than you could if you had shipped it from some intrastate point.
Section 6 says: "Nothing in Section 6 says: : "Nothing in
this act shall make it unlawful for any person for the use of himself or the members of his family residing with hin to per sonally carry intoxicating liquors to any other point- within this State." I think that seetion
means just what it says, that people living in a dry seetion
cannot have liquor shipped to them or sent to them through it into dry territories themselves for the use of themselves and
the members of their family re siding with tham. They eannot
give it to friends in thier homes give it to friends in
