## COURSE OF CREEK IS BEING CHANGED

Nature Aids Contractors And Taxpayers in Projec

Trinity River by the Houston County Levee District No. No. 1, about twenty miles from Crock-
ett. This levee, now in the process of construction, is to

overflow. This will also allow ample time to plant crops in th
protected area next spring One interesting feature of the

One of the commonest causes One of the commonest causes annoying as this is, it is ma ter for which the householde should be grateful, in spite of revents a serious, The fuse is ant.
The fuse is an electric safety alue, inserted into the wiring of the user of the current. It is made of a soft fusible metal intended to burn or blow out under any unusually strong load of electricity. In the ordinary
house circuit there are several uses-a master fuse, placed and the meter, and smaller ones overning three or four outlets in the house circuit itself. All are safety valves. If lightning trikes outside the house, the troke and the lightning is not conducted
