





#### "UNCLE JOE" ANGRY OVER REPORT HE'LL LEAVE CONGRESS

Washington, Sept. 10 .- "Uncle Joe" Cannon, dean of Congress, chewed his cigar viciously and, full of indignation, stamped into his office at the capitol today.

Newspaper reports quoting Representative Rodenberg of Illinois as announcing that "Uncle Joe" will retire from Congress at the end of his present term were the sause of the aged legislator's indignation.

It was declared that "Uncle Joe" is not yet ready to retire and no announcement to this effect is authorized. The veteran legislator later will issue a statement, it is said.

"Uncle Joe" has been in Congress, with the exception of two terms, since his first election in 1872. He was defeated on the issue of the McKinley tariff in 1890 and was swamped in the Republican catastrophe of 1912.

"Involuntary vacations" is the way the former Speaker usually refers to his two defeats. He has frequently said to his friends that he hoped "to have a funeral at the Government's expense," meaning that he wished to die in the harness and on the job, as did his old partisan foe, and personal friend, Champ



### TOO LONG IN WATER CAUSE OF EAR AND

Physicians report an epidemic of throat and ear trouble in Dallas at this time and one declared that thirty per cent of the cases are caused by swimming.

This specialist, who is himself fond of water sports, declares that the blame cannot be placed entirely upon the pools or streams that are being visited by such large numbers of people this summer, but that many of cases of illness are caused by improper swimming and diving.

Breathing correctly while in the water, and especially just before and after diving, is vitally important to the health, it is declared. The palate should be raised and closed as tightly as possible before going under water and care should be exercised in expelling water from the nostrils or throat in case of strangulation, no matter how slight. Most of the head troubles are caused by those who strangle expelling the water too violently, thus straining the delicate nasal passages and causing to circulate therein any accumulated formation and often resulting, in congestions.

And another cause of a lot of the trouble is the fact that many bathers stay in the pools and streams too long. Just a few minutes of diving, swimming and splashing around for exercise should be enough for any one, the doctors say. Over-erxtion weakens the constitution, they say, and makes one more susceptible to

the troubles now being experienced. It is the general consensus of opinion that the swimming pools and stream resorts are all right as a rule, but that the main danger of infection is caused by the fact that so many people get into the water at one time and stay too long.

It has been pointed out that if the sizes of the crowds change every few minutes with the running of the water through the pools, there would probably be less occasion to visit a specialist a day or two after taking a plunge.-Dallas News.

#### LETTER TO WHEAT **GROWERS ON VALUE** OF NEW VARIETIES

Graham, September 12, 1921. To the Wheat Growers of Young County:

Practically all the wheat grown in this section of the country is very badly mixed. Not only different varieties, but smut, oats, and other foreign materials which make it less merchantable are found.
