Section 4 of what is known 'Intoxicating Laquor Laws' chibiting the intrastate shipat of same into prohibitio erritory' says: 'Nothing in this shall be construed as relatto interstate shipment and asportation of intoxicating quors, or to the delivery of same o any person, firm or corporawithin this state on this nterstate shipment or trans-

"Now as I interpret this law it only means that interstat shipments can be made to point in dry territories, but after the interstate shipment enters the dry territory and is received by consignee, then thereafter the same rule would apply as to intrastate shipments. That is to say that you could not again ship or dispose of said shipment in that dry territory any more than you could if you had shipped it from some intrastate point.

Section 6 says: "Nothing in this act shall make it unlawful for any person for the use of himself or the members of his family residing with him to per sonally earry intoxicating liquors from any point within the State to any other point within this State." I think that section means just what it says, that people living in a dry section have liquor shipped to them or sent to them through any one else, but can only take it into dry territories themselves for the use of themselves and the members of their family residing with them. They cannot give it to friends in thier homes or any where else.






