La Grange，Texas，Feb．4．－W． H．Langhorn Jr．，25，son of Dr W．H．Langhorn of Chappell Hill is being held here on charges of murder，assault to murder and criminal assault in connection with the killing of Valera Zapa－ ac，17，and injuries to Minnie Tuesday night Feeling is run ing high among citizens of La Grange．
The girls，high school students and daughters of Henry Zapalac， prominent resident，went riding with Langhorn，whom they had known for some time．Langhorn is alleged to have attacked the younger girl，and Valera went to her rescue．She was shot three imes and Minnie＇s throat was slashed，but she escaped when Langhorn turned his attention to

iff Loessin and Dan Reiss were challenged by Langhorn from his automobile．In attempting to escape，Langhorn ran his ma－ chine into a gate，deserted it and took refuge behind a barn where he later surrendered．He

At the time of his appointment to this office he was city health officer of Galveston and at one time was mayor of that city. It is in a large measure due to Dr . Sappington's efforts that Galveston has been kept free from a courge of plague during the ast few years, as he has at al fare on rats as a precautionary measure against an epidemic of this dread disease.
Dr. Sappington is a native of Illinois, coming to Texas in 1885. For several years after 1886 he by the H \& $T$ c C railrond Ineer he was elected county surveyor of the newly established county of Foard and propared in Austin the transcript of the field notes of the survey. He then served for some time as a draftsman in the office of the state commissioner at Austin.
