, if the fire is not under control, the second alarm will be sounded; but, however, if within this period of time the fire is reached by the firemen and is under con-

Flour the board and rolling pin to keep from sticking. roll out $1 / 2$ to $3 / 4$ inches in thickness, cut with small biscuit cutter, put in. dry pan and bake in hot oven.
